SUPPORTING OUR MUSIC MINISTRY:

Among the top three things consistently listed in surveys about why someone returns to worship in a particular church again are: 1) good preaching, 2) good music, and 3) hospitality. A professional colleague of mine once said to a national audience of church musicians, "While preaching is really important, most people don't go home humming the homily. So be good church musicians." We are blessed to have great music ministry at St. Francis and I know more than a few of us go home humming the music we sang or heard at Mass, myself included.

What helps us offer great music is a great piano. Our current one is over 26 years old and is slowly dying. We have a piano tuner in about twice a month to keep an instrument in tune that shouldn't require that frequency of maintenance. Because of the centrality of the piano to our music ministry, I concur with Jim Wahl's analysis that we need a new piano.

We have identified a quality piano that will fit a church our size and meet our needs for many years. We will initiate a fundraising drive to raise \$70,000 for this instrument beginning this weekend. If you would like to contribute to this fund by check, please make it payable to St. Francis of Assisi and write "Church Piano" in the memo line. Strengthening our Catholic Identity, the last of the three areas of our main focus moving into the new school year. I recently read an article titled "Ten ways for Catholic school teachers to reinforce Catholic identity outside of religion class." Something that resonated with me in the article was the following statement. "If we want our children to fall in love with the Catholic faith and remain committed to it throughout their lives, we must foster in them a sense of Catholic identity so that the thought of losing their faith would mean losing a major part of themselves."

Catholic Identity is recognized in the visible signs such as crucifixes, statues of Mary and symbols of our liturgical seasons such as Advent, Christmas and Lent, but I want us all to look deeper into the school's atmosphere to find our Catholic Identity. One of the events that we all take part in is morning prayer. We begin each day in our courtyard with students, faculty and parents in attendance. In addition, we attend community Mass on Wednesday. Coming together 10

as a community to share in our faith is a large part of our culture as a K-8 school. We have intentionally placed time in our day to read the scripture and reflect. In addition, all students have religious instruction throughout the week. We promote the focus of The Franciscan School on our devotion to the Catholic Faith and the strong values and morals it espouses, academic excellence through a challenging and engaging educational experience, and a dedication to service to others in our community.

Our students learn to know and love Jesus, and to demonstrate that love in prayer and worship.

Managing Expectations for our Children in the Coming School Year

How can parents and families help students thrive in the approaching school year? There's no one magic answer, but a good place to start is by managing their own expectations.

Recent news reports have zeroed in on "time lost" in learning due to pandemic-related shutdowns, virtual learning, and adjustments in the return to in-person instruction. But the concept of "time lost" is arbitrary. Even before the pandemic, students learned at a varied pace and teachers tailored instruction from classroom lesson plans to individual strengths and needs.

As a public high school counselor, I work with students, teachers, administrators and families to support academic, social-emotional and career development. When it comes to social-emotional development, essential learning from the COVID-19 pandemic includes coping with loss, building resiliency and approaching the future in a way that acknowledges the past. It seems to me that, as a society, we may be pushing these important tasks aside in a rush to return to memorizing multiplication tables, conjugating verb tenses and preparing for the ACT and SAT.

How, then, do we manage our expectations? Here are a few suggestions:

Talk about what matters to your student. What do they love? What makes them laugh? What makes them nervous? What's their favorite way to spend free time, and why? Engage them in conversation that helps them explore their own interests. When and if you sense an opening, feel free to share your own likes and dislikes when you were their age. Encourage exploration and growing. Young people flourish when given opportunities to pursue a variety of interests. There's no need to zero in on one or a few too soon.

Banish the "happiness equation" mindset. Straight A's = My dream school = My dream job = Lots of money = Happiness. Not only is the conclusion of that mindset unrealistic and flawed, but the relentless pursuit of it leads to young people who burn themselves out before they set foot on a college campus – often anxious, depressed or both – and wondering what they did wrong.

With intentional reframing of our own expectations, we can help our young people enter the school year with confidence, excitement and enthusiasm. Those attitudes will go a long way toward helping them succeed outside the classroom as well as inside of it.

Society of St. Vincent de Paul

In today's Gospel Jesus said to his disciples: "I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing! There is a baptism with which I must be baptized, and how great is my anguish until it be accomplished!" The St. Vincent DePaul Society attempts to set the earth on fire with God's love by helping those suffering from a lack of funds for daily living expenses.

SVdP at St. Francis of Assisi provides hope, compassion, referrals, and short-term financial help for families. Most of the cases are the working poor—families who can pay their bills until they get an unexpected situation—a funeral, a car needing service, a sickness, or an unexpected increase in living expenses. Any of those situations could make them need help with rent or utilities.

Some financial problems come unexpectedly and seem unsurmountable, but SVdP volunteers continue to stand by their neighbors. For instance, one older woman called to say that her husband was in and out of the hospital for several years with COPD. Because he was unable to work much of the time in the business he owned, he was unable to make mortgage payments on their house. While the woman realized that SVdP couldn't help with the past due house payments, she did request help with their water bill while the family comes up with a plan on how to deal with their financial crisis. SVdP was also able to suggest referrals for counseling on how to best deal with their housing challenge.

The St Vincent de Paul Society is a lay Catholic organization that aspires to live the gospel message by serving Christ in the poor with love, respect, justice, hope and joy, and by working to shape a more just and compassionate society.

How does SVdP operate? Neighbors seeking help are encouraged to call in on the help line at 919-534-4842. A caller intake specialist retrieves the information from the helpline and fills out the initial report.

Next, visitors, who have mostly been working by phone during Covid, communicate with the neighbor and find out more information. The visitor will discuss options with the neighbor. SVdP has a reliable list of resources for helping neighbors in need. The visitor will take requests for any funds to the SVdP committee for consideration.
