#### GOING, GOING, GONE: THE GREAT DEPARTURE FROM CATHOLICISM, PART II:

If you read <u>my column last week</u>, you saw some startling statistics around the declining numbers of Catholics celebrating sacraments over the past 50 years. Over the next few weeks, I will delve into the main issues that are contributing to this decline, especially among our youth and young adults who are increasingly leaving the Church earlier in their lives than previous generations or simply not becoming baptized Catholics at all despite the fact that at least one of their parents is a baptized Catholic.

This week I want to focus on one major issue contributing to this phenomenon that is internal to Catholicism in the U.S. according to several major studies. It is by no means the only major issue, but it is one with a lot of data to support it. The issue may be described this way: lack of a personal relationship with God and Jesus: not aware that God and Jesus are personally invested in my life and long to have a relationship with me. The expression we use to describe this is a lack of initial or basic evangelization. Interestingly, this is not the situation in the developing world. Catholicism there is growing rapidly, especially among the young, and some preliminary studies indicate that one of the major factors contributing to this is that youth and young adults have a personal relationship with God and Jesus. They live in cultures where there is still an inherent belief that the spiritual world is an intrinsic part of life and therefore belief in and a relationship with divinity is commonplace. I will address how secularism, a strong feature of American culture, is influencing people away from the spiritual world, in a future column.

In the U.S., our Church and our parents have a generally good reputation about two things with our children: preparing for/receiving first sacraments and

religious education. We have lived for generations in the U.S. as a Church that could depend on parents baptizing their children and integrating them into a Catholic world through the sacraments and education. We have a long history of doing a good job of sacramentalizing our children, preparing them for and celebrating the sacraments, but studies tell us we don't do such a great job of evangelizing them, namely, helping them to develop an explicit, personal attachment to God and Jesus. Our Catholic educational structures around religion skew significantly in the direction of providing religious instruction but more often than not do not also invite children into an explicit. personal encounter with God and Jesus.

While both sacraments and religious education are good and important, there is a growing need to introduce our children to a relationship with God and Jesus during their formative years. Without this relationship, more of our children go through the motions and their parents check the box indicating this task is done. The sacraments and religious education in these situations become milestones rather than thresholds to the ongoing grace God wants to share with them over a lifetime.

Exacerbating the problem is that more than a few of those who are forming these children (e.g., their parents, teachers, catechists) do not have a personal relationship with God and Jesus themselves. As the saying goes, "You can't give what you don't possess." If those responsible for forming our children are not evangelized, it becomes difficult for our youth to be evangelized. If our children are not developing an explicit, personal relationship with God and Jesus, then the sacraments have a greater tendency to be viewed as commodities, something to "acquire," a benchmark or milestone, rather than as a source of regular, con-

tinual, lifelong grace meant to help them deepen their relationship with God and Jesus and sustain them in an increasingly difficult world over a lifetime.

As an example: 160 children celebrated their First Communion last spring at St. Francis. I don't see many of them on the weekend at Mass, the normal time we come together as a faith community and as families to celebrate the Eucharist. I realize life is busy and complicated, but I wonder to what extent lack of a personal relationship with God and Jesus is also a factor. There are indications that this is increasingly the case.

We have much work to do at St. Francis to help our parishioners of all ages develop an explicit, personal relationship with God and Jesus. The good news is that we have parishioners for whom this relationship is real. Those falling into this category will become critical to our efforts to spread the good news of God and Jesus to those who have yet to meet them. I'm counting on them for their help.

#### The Book of Remembrance

A Book of Remembrance, with the names of loved ones of blessed memory, will be displayed throughout the month near the sanctuary. Names may be written directly into the book by parishioners, or will be recorded into the book from the names printed on All Souls Day envelopes. In addition, these envelopes will be placed on the altar throughout the month. The book will be available in the gathering space for parishioners to add names starting this weekend.

All Saints Day - Tuesday, November 1, Masses at 9 am (with school children), 11:45 am, and 7 pm.

All Souls Day - Wednesday November 2, Masses at 9 am and 7:00 pm

During these liturgies we will lift up all those who have gone before us as we pray that "with the mortality of this life overcome, they may gaze eternally on [God], their Creator and Redeemer" (Collect from November 2 in the Roman Missal).

We will specifically honor all parishioners who have died during the past year with a reading of names.

## EDUCATION MINISTRIES Inside the Classroom: Jamie Kirchhoff

For the last 17 years, Jamie Kirchhoff has poured her heart into the students at The Franciscan School. As a first grade teacher, Kirchhoff loves when her students' faces light up as they start reading, or when a concept clicks for them. "I absolutely love first grade," says Kirchhoff. "They really enjoy reading, have sweet, pure hearts, and they start to become independent." Kirchhoff says those "aha" moments are what continue to motivate her year after year.

Kirchhoff grew up going to church here at St. Francis of Assisi. After she graduated from high school, she attended University of North Carolina Wilmington where she felt compelled to switch degrees and major in elementary education. But she didn't just want to teach at any elementary school. She specifically wanted to teach at a Catholic school. "At first, I thought I wanted to be a nurse, but while I was in college, I felt that God was calling me to be a teacher, and more definitively, a Catholic teacher."

After her first few years at TFS, Kirchhoff noticed a need in the school community for more specialization in learning challenges, so she obtained a Master's Degree in Learning Disabilities from N.C. State University. But Kirchhoff hasn't stopped learning and trying to help her school community. She is currently pursuing a WRS Level I Certification. This certification helps students with reading, as well as those with dyslexia.

In the classroom, Kirchhoff's teaching style is very hands-on. She believes that students at this age learn best when they get to experience what they have heard in a lesson through activity and movement. She typically provides a short lesson for the students, and then allows them to engage in that teaching with a hands-on center, reading groups, discussions, and more. "After each lesson, I like for the students to be able to get up, move around, change seats, work on the floor, sit at a different table, etc.," says Kirchhoff. "It allows them some independence and gets them to learn in a fun way."

While some technology is used, Kirchhoff believes that at this age, the activities she does to engage social skills, creativity, problem-solving, and fine motor skills can't be replaced. She also loves to teach literature and read books with the children using a variety of voices that helps keep them engaged. Many students really start to read in first grade and develop a love of reading, which she believes helps them become lifelong learners.

This year, things have come full circle. Kirchhoff's daughter is now in first grade at TFS. "Choosing to send our daughter to TFS was a no-brainer for us," says Kirchhoff." "I get to see the "inside" of the school, and I know it is a special place for kids to feel safe and thrive. The teachers love the kids so much." While Kirchhoff doesn't teach her daughter, she gets to see her experience all the joys that come out of learning new things in first grade.

Because of Kirchhoff's length of time at TFS, and her infectious love for the school community, she's often been known to take new teachers under her wing and help them feel welcome. Many middle school students and TFS alumni still talk about the impact she made on them in first grade. Kirchhoff loves that the school continues to get better, and that the teachers are constantly learning best practices and engaging in ways that challenge themselves. For Kirchhoff, TFS has been a special place where "the love of community has never changed, and we are always there for each other."

# Where your treasure is there your heart will be also

My name is Janelle Obaydi and my family and I have been Parishioners here at St. Francis since 2016. I am honored to have been asked to share my story of what drew me to St. Francis and what this community means to me and my family.

We moved to Raleigh in April of 2014 from Fort Lauderdale, FL looking for a more wholesome, family-oriented city that would provide our kids an environment that would nurture them through community, opportunity and diversity. And let's face it...as native New Yorkers, we missed the change of seasons. We first stumbled upon St. Francis when we were looking at preschools for our then 4-year-old to attend. It is no surprise it was love at first sight. A play-based program of learning in a faith filled environment was exactly what we were looking for. Soon after enrolling in the preschool, we began attending events at the Parish and going to mass regularly. At first it felt a little strange not being Catholic, yet beMatthew 6:21.

ing so present in our new community, but the warmth and spirit of the friars and the parishioners made it feel like home. With a husband that traveled for work quite frequently St. Francis became the sense of family and home we were looking for. The familiarity of the same people in the pews next to us every Sunday and the same faces we would walk into and out of school with everyday was everything we were hoping to find.

It was early in 2016 when I began to feel a calling. A calling to deepen my faith. A calling to become part of something much bigger than just being present in my new community. A calling to become Catholic. In August of 2016 I began my RCIA journey and what it would lead to is beyond my wildest dreams. RCIA isn't just for those that are looking to convert to Catholicism. It is for anyone and everyone that is looking to deepen their faith or even just rediscover their why. Why do I come to church? Why do I preach the gospel? Why do I make sure my kids celebrate their sacraments? Not only did RCIA provide me with a foundation of the Catholic Church and its teachings but the connection, guidance, communion and relationships that would come from the experience would change my life forever.

I quickly learned the importance of the gift of time. Time that we share with ourselves, our St. Francis community and our community at large. Watching the sponsors and the RCIA team members show up week after week, month after month for almost a year to help people they never met before grow in faith was incredible to me. Meeting people like Joan Monti and Ellen Ferrone that literally volunteer in every ministry share their experiences will light a fire inside of anyone to want to do the same. Meeting people like Jenn Fiduccia that has a fulltime job, a husband and 4 kids still find the time to tirelessly give her time to her Church community through her musical talents, leadership and vast knowledge of Catholicism was and is inspiring. There's no lack of people within this community that inspire so many of us to give our time. And with that said I struggled with the "but I feel like I have no time. My husband always travels and I am constantly on the go. How do I squeeze one more thing in?" For starters, make it a priority. Don't just talk about it. Act. Find a friend or another family to share your time with. Look for the ministries that fit your stage of life. After I made my sacraments through RCIA I was so in love with the experience I became a sponsor and then later an RCIA team member. I continued to arrange childcare every Wednesday night to give my time to this group and yet selfishly continued to gain so much more myself. When my kids got older it made more sense for me to become a Core Team Member with CrossWalk. Being an active participant in their personal faith journey...what could be better than that? The list of ministries to volunteer with can be overwhelming but that is a great problem to have. It is also important for our family to make time to attend as many CrossWalk and Parish wide family events as possible. The goal for us to raise not just cultural Catholics but children that will make Jesus Christ a part of their daily lives.

Part of finding where to give your time is to know your God given gifts or talents. For me, my talents lie in seeing a need and finding a solution without being asked, organizing and administrative work, sharing stories and finding connections. Knitting...not my strong suit so you won't find me involved in the prayer shawl ministry. But you will see me or have seen me at, of course, RCIA

as a sponsor and small group leader, CrossWalk Core Team member, in the Preschool office helping with administrative tasks, Substitute teaching and with caring connections sending birthday cards. There is something for everyone here and we need you. Lean into whatever discomfort is holding you back and you will find your experience rewarding beyond measure.

Giving of our treasure is important too. It's a nice way of saying your money. No one wants to talk about it but we need it to operate and provide the Parish with even the most basic needs. Every family is different but since we are talking about me and my family today, we find Faith Direct to work best. At the beginning of every year, we go through and budget what we will donate to each offering throughout the year. Everything from our monthly offertory, Easter flowers, Feast of Assumption, All Saints Day, Thanksgiving/Food for the Poor CPO, Christmas. Etc. It is withdrawn each month and it takes the guess work out of trying to remember all of the extra offertories we want to provide. It makes it easy during tax season to print out our Year-to-Date gifts as well. We also find calculating the percent increase the parish recommends for the new year is simplified using Faith Direct. When assigning contributions at the beginning of the year we reflect on our excess spending. Do we really need that daily pumpkin spice latte? Imagine what that extra \$150 a month could provide St. Francis. Just a suggestion. The needs

of the Parish will not stop growing and our needs are ever changing. Msgr. Clay's homily last weekend really struck a chord with me as the decline in youth presence and participation in our very own community is evident. I fully support and encourage the financial focus on finding intentional ways to support these initiatives. I hope you will too.

In conclusion, I hope you all feel inspired on some level to evaluate what you are already doing, sharing and financially contributing to our Parish. We all have God's gifts to make the world, and if nothing else, our community a better place. Thank you for your time, talent and treasure. You are all truly Saints of God.

In the Gospel today, Zacchaeus accepts our Lord joyfully; and the sign of his acceptance is his open house and his resolution to give half of his goods to the poor.

Our gifts to the Society of St. Vincent de Paul also show our acceptance of our Lord by joyfully sharing goods with our neighbors who are hungry, hopeless, alone and frightened.

One such case brought the SVdP members to tears. A single mother had gotten behind on rent and utilities because she had taken off time from work to care for a child recovering from surgery. St. Francis of Assisi pledged to help her, but she still had a way to go to come up with the total amount of back rent.

While she was waiting to hear from the organizations, SVdP sent her two gift cards donated by parishioners to help with food and gasoline.

"I got the mail and saw the envelope from St. Francis. I opened it and I think I stared at the gift cards for 30 minutes. I felt like God was really trying to help me. Those gift cards were such a big help," the neighbor told the SVdP volunteer.

Soon after, other churches including Holy Name of Jesus Cathedral and local Presbyterian and Baptist churches contributed to her aid. She was able to avoid eviction. Another SVdP referral to a county agency helped reduce her overdue utility bill.

Volunteers at SVdP work tirelessly to provide hope, compassion, referrals and short-term financial help for families. Most of the cases are the working poor—families who are paying their bills until they get an unexpected situation—an illness, a car needing service, a funeral.
