

Getting Ready to Celebrate the Christmas Season at

**St. Francis:** I'm looking forward to celebrating the Christmas season with you this year if you will be in the area. If you are traveling, I will be praying that your journey to your destination and back to us will be safe. Here is some information you may find helpful for your planning:

**CHRISTMAS:** There will be seven Masses for the feast of the Nativity of the Lord (a.k.a., Christmas), five on Christmas Eve and two on Christmas Day morning. The three 4pm Masses will be geared to children, one of which will be livestreamed. The 7:30pm Mass will be in Spanish. The traditional, more "solemn," Christmas Mass will be at 10:00pm later that night, and it, too, will be livestreamed. On Sunday, Christmas Day, we will celebrate Mass at 9:00am and 11:45am. There will be no 7:15am or 5:30pm Mass on Christmas Day.

With many visitors joining us for Christmas, I ask you to consider the following:

- Hospitality is an intrinsic part of our parish identity and Christmas is a time when many visitors, who do not receive our bulletin or see our website, are among us. Let's help to make their visit a positive one by experiencing the welcoming presence for which we are so well known.
- 2. Kindness and patience are virtues. The 4:00pm liturgies will provide us with an opportunity to practice them! Keep in mind that the church will only fit a finite number of people. If we have discerned that we are at capacity in the church, we will ask you to proceed to another building for this Mass time.
- 3. Because the first three Masses (all at 4:00pm) may be quite full, we ask you to consider attending one of the other Masses this year, especially the ones on Christmas morning (9:00am and 11:45am), to help us manage the numbers of potential worshipers. It might be nice to try something new and have a story to tell in the future about the time you broke with custom and went to Mass on Christmas Day and still found that "all was calm and all was bright."
- 4. While Bishop Luís has reimposed the obligation to worship in person on Sundays and Holy Days since Easter, two Christmas Masses will be livestreamed (4:00pm and 10:00pm on Christmas Eve) for those who are being cautious about being in crowded spaces.
- 5. Masks will remain required in the left transept section nearest the baptistery at all Masses in the church and in one section in the gym for the 4pm Mass. Holy Communion will be distributed in those sections only in the hand.

**NEW YEAR'S DAY:** The Feast of Mary, Mother of God, and the World Day of Prayer for Peace will be celebrated on December 31-January 1. Coming for Mass is a great way to celebrate the new year, and I hope many of you in the area that weekend will join us. We will celebrate four Masses that weekend at the same times as our regular Sunday Mass schedule with the exception of the 5:30pm Mass on Sunday, January 1, which will be dropped based on previous history of attendance for this Mass. The Sacrament of Reconciliation will not take place on Saturday.

On Sunday, January 1, after the 9:00am Mass, we will process to the newly renovated Peace Pole to bless it and to pray for peace in our world. We are in desperate need of peace and I cannot think of a better way to kick off the new year than to pray for peace in our world at the Peace Pole. I hope we have a large crowd.




### **Knights of Columbus Used Cell Phone Drive**


With our baptismal vow, we are greater than John the Baptist.

# **Book Group Opportunity** on Catholic Teaching and Death Penalty


Starting in January, the St. Francis Office of Justice and Peace is beginning a 6-week virtual study group that turns a spotlight on the death penalty in order to appreciate the evolution of Catholic teaching on this topic.

Sister Helen Prejean, author of Dead Man Walking, once wrote, "If we believe that murder is wrong and not admissible in our society, then it has to be wrong for everyone, not just individuals but governments as well." Dignity and the Death Penalty: Evolution of Catholic Teaching (Alice Hugh Brown, author) is a 2021 publication based on decades of experience and insights from Sister Helen. This slim volume, heralded by the Catholic Mobilizing Network, is an excellent means of bringing to light the evolution of Church teaching and to illuminate Pope Francis's 2018 statement, "The death penalty is inadmissible, and Catholics should work for its abolition."

Join a parish-wide book group for information and dialogue on this very current topic. We will meet online Tuesday evenings, January 17 through February 21, from 7pm to 8pm. This book study will be facilitated by: Marianne Norris and Ellen Zaytoun, St. Francis parishioners and members of the Raleigh Diocese's Catholics for Abolition in North Carolina.

This is a great opportunity to share our gifts with those who need to experience the joy of Christ's birth.




