Listen to the Voice of Creation

The Burning Bush

Flood waters swallow, intense droughts continue, and wildfires consume, and yet we find ourselves unable or unwilling to aggressively address the issues that affect our common home. Every year, churches across the world come together for the "Season of Creation," from September 1st through October 4th, to raise our awareness, prayer, and action to address these issues and more related to a changing climate and our neglect of God's creation.

Pope Francis wrote in his <u>2015 teaching</u> <u>document called Laudato Si'</u> that our earth is like our sister, "This sister now cries out to us because of the harm we have inflicted on her by our irresponsible use and abuse . . . the earth herself is among the most abandoned and maltreated of our poor; . . . We have forgotten that we ourselves are dust of the earth (cf. Gen 2:7); our very bodies are made up of her elements, we breathe her air, and we receive life and refreshment from her waters."

This year's Season of Creation theme is "Listen to the Voice of Creation." There is a long-standing view within the Judeo-Christian tradition that God speaks to us through creation, that creatures speak to us of the Creator's goodness, truth, and beauty. With this theme, we are invited to ask ourselves: To what are we listening? Where does God speak to us in creation? Can we stop and listen deeply to the cry of the poor and the cry of the earth? What is distracting us?

New Transportation Ministry with Interfaith Prison Ministry for Women (IPMW)

As you may know women are the fastest-growing segment of the prison population in our country. In particular, sisters of color are unfairly, over-represented in this population due in large measure to negative racial bias toward poor communities of color.

Upon release and having paid their debt to society, these sisters in Christ are very motivated to become successful, productive citizens. But far too often they face significant barriers to obtaining and keeping employment, housing and social services. As a result, almost 30% of them return to prison within three years; even more return over time. IPMW works to eliminate these barriers and end the cycles of poverty, addiction, and violence by resourcing formerly incarcerated women emotionally, spiritually, and physically. Transportation to and from work, to and from medical appointments and to and from social services is perhaps the most fundamental barrier these women face. Without transportation, little progress can be made.

As a result, she could not work and got behind on her electric bill. Another client with long Covid got behind in rent and was helped by SVdP from St. Francis and Our Lady of Lourdes as well as the Friendship Fund at First Presbyterian Church. She has since returned to work.

SVdP at St. Francis of Assisi provides hope, compassion, referrals, and shortterm financial help for families in the area. Most of the cases are the working poor—families who can pay their bills until they get an unexpected situation—a funeral, a car needing service, a sickness. Any of those situations could make them need help with rent or utilities.




