

## How Do Catholics Understand the Word "Ministry?" PART $\mathbf{v}$

I have been asked by several parishioners about the academic paper I presented last June at an international ecumenical meeting for which I serve as a delegate between the Catholic Church and


the Disciples of Christ Church. Our topic for this phase of dialogue focuses on the role of the Holy Spirit in ministry. My task in this paper was to lay out the parameters of a Catholic understanding of the word "ministry" as well as a Catholic understanding of the ways the Holy Spirit is involved in ministry and those who serve as ministers in the Church. Today's focus, the final one in this series, will describe the various types of lay ministry. You may view the earlier parts of this series by going to the August 2, 9, 21, and September 4 bulletins. **Various Types of Lay Ministry:** The Church identifies four types of lay ministry: de facto, commissioned, lay ecclesial, and instituted. De facto ministers, the largest group of lay ministers, are individuals who serve within the community as volunteers in keeping with their sanctifying (priestly), teaching (prophetic), and/or governing (royal) offices received in baptism. In the sanctifying office, some examples would include lectors, cantors, and altar servers. In the teaching office, some examples would include leaders of Bible study, catechesis of a particular age of children, and advocacy on some dimension of the Church's social teaching. In the governing office, some examples would include advisors on a parish Finance Council or Pastoral Council. Second is commissioned ministry. Those serving at this level receive local training in the parish and are commissioned for a defined period of time either by a bishop or a pastor. Some examples would include pastoral ministers to the parish sick/shut-ins and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion.

The third level is lay ecclesial ministers. Some laity experience a call to focus their service full time in an ecclesial community. They often have specialized training and credentials such as a college degree in a relevant field of study. They fill significant roles of leadership in a community of faith (e.g., pastoral associate, director of music, youth ministry leader, school principal, chancellor of a diocese). The fourth level of lay ministry is called instituted ministry. This is a permanent ministry in the same way the deacon, priest, and bishop is a permanent ministry. There are currently three expressions of instituted ministry: lector, acolyte, and catechist. These individuals are more than readers of Scripture at Mass, altar servers, or First Communion catechists. These individuals have received specialized training, are recognized as leaders in their ministries, and have a proven track record of service in their area of ministry. For example, an instituted catechist is a master catechist who has skills in all the

areas of catechesis and is recognized by the community as not only competent in this field of ministry but also as competent to train others in all areas of catechesis and has a history of success and respect within a parish community in their ministry. A bishop installs those serving at this level into their ministry as a permanent configuration of their lives.





## **EDUCATION MINISTRIES**

As a child and now an educator, Mister Rogers has always been the barometer at which I measure kindness and compassion. Every day I come to work and I am surrounded by kind and compassionate faculty and students that demonstrate love in their thoughts and through their actions. It is our job to show our students to love as God did. We must love God with all that we are, all the way, all the time. In loving God, we come to understand what it means to love ourselves rightly, and what it means to love others.

We can all learn a great deal from Mister Rogers. He taught us that we are neighbors and that everyone has a place. Everyone matters. He had a vision, born of his relationship with God that highlighted every human life's innocence, beauty and uniqueness. To that end, he called us to be responsible for each other, saying nothing different than what Jesus said.

"We live in a world in which we need to share responsibility. It's easy to say, "it's not my child, not my community, not my world, not my problem." Then there are those who see the need and respond. I consider those people my heroes (Fred Rogers)."

We all have a need for love and acceptance. That is why Mister Rogers'

"You shall love the Lord your God, with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all your mind. This is greatest and first commandment. And the second is like it: You shall love thy neighbor as yourself" (Matthew 22:37-39).

television show was so popular. It spoke to something deeper, something sacred about humanity. God didn't give us his law in a book. He wrote it on our hearts. We know what we need to do. It's a matter of choice. Love is sacred. When we love another human being, especially without regard for ourselves, it is a holy moment. These moments are often missed due to our own selfishness. In loving God, we come to understand what it means to love ourselves rightly, and also what it means to love others. It means to love all even those outside of our classroom, neighborhood or Parish. It means demonstrating love even when there nothing provided in return. We can all show love for one another by being approachable, understanding, open to growth and change, mindful and self-giving.

# **New Transportation Ministry**

## **Interfaith Prison Ministry for Women (IPMW)**

As you may know women are the fastest-growing segment of the prison population in our country. In particular, sisters of color are unfairly over-represented in this population due in large measure to negative racial bias toward poor communities of color.

Upon release and having paid their debt to society, these sisters in Christ are very motivated to become successful, productive citizens. But far too often they face significant barriers to obtaining and keeping employment, housing and social services. As a result, almost 30% of them return to prison within three years; even more return over time.

IPMW works to eliminate these barriers and end the cycles of poverty, addiction, and violence by resourcing formerly incarcerated women emotionally, spiritu-

ally, and physically. Transportation to and from work, to and from medical appointments and to and from social services is perhaps the most fundamental barrier these women face. Without transportation, little progress can be made.

A neighbor and her infant son were living with her mother but decided to move to a new apartment because there were continuous water backup issues in the building. She was concerned it would be a health hazard once her son started crawling.

Not long after moving into her new place, the business for which she was working closed. Although she found a new job, the lapse in paychecks meant she couldn't meet the month's rent. St. Vincent de Paul was able to help her with some of it, and the neighbor was able to cover the rest. In the meantime, she will begin paid training for her new job.

SVdP at St. Francis of Assisi provides hope, compassion, referrals, and short-term financial help for families in the area. Most of the cases are the working poor—families who can pay their bills until they get an unexpected situation—a funeral, a car needing service, a sickness. Any of those situations could make them need help with rent or utilities.

SVdP is a volunteer lay Catholic organization that aspires to live the Gospel life. They are looking for people to help either by contacting those in need or behind the scenes.

If you are someone who doesn't feel comfortable working directly with people in need but really want to help, we could use someone to keep our resource sheets up to date. This is an important part of our mission that can be done from your own computer and impact the lives of others.




