How Do Catholics Understand the Word "Ministry?" PART II:

I have been asked by several parishioners about the academic

paper I presented in June at the first session of a five-year series of ecumenical meetings between the Catholic Church and the Disciples of Christ Church. As you may remember, I was appointed by the Vatican's Dicastery for Promoting Christian Unity as one of seven Catholics in the world to serve on a team to dialoque with the Disciples of Christ Church for ecumenical dialogue between our two Churches. Our topic focuses on the role of the Holy Spirit in ministry. My task was to lay out the parameters of a Catholic understanding of the word "ministry" as well as a Catholic understanding of the ways the Holy Spirit is involved in ministry and those who serve as ministers in the Church. Last week I summarized the first section of my paper which laid out the conditions associated with the word "ministry." Today I will continue with an overview of the various types of ministry recognized as such in the Church and what is not considered "ministry" in the strict sense of this word in the Catholic Church.

There is a wide range of thought on the meaning of the word "ministry" in the Catholic Church. Nevertheless, ministry is generally agreed to involve specified services within (ad intra) the parish or other Catholic institution (e.g., monastery, chancery, hospital, school) and involve conferral and authorization through 1) ordination in the case of a bishop, priest, or deacon, 2) religious profession in the case of those entering the consecrated life, or 3) installation/ commissioning/ blessing rites in the case of the baptized. For laity who receive their office officially through authorization and commissioning/installation/blessing, their ministry may be permanent or for a designated period of time.

For most laity, service of the Lord and the Gospel is an expression of their apostolic (sent forth) life. It is not referred to as ministry, per se, but as discipleship, missionary discipleship, or the apos-

tolate. This service, which flows from baptism and confirmation, is focused on service outside or beyond (ad extra) the parish or other Catholic institution. It does not require approbation by officials of the Church (e.g., parents teaching religion to their children, public advocacy for the poor/marginalized, evangelization).

The types of ministry *ad intra* might be described as:

Ordained Ministers: Bishops, priests, and deacons are considered the ordinary ministers of the Church by virtue of ordination. More about them in an upcoming article.

Instituted, Lay Ecclesial, and Commissioned Ministers: Laity and some professed religious may discern a call to formal ministry in service to the Church which the Church recognizes and authorizes. There are three basic types. 1) Some are instituted into a permanent, lifelong ministry after extensive training and experience certified at the diocesan level and review for suitability (i.e., lector, acolyte, catechist). 2) Others are installed into ministry for a defined period of time after specialized training certified at the diocesan level and review for suitability (e.g., parish life coordinators, pastoral associates, youth ministry leader). 3) Others are commissioned into a specific ministry for a defined period of time after some parish-level training and review for suitability (e.g., extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion). These will be broken down into more detail in a coming article.

De Facto Ministers: These are laity who serve in parishes or other Catholic institutions who normally have not been formally installed/commissioned but nevertheless provide a wide range of services within the Church (e.g., chancellor of a diocese, members of a diocesan or parish pastoral or finance council, wedding or baptism preparation ministry, music ministry). Their service is not permanent. This category, described by Pope Francis in his letter on the inclusion of women into the instituted ministries of lector and acolyte, is described as









Interested in sharing your faith with young children in a fun-filled and loving environment?

Letters from Prison, Part Two provides an in-depth investigation of Paul's letters to the Colossians and Ephesians, two letters with a great deal in common. Besides being written from prison, both letters address Gentile communities learning to live faithful Christian lives. Exploring themes such as God's eternal plan, the unity of the church, and the fullness of life in Christ, these letters offer a sweeping and still relevant vision of faith in Christ and the church as his body. Commentary, study and reflection questions, prayers, and access to online lectures are included.



Youth Basketball Season Registration Opens Tuesday, August 9



Big Ideas and Connecting Math in Meaningful Ways







A few weeks ago, I shared three areas of focus as we begin a new school year. In addition to building a community and helping students to foster connections we need to acknowledge students' feelings toward math. For many people, math anxiety is a real thing and we never want to dismiss those feelings. It has been shown that implementing intentional growth mindset strategies in the math classroom will drastically change the student's attitude toward math and build both their confidence and willingness to learn.

According to Shelley Gray in 5 tips for incorporating a growth mindset into math teaching, "Our students know when we believe in their potential to be successful. It is important to tell our students

frequently and explicitly that we think they are good mathematicians. Focus on praising the effort and the process rather than the final result and your students will begin to believe in themselves as much as we do?"

In the upcoming school year, all of our math teachers will attend a one-day webinar in which they will learn more from Jo Bolar about how to teach math using Big Ideas and connecting math in meaningful ways. Jo Bolar is the co-founder and faculty director of youcubed. She is well known and respected for her work with teachers in helping create a mathematical classroom where the role of group work and mathematical discussions is key in the development of understanding.

As we begin a new school year, teachers will emphasize that mathematics class-rooms should be places where students believe that everyone can do well in math and mathematics problems can be solved with many different insights and methods. We want students to see mistakes as valuable and that they encourage brain growth and learning.

As a school, we must work on the spiritual growth mindset alongside the academic growth mindset. According to Philippians 1:6, "I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work among you will bring it to completion by the day of Jesus Christ." A Spiritual Growth Mindset says I can because God can. This mindset is about hope, faith, dreams and Truth. "I can do all things through Jesus Christ who strengthens me."

New Life for Old Stumps



Summertime at preschool is not only a chance for us to interact with our preschoolers in a special way through summer camps, but it also is, as you might imagine, a time for us to clean, organize, re-do, and refresh things in preparation for the new school year.

Other areas of campus have summer projects underway as well. One of the more noticeable ones involves the Columbarium expansion. St. Francis TV hosted an episode recently with the Director of Finance & Planning, Mr. Rob Neppel, in which he explained the necessity for more burial niches. Part of this project also addresses drainage issues. The area between Clare and Anthony Halls is also having some drainage work done. Along with that, some safety concerns are being handled with the cutting down of a few old trees that were in danger of falling onto Clare Hall. Because of the safety issue, these trees, understandably, needed to be removed.

Personally, my heart is always a bit sad when I see a tree being taken down even when, in my head, I know that the reason for it is a valid one. After all, our Franciscan spirit and love for all things which our Lord has made, call us to take care of the earth. Although safety of those in our buildings and on our campus must come first. I'd rather see trees being planted rather than being removed. One thing that helps ease my heart, however, is knowing that the trees will likely be re-purposed in some way. I think that often, trees get chipped and turned into mulch for nature trails in parks. At preschool, we just had new mulch pieces put down on our natural play area, Exploration Station, so I can really appreciate this use! I am excited to say that one of the trees that is being cut down from the area outside of Clare and Anthony Halls, will be re-used on our Exploration Station! I have written previously that many of the things in this area are made of wood pieces and are, therefore, subject to regular decay. This was the case

for some stumps out there on which the kids can walk on by stepping from one to the other. A few of the stumps were beginning to wear away so that they were no longer safe for the preschoolers to climb. After discussions with the foreman in charge of the tree removal on our campus, we will now have some brand new stumps for our students to enjoy! I have no doubt that they will have a grand time learning to walk on the stumps and then celebrating their victory in accomplishing a new feat!

Not only will the stumps provide entertainment for our preschoolers, but lessons on re-purposing/recycling will most certainly be shared by the teachers with their individual classes! What an unexpected yet wonderful opportunity for us to begin the year with a message on recycling! The campus tree project presents our teachers with an easy, relatable chance to teach their students, right from the start of the school year, how to be young recyclers which is certainly an important part of being good caretakers of what God has given us!

Opportunity for Public Vigil for the Abolition of the Death Penalty

In commemoration of the 16th anniversary of North Carolina's last execution, there will be a public vigil in front of Central Prison in Raleigh on August 15 @ 5:30 pm - 6:30 pm. This effort is being organized by the Center for Death Penalty Litigation in Durham. The vigil will be held outside Central Prison to remember the 43 people who were executed between 1970 and 2006, when litigation halted executions in NC, and the 136 people who still sit on death row. This event will raise the voices of people most proximate to the death penalty, including people currently and formerly on death row, and those who have lost family members to murder. Together we will say, "Never again," and create a new vision of justice.

Walking More Closely with Refugees

Trevor Thompson, Director of Office of Justice and Peace

Over the last year, many have expressed an interest in our work with resettling refugees, and so I wanted to give an update about the refugee resettlement ministry and offer an invitation for a deeper relationship.

In the last year, we have worked closely with local refugee resettlement organizations in Raleigh called US Committee for Refugees and Immigrants (USCRI). Through this partnership, we have funneled generous financial and material donations in order to address recent crises of displaced persons from Afghanistan and Ukraine. We have also worked closely with USCRI to furnish an apartment and offer warm meals for a family from Afghanistan as part of the

Welcome Home Project. In recent weeks, we collected material items for additional refugee as part of this Welcome Home Project.

Now, there's a new opportunity available for walking more closely with refugee families. USCRI is inviting us to a deeper relationship-building opportunity with a refugee family with increased responsibilities to assist with the family's settling in the community. We think that this is very exciting! Perhaps, this is something you would be interested in.

With this new opportunity, we are looking for a group of 8-10 parishioners to form a team that would accompany a family for 3-5 months. Responsibilities would include things like: meeting family at

airport, bring them to their apartment, helping with transportation, securing food assistance, assisting families with paperwork, working on financial literacy, and being on call for other support and assistance. There will be training involved and ample support from USCRI social workers and St. Francis staff.

Would be willing to serve on this team of parishioners that will provide hands-on support of a refugee family over the course of a few months? You would need to have the available time, be willing to offer your compassion and skills, and be open to the challenges and joys of the experience of these families. 
