## How Do Catholics Understand the Word "Ministry?" PART IV-

I have been asked by several parishioners about the academic paper I presented last June at an international ecumenical meeting for which I serve as a delegate between the Catholic Church and


the Disciples of Christ Church. Our topic for this phase of dialogue focuses on the role of the Holy Spirit in ministry. My task in this paper was to lay out the parameters of a Catholic understanding of the word "ministry" as well as a Catholic understanding of the ways the Holy Spirit is involved in ministry and those who serve as ministers in the Church. Part IV in this series will note the complementarity between the ministry of the ordained and non-ordained. ### **Interrelation between the Ministry of the Ordained and the Baptized:** In

the August 21 bulletin, I wrote that while the ministry of the bishop, priest, and deacon are not exclusive ways of carrying out Christ's ministry, they do serve as the ordinary way to provide at least a minimal guarantee that the essential pastoral functions they undertake in the Church will be stably and permanently provided. I then described how all ministries, whether ordained and lay, are to function: as reflections of Christ.

Now we proceed to the next insight about ministry: the complementarity between the ministry of the ordained and non-ordained. One of the most important theologians of the 20th century, Yves Congar, wrote that "Jesus instituted a structured community, a community [that is] holy, priestly, prophetic, missionary, [and] apostolic, with [quides known as] ministers, some freely raised up by the Spirit, [and] others ordained by the imposition of hands." He is saying that while some ministers are placed in roles of leadership by virtue of ordination, others, the overwhelming majority of ministers in the Church, are placed there in virtue of spiritual gifts given to them in baptism and that each are complementary to the other and essential. The bishops at Vatican II expressed the same truth this way in the Dogmatic Constitution on the Church: the two priesthoods, baptismal and ministerial, are "interrelated: each of them in its own special way a participation in the one priesthood of Christ" (n. 10). All ministers in and of the Church, ordained or not, begin their life as the baptized. It is in baptism that the baptized become configured with Christ in the exercise of their priestly, prophetic, and royal offices. This insight has led to the flourishing of lay ministry in the church, either permanently or for a defined period of time. Next week we'll look at these various types of lay ministry.

We have already completed our first two weeks of preschool and what fun we've had! Our children are settling into new routines, new friendships, and new experiences. As we begin September, I look forward to seeing our theme for this school year, "Keep Going, Keep Growing" exemplified throughout our hallways. I am confident that each day this year, I will have the privilege to witness countless examples of this, especially as they "keep going" and "keep growing" in their faith journey.

I already saw some last week, when I dropped in at morning prayer with the children who are in our before-care program (Stepping Stones). During the last 30 minutes before the school day begins, the students who attend Stepping Stones typically gather in the lobby area outside of Fellowship Hall. There they might learn about a saint, listen to a story

# **Interfaith Prison Ministry for Women (IPMW)**

As you may know women are the fastest-growing segment of the prison population in our country. In particular, sisters of color are unfairly over-represented in this population due in large measure to negative racial bias toward poor communities of color.

Upon release and having paid their debt to society, these sisters in Christ are very motivated to become successful, productive citizens. But far too often they face significant barriers to obtaining and keeping employment, housing and social services. As a result, almost 30% of them return to prison within three years; even more return over time.

IPMW works to eliminate these barriers and end the cycles of poverty, addiction. and violence by resourcing formerly incarcerated women emotionally, spiritually, and physically. Transportation to and from work, to and from medical appointments and to and from social services is perhaps the most fundamental barrier these women face. Without transportation, little progress can be made.


