WHERE DID OUR TREES BETWEEN CLARE AND ANTHONY HALL GO AND WHAT ARE WE GOING TO DO WITH THIS SPACE?

We have received several inquiries about the grounds between Clare

Hall and the Church that have recently been cleared away. Allow me to update you on what's happening.

As most of you know, we approved the expansion of our columbarium, an additional 616 niches, as we have run out of available niches in our current one. Planning for this project began three years ago with construction that started last July. The expansion is completely self-funded from the sales of niches and is anticipated to be completed by Thanksgiving. One of the preliminary tasks of this expansion was resolving a water retention problem in that area which required drains to draw rainwater underground and pull it away from the area. This was the construction you saw in July and early August on the parking lot pavement. While we were addressing the water retention issue there, it was incumbent upon us also to address the water retention issue between Clare Hall and the Church building that results in ponding as well when too much rain comes down from our rooves on that side of our church and preschool.

The contractor hired for that project also came in July and began installing drainage on the Church side to evacuate the water accumulating there when it rains. This necessitated the removal of the bushes and others plantings next to the church building and replacement with new growth. This part of the project is now complete as you can see. So far, so good.

When preparations were being finalized for drainage work on the other side of the sidewalk towards Clare Hall (Preschool), we had an arborist come to look at the three tall pine trees sitting there, one of which was leaning toward the preschool. It was his assessment that this tree would fall at some point and likely take the other two trees with it because of their closeness to each other and the interconnection of their root system. The fall would completely slash through the building. The danger and damage factors motivated us

to have the trees removed, and with preschool starting in August, we had to take them down quickly. At the same time, the blue spruce memorial tree, already slated for replacement by the family who initially planted it, was removed. While painful to remove the trees, it was clearly the right thing to do.

The drainage project on the Clare Hall side of the sidewalk then began after the root system of the former trees was removed. Initially, fixing the drainage problem was our only goal. Nothing else was anticipated but it became apparent that we needed to resolve the tree issue and so took the steps necessary in order to complete the drainage project. Now we had a cleared space and a decision to make about what to do with it.

I was asked for my thoughts on what to do with the space. It struck me that, in keeping with our Franciscan identity, a garden where people could gather before/during/after events in the church, Fellowship Hall, and Founder's Hall, come to pray, and where plaques with the names, images, and biographies of the Franciscans whose names adorn our buildings could be placed might be an appropriate use of the space.

To that end, we have been working with our landscaper to design how a garden might look, incorporating an "Assisi look" and using vegetation native to North Carolina. At the same time, members of the community have been invited to brainstorm how we might feature these Franciscans in a way that would be child-friendly, accessible to all, and help all of us come to know these important women and men. The garden design and the art process are currently underway. The design should be finalized soon and, when approved by the appropriate collegial bodies, will be executed to create the garden. The Franciscan art will take more time and will be in need of donors but as soon as those plans are finalized and funded, the art will be commissioned. created, and placed in this garden.






Corporal Works of Mercy "Bury the Dead" **Outside Volunteer Opportunity**

Funerals provide an opportunity to support those who are grieving the loss of a loved one. Perhaps one of our lesser-known ministries at St. Francis is serving as a columbarium attendant. The columbarium attendant offers guiet, behind the scenes assistance by preparing the columbarium niche to receive cremated remains after a funeral liturgy. This includes setting up, opening and cleaning the niche, respectfully standing watch during the time the niche is open, and replacing the niche cover after the service. Those who serve must be physically able to remove, lift, and replace the granite niche cover, which weighs approximately 60 pounds.

Services are typically Tuesday thru Saturday and take approximately 1 to 1 ½ hours of time. Columbarium attendants can serve as their schedule allows. For more information, please contact Trish Adamkowski 919-847-8205 x 236 or trish.adamkowski@stfrancisraleigh.org.

A New JustFaith Program: Faith and Immigration Justice

We at St. Francis are one of the first communities to offer this new "Faith and Immigration Justice" program. It's an opportunity for our parish to build on the three spectacularly successful racial justice programs in which more than a hundred parishioners participated over the past three years. It also seems a fitting way to reflect on the challenge of "Building the Future with Migrants and Refugees", the theme of National Migration Week (Sep 20-25, 2022) sponsored by the U.S. Catholic Bishops, and the World Day of Migrants and Refugees (Sep 25, 2022), sponsored by the Holy See.

Depending on interest, we expect to organize one or more groups that meet online Wednesday evenings at 7pm (beginning Oct 26), and one or more that meet online Thursday afternoons at 3pm (beginning Oct 27). Its immigration-specific goals include discerning "how our faith calls us to respond to the immigration debate," and examining the nuances of immigration policy and the citizenship process in this country.




The Cancer Support Group



Perhaps the most impressive experience in which students, families, and staff participate is the celebration of the Holy Mass as a school and church community. On the very first day of school, I was welcomed to the altar, along with Principal Smith, to be prayed over and blessed by Father Jim and Father Alex. Families, teachers, students, and staff had already welcomed me with open arms, but this particular extension of love meant so much to me. Undoubtedly, it was one of the most emotional and touching moments of my life. The vibrancy and celebration of God's love inside the Holy Mass at TFS is transforming, and I look forward to it every single week.

Another striking attribute is the commitment of teachers and the desire to make our school the best it can possibly be. There are many teachers who founded the school 23 years ago that are still here, and others that invest above and beyond what is ever expected. This morning, a student stopped me during morning carpool just to tell me that her fourth grade teacher, "Mrs. Giannini is awesome". Whether it's the incredible flexible seating options, the fun science projects, or the way each student is loved, it is evident that the result is pure joy! As I come to know each teacher's story, I am inspired.

As I reflect on my first few months here at TFS, I smile. I am grateful for this incredible opportunity to work for, with, and alongside you all. Even my husband notices my joy and how the TFS community charism has touched my heart. As each day ends with the folding of the flag and an empty parking lot, I am humbled and encouraged to do good work here. TFS now feels like home to me, and I look forward to what's next.

Way Up High in the Apple Tree!





Apples, Apples, Apples! We are touching, smelling, examining, and eating them! And if you shake them in a bucket, you can hear them rolling around too! At preschool, like with most everything we do, discovering all about apples is a full sensory experience!

As we enter fall, it is quite common to see apples in some form or fashion in many preschool classrooms. It could be from art created by stamping with half of an apple, a sensory bin with seeds, measuring apple peel lengths, or, my favorite, cooking a batch of cinnamon sauce (I have been the taste-tester for a few batches this week!). There have also been many apple tastings taking place in classrooms. In one of our 4-year old classes, I was even able to take part in a spontaneous lesson about trying things that you might not have liked at one time. I shared with the students how my face has a big smile when I eat a red apple because it is my favorite. My lips pucker and my facial features scrunch up when I eat a green apple because when I had one many years ago it tasted very sour. While the students were sharing with me their favorites, a few students encouraged me to try a green apple again.

This then led to a lesson about trying something new or re-trying something that we thought we didn't like at one time, but now might very well like since we are older. By coincidence, this also went along with our monthly "earth tip" which focuses on teaching children not to throw away what they don't eat, but rather take it home to eat later or to let mom/dad know that it didn't taste good. Although it turned out that green apples are still not my favorite, I at least gave it another try which delighted the kids!

Besides the aforementioned activities, several classes created voting charts which reflected the ballots cast for the color that they liked best- red, yellow, or green. This allowed for practice not only in identifying/labeling colors (sometimes in Spanish too with the older students) and in counting, but it opened the door for an equally, if not more important, topic to be introduced. While our students noted the different colors and tastes of three types of apples, they also were able to see that all apples are a fruit, grow on trees, and look the same on the inside. They each have unique qualities but they come from the same place, are part of the same food group, and look the same

on the inside. Upon further reflection, it is a wonderful way to remind our children that they might look different from friends, but we all come from God, are part of His family, and He made us all the same on the inside. He gave us all the capacity to love, care, and respect each other. It seems as though something as ordinarily simple as an apple has the potential to teach our children and remind "big people" of what matters most and what God hopes for us!

Eat an apple this week with a young person in your life or, if possible, celebrate national Take A Child Outside Week (T.A.C.O. week which begins today) by going apple picking! While partaking in either of these events, remind your child that God loves him/her and everyone who is part of His family. He gave us differences to make our world extra beautiful and diverse, but He never wants us to forget that we should practice kindness and compassion with each other because He made us all the same on the inside!

Oak City Cares






