



A PARISH PICNIC: Since the 90's, we have gathered for an afternoon of fun, food, and fellowship as part of celebrations in honor of our patron, St. Francis, whose feast day is October 4. After a three-year hiatus, we will re-start FrancisFest on

Sunday, October 2, 12:45-4:30pm, on our campus. Food trucks, games, activities, live music, and special performances (e.g., a magician, a Dragon Dance performed by parishioners of Our Lady of LaVang) will mark the afternoon. There will be wine/beer tasting room for those 21+. There are activities for everyone, from children to seniors. If you are new to the parish or looking for an opportunity to reconnect post-pandemic, this is a great way to meet people and simply come and have a fun time! 



The Joy of Turning 40

It's hard to believe that we are celebrating the 40th Anniversary of the founding of the Catholic Community of St. Francis of Assisi. My wife, Karin and I have been parishioners for 35 of those years. How we wound up at St. Francis is similar to how many of you found yourselves at this very special church, by some divine intervention. In my case, through guidance from my wife, we found ourselves at the threshold of St. Francis.

Walking through its doors, still a small church with folding chairs, we sat among fellow parishioners to worship. The welcoming spirit of the place was magnetic. The men in the funny brown robes with rope as belts, greeted us and led us in worship.

As we continued to worship at St. Francis and learned more about our patron saint, it was clear that his welcoming spirit was alive in this place. This spirit was visible in the laity and the many ministries at St. Francis, none more so than the ministries of Justice and Peace.

Yes, St. Francis embraced poverty, the leper, nature, and his love of God was so deep that he received the stigmata. However, there was one aspect of his life which was and still is a precious gift for this community of faith, his JOY.

This crazy little man was so full of joy that others, even those with great wealth, wanted what he had. They wanted to experience his joy. A joy resulting from a love so intense that many around him were compelled to join him.

Today, as we drive onto our campus and walk the many buildings, where is our joy? As father David McBriar would often ask: "What of you, what of me?" We worship in a church that seats almost 1300 people. The parish has grown significantly in forty years. Franciscan Friars have come and gone. Change is constant. We now have Diocesan priests serving our parish. The future will undoubtedly bring more changes over the next forty years but our roots as a Franciscan parish remain. It's in our communal DNA.

In living out our faith in community at St. Francis, are we preoccupied with the fact that we have lots of speed bumps, that we cut down trees (which needed to come down anyway as per the recommendation of the arborist), that we have a messy parking lot due to the Columbarium expansion, or other items of spiritual minutia? It's easy to get distracted in the midst of change, making it easy to miss the joy. Yet, there *is* joy in the smallest of moments and in the largest gatherings at St. Francis, though we have to take the time to engage with each other, recognize the moment, and experience those

moments. This Franciscan joy is accompanied by beauty as we engage with each other at the preschool, TFS, and in ministry. This joy abounds, especially in our liturgies, which can at times moves one to tears. as:

- a second grader reads the first reading at a Wednesday Mass
- fellow parishioners raise their voices with yours to praise the Lord
- the presider lifts up the body and blood of Christ in solemn gratitude
- we process in reverence to receive the gift of the Eucharist, which none of us deserve
- someone extends their hand in prayer of the Our Father
- the many needy faces, all of us, in this faith community look into each other's eyes
- we offer one another a sign of peace

What a gift this parish is to so many.

As we prepare for Francis Fest, a Convocation, and enjoy a visit from past friars, may you experience the joy of St. Francis and appreciate the beauty before you, as you live out your faith, and as we embark on the next forty years of worshiping together as the Catholic Community of St. Francis of Assisi.





Positively Impacting the World: Alumni Spotlight Linh Bach 12'





New Transportation Ministry

Interfaith Prison Ministry for Women (IPMW)

As you may know women are the fastest-growing segment of the prison population in our country. In particular, sisters of color are unfairly over-represented in this population due in large measure to negative racial bias toward poor communities of color.

Upon release and having paid their debt to society, these sisters in Christ are very motivated to become successful, productive citizens. But far too often they face significant barriers to obtaining and keeping employment, housing and social services. As a result, almost 30% of them return to prison within three years; even more return over time.

IPMW works to eliminate these barriers and end the cycles of poverty, addiction, and violence by resourcing formerly incarcerated women emotionally, spiritually, and physically. Transportation to and from work, to and from medical appointments and to and from social services is perhaps the most fundamental barrier these women face. Without transportation, little progress can be made.

In today's Gospel we see that prudent decisiveness means that we recognize that all our choices in daily living are really choices for eternal life. Admission into heaven is something money cannot buy. The only currency that has any value to secure our entrance is that of love.

The work of the St. Vincent de Paul Society at St. Francis of Assist is a sign of God's love to those who are suffering.

Volunteers at SVdP work tirelessly to provide hope, compassion, referrals and short-term financial help for families. Most of the cases are the working poor—families who are paying their bills until they get an unexpected situation—an illness, a car needing service, a funeral.

Our neighbors in any of those situations could require assistance with rent or utilities.

One neighbor is a single mom with two sons who was a contract mail carrier until she got hurt and was out of work and fell behind on rent. SVdP was able to help, and the woman faces a brighter future because she also found a fulltime job with benefits and the opportunity for advancement.

SVdP is a volunteer lay Catholic organization that aspires to live the Gospel life. They are looking for people to help either by contacting those in need or behind the scenes.

A variety of jobs are available from the visitor who makes the initial contact with the neighbor by phone to those who follow up on the request.

If you are someone who doesn't feel comfortable working directly with people in need but really want to help, SVdP could use someone to keep our resource sheets up to date. This is an important part of our mission that can be done from your own computer and impact the lives of others.



Corporal Works of Mercy "Bury the Dead" Outside Volunteer Opportunity

Funerals provide an opportunity to support those who are grieving the loss of a loved one. Perhaps one of our lesser-known ministries at St. Francis is serving as a columbarium attendant. The columbarium attendant offers quiet, behind the scenes assistance by preparing the columbarium niche to receive cremated remains after a funeral liturgy. This includes setting up, opening and cleaning the niche, respectfully standing watch during the time the niche is open, and replacing the niche cover after the service. Those who serve must be physically able to remove, lift, and replace the granite niche cover, which weighs approximately 60 pounds.


