GOING, GOING, GONE: THE GREAT DEPARTURE FROM CATHOLICISM:

On the weekend of October 8-9, I spoke about my vision for our community as part of our annual Offertory Appeal. The comments that have garnered the most feedback and affirmation were those that addressed our need to increase our efforts to reach our youth and young adults. I thought it would be good to take a couple of columns to highlight what we know about what some are calling the “great departure” from Catholicism and what types of strategies are being envisioned to retain more of our youth and young adults. This week I would like to provide some initial data on what the current situation looks like. I expect this topic will involve several columns as the issue is quite complex but I want to start with the reality on the ground that is causing me and others grave concern about this growing phenomenon.

A national snapshot based on statistics from the Kenedy Directory, an annual publication that takes data provided by all U.S. Catholic dioceses and collates them into a book, paints a disturbing picture. Here’s what the snapshot shows comparing the state of the Catholic Church in the U.S. over the past 50 years.

Strong Catholic Affiliation	45.8%	32.2%	13.6% decrease

With the exception of the increase in Confirmations, all statistics are trending negative and have been consistently moving in this direction, with few periodic exceptions, for the past 50 years despite the growth in the number of people in the general population who are registered Catholic parishioners. This overall membership growth is due significantly to Catholic immigrants but the overall percentage of registered U.S. Catholic parishioners when compared to the overall growth of the general U.S. population is declining. If not for immigrant Catholics, the overall picture would be much starker.

The statistic that is most concerning to me is the decline in sacramental marriages. Marriage in the general population is also declining but a nearly 68% drop in sacramental marriages is quite disproportionate to the decline in all marriages in the general population. Sacramental marriage is a key factor to the other sacraments traditionally celebrated by the children born of these couples and to life in a parish. This downward trend has a domino effect regarding parish life, at least in terms of sacramental participation, one bellwether for the health of the Church. The factors contributing to this particular decline are many, but the statistic nevertheless is startling.

In the next column, I will address a couple of the leading reasons contributing to this general downward slide from the myriad dynamics in play.

The columbarium attendant offers quiet, behind the scenes assistance for parishioners being laid to rest in our columbarium. The attendant prepares the columbarium niche to receive cremated remains after a funeral liturgy. Those who serve must be physically able to remove, lift, and replace the granite niche cover, which weighs approximately 60 pounds. Services are typically Tuesday thru Saturday and take approximately 1 to 1 ½ hours of time. Columbarium attendants serve as their schedule allows. A New JustFaith Program: Faith and Immigration Justice



Love the stranger then, for you were once strangers in Egypt. (Deut 10:19)

Would you like to join a JustFaith virtual study group focused on immigration?

We at St. Francis are one of the first communities to offer this new [“Faith and Immigration Justice”](#) program. It’s an opportunity for our parish to build on the three spectacularly successful racial justice programs in which more than a hundred parishioners participated over the past three years. It also seems a fitting way to reflect on the challenge of “Building the Future with Migrants and Refugees”, the theme of [National Migration Week](#) (Sep 20-25, 2022) sponsored by the U.S. Catholic Bishops, and the [World Day of Migrants and Refugees](#) (Sep 25, 2022), sponsored by the Holy See.

Depending on interest, we expect to organize one or more groups that meet online Wednesday evenings at 7pm (beginning Oct 26), and one or more that meet online Thursday afternoons at 3pm (beginning Oct 27). The groups will meet for eight weeks, with a break scheduled for Thanksgiving week. Sign up at bit.ly/ImmigrationSFA2022a.

There’s no registration fee; the cost of books is about \$28/person.

The Faith and Immigration Justice program, like other JustFaith initiatives, aims to encourage healthy conversation; equip participants to advocate for just, effective, and compassionate policies; and prepare participants to extend hospitality toward their neighbors. Its immigration-specific goals include discerning “how our faith calls us to respond to the immigration debate,” and examining the nuances of immigration policy and the citizenship process in this country.

If you’d like to receive occasional emails about this and other parish news and activities related to immigration, consider joining the parish “Immigration Allies” Realm group (login to Realm, then search for “immigration”; or contact Trevor Thompson directly at Trevor.Thompson@stfrancisraleigh.org). You needn’t worry about meetings or commitments; the allies group is nothing more than an email list that allows you to keep your finger on the pulse.

November: A Month of Remembrance

The Book of Remembrance

A Book of Remembrance, with the names of loved ones of blessed memory, will be displayed throughout the month near the sanctuary. Names may be written directly into the book by parishioners, or will be recorded into the book from the names printed on All Souls Day envelopes. In addition, these envelopes will be placed on the altar throughout the month. The book will be available in the gathering space for parishioners to add names starting this weekend.

All Saints Day - Tuesday, November 1, Masses at 9 am (with school children), 11:45 am, and 7 pm.

All Souls Day - Wednesday November 2, Masses at 9 am and 7:00 pm

During these liturgies we will lift up all those who have gone before us as we pray that “with the mortality of this life overcome, they may gaze eternally on [God], their Creator and Redeemer” (Collect from November 2 in the Roman Missal).

We will specifically honor all parishioners who have died during the past year with a reading of names.

In addition, all parishioners are encouraged to bring photos (framed, maximum of 5X7) to the parish offices prior to Monday, October 31, to be displayed on the altar steps throughout this day and then displayed in the parish gathering space throughout the month of November. Please include your name and contact information on the back of the photos so you may pick them up when the month is completed.

My name is Nancy Potanovic and I've been invited to speak with you today about what drew me to St. Francis, what the parish means to me, and why I share my time, talent, and treasure with the parish community.

First, what drew me to St. Francis is the warm and welcoming environment. I've lived in Raleigh since 1984 and during that time have attended several Catholic churches in the area. I made my Confirmation here at St. Francis way back when it was the 'old' (much smaller!) church. At the time, my family were members of another church, but we moved to St. Francis because of the wonderful high school faith formation program they had. Even then I remember thinking that everyone I met and interacted with was so friendly and genuine, which is still true today. As an adult, I chose to join this parish because of the extremely positive experience I had all those years ago when I made my Confirmation.

Next, when I think about what the parish means to me, the parish is a community where I feel comfortable and have the opportunity to give back. I've had the privilege of being a sponsor for two friends who have gone through the RCIA program here. As I told both of them, I think I got as much out of the experience as they did because as a lifelong Catholic, sometimes it's easy to get complacent about my faith, but attending the RCIA sessions really energized me. In addition, I volunteer as a youth faith formation leader, which I love! Monsignor Clay spoke last week in his homily about the importance of 'informing our youngest generation of Catholics about the importance of Jesus Christ and instilling in them an active faith in their daily lives.' Working with the youth in the parish gives me that opportunity and I'm so thankful to be part of their faith journey.

Finally, *why I share my time, talent, and treasure with the parish community.* Frankly, it's because I get a lot out of being a member of this parish and I'm thrilled that I can contribute and give back in some small way by volunteering and sharing my love of the Catholic faith with others. There is a quote on the St. Francis' website that states, 'Where your treasure is there your heart will be also' Matthew 6:21. That really resonates with me because I have always been happy to contribute financially, but it wasn't until I got more involved in the parish that I truly started to feel like a part of the community. So for me, my treasure and my heart are definitely here at St. Francis and I'm so blessed to be part of this special parish family.

Taking Time for Prayer and Reflection

This past week I participated in the annual Office of Education Diocese retreat for Principals and Directors. Traveling to a location away from home and work, provided me with structured time to take a step back, collaborate with other principals throughout the Diocese and share in each other's successes and challenges. In addition, I had some time to ponder my transition to Principal and my own personal successes, challenges and vision moving forward. During the retreat we spent some time reflecting on John's chapter 15 in the bible regarding the vines and the branches. The beginning of the chapter is shared below.

I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine grower. He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruit. You have already been cleansed by the word that I have spoken to you. Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear

fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing.

We need to use scripture to nourish ourselves and nourish our lives. As school leaders we need to choose scripture that is relevant to our students and we need to ask ourselves what it is teaching them? Does it speak to the heart of our children and deepen their relationship with Christ? Are the scriptures speaking to my students and helping them grow in their understanding of who God is? We want to evangelize them so that they leave our school having a personal relationship with Christ.

I was chosen and appointed to go bear fruit that will remain on the branch. Taking time for prayer and Bible reading should be key components of our life. It provides us with the fuel we need to grow

and remain healthy in your faith. Our relationship with Christ helps define our relationship with others. We need to put our faith and trust in Jesus. He will give us the necessary tools. Regular pruning of the branches helps us grow and flourish. As a school, we should be pruning our branches so that we are growing and expanding to meet the needs of our students and our community. Pruning should not be viewed as a negative task, but as a way to improve and to grow and bear more fruit.

Come grow with us. I welcome you to become a part of The Franciscan School. Making Treats for Our Furry Friends



Throughout the year, but especially during the month of October, we take every available opportunity to help our preschoolers embrace the example of Francis of Assisi. This past week presented our preschoolers with another activity to show care for God's creation.

For several years, our preschool has made and delivered dog biscuits to the SPCA or another animal shelter. Not only does rolling, cutting, and shaping the biscuit dough allow the children to practice several cognitive and fine motor skills, but it allows them a chance to do a small act of kindness for some furry friends. As I have previously noted, we want our students to learn compassion, care, and service to others. We want them to know how important it is to take care of each other and all that God has created, but the lesson makes a bigger impact when

our children can easily relate to and understand how exactly they are helping. Like with the acorn collection for the pigs at Saving Grace a couple of weeks ago, most of our young students know what it is like to take care of an animal, particularly if they have a pet of their own. Making treats for dogs who do not have a family to take care of them is something that our little people can easily relate to and so it makes this lesson of service highly meaningful for them.

There were so many smiles of accomplishment as I watched a few of our classes make their biscuits. Each student got to pat, roll, and cut the dough into the shape of a dog bone, fire hydrant, of dog house. Sometimes those shapes can be tricky to cut, but a little perseverance can go a long way! Although our 2-year olds did not actually work with the dough, it

was still important to find a way in which they also could partake. As it turns out, many have some super counting and packing skills! They were able, with a little bit of assistance, take the baked biscuits and put them into delivery bags. In this way, everyone had an opportunity to take part in caring for the dogs.

Perhaps you and your family might consider baking dog biscuits for an animal shelter, a neighbor's dog, or even your own pet. Any way in which we show our children how to express care and comfort to others is always a valuable one. It allows us all to deepen our faith and grow closer to God!

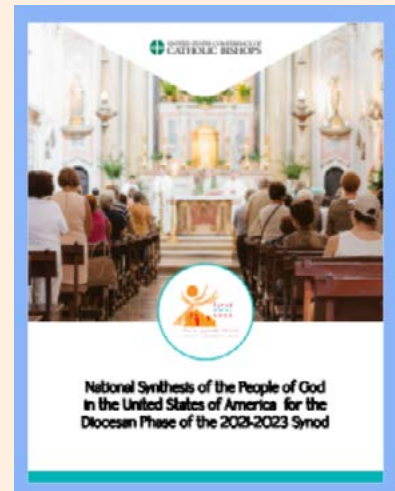

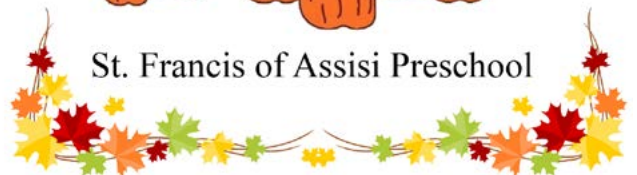

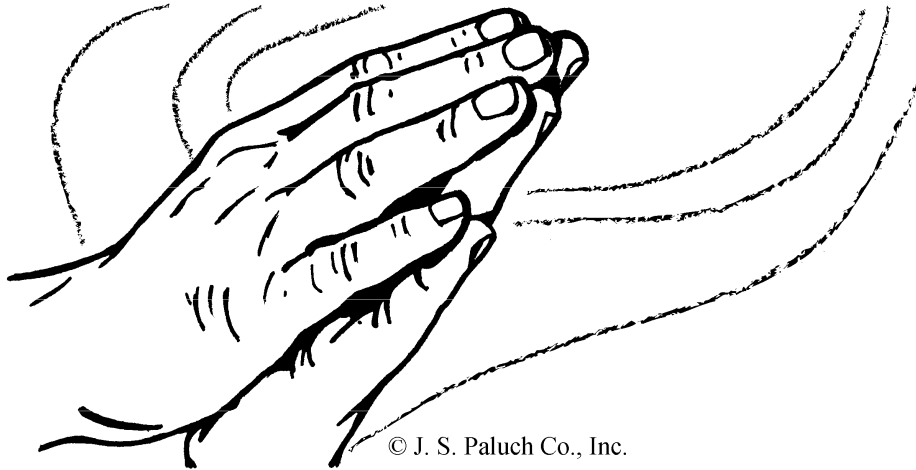
