




#### Why I Support the Bishop's Annual Appeal (B.A.A.) and Hope You Will Too:

Since the mid-70's, the Bishop's Annual Appeal has served hundreds of thousands of people throughout the Diocese of Raleigh. This year's appeal kicks off this weekend. I have

supported it annually since I was ordained and ask you to join me this year to help fund 23 programs and ministries that benefit so many. Here are just a few of the beneficiaries: Catholic Charities, parish assistance to small rural parishes, grants to help small Catholic schools, and seminarian education.



Each parish's goal is proportionate to its population and annual offertory. As the largest parish in the diocese with the highest offertory, our goal is the largest: \$473,565.35. Distributed evenly among our 5300+ households, this would translate into a gift of \$90 per household if all households participated. Last year some 1200 households helped us reach our goal for the second year in a row, an accomplishment I am very proud of. The median gift was \$400. I am pledging \$500 payable over five months. I ask you to consider a pledge or donation of equal value. If you are unable to match me, please know that any and all pledges or donations are gratefully accepted.



(Richard Hammer) May 10,1942 I was gifted with the cleansing water of Baptism in the Church of the Blessed Trinity in Buffalo N.Y. because of the love of my parents, and years before the Buffalo Bill's were even thought of or formed! Today, after a lifetime of blessings involving Joy and sorrow, topped off by the Called and Gifted seminar, I have some sense of flowing Joy and Peace, after disregarding times of fear and sleepiness, in responding to "small" opportunities to witness and share with people who cross my path.

In Called and Gifted I learned my charism is evangelization to people on the margins of Our Faith Community, while sharing in the support and responsibilities of Our Faith Community. For instance, as I write this, there was a request to serve as


an Emmaus minister on short notice. I already had a funeral planning in process, but I find it helpful to discern using the four cardinal virtues:

- 1. prudence (likelihood for success)
- 2. common good (justice)
- 3. self sacrifice (temperance); with joy resulting (fortitude)

So I volunteered. When I met with the family, I learned that the deceased was Catholic, but many in the family were not. As I assisted with the planning process, I experienced joy and their appreciation as we uncovered the symbolism and meaning in the practices of our Faith.

Another recent example of finding Joy from the Called and Gifted awareness was when a friend from Temple Beth Or asked me to speak to his 9th grade comparative religion class about why I am a practicing Catholic. I found the young high school students subsequently interested in joining us for Mass. The welcoming by St. Francis staff, youth and volunteers was a blessing to all of us.

I have also found more opportunities to lector at our own liturgies, which further reinforces the blessings I received from this seminar which helps us live out our vocation, not as the "chosen frozen" but as living witnesses in the grace filled NOW, members of the Mystical Body of Christ! 

It also gave us our first group of friends within a few weeks of the move. That led to Cursillo. Christian Family Living retreats. and Search for our children. Those programs gave me even more confidence to teach Confirmation classes. and to join the choir. That led me to learn to play the guitar and take singing lessons.


By the time we left Wilmington 27 years later, and through no fault of my own, I was leading the folk choir by myself, with the help of about 10 wonderful, faithful singing friends. There are a lot of possible charisms mixed into the above.

Fast forward to our joining St. Francis of Assisi parish. Our church is so full of ministries that I found it hard to know where I would fit in. Covid allowed me to sign up for so many courses that I started to forget the content of some of them until I went back to review them. Then Called & Gifted appeared out of nowhere! Maybe it was time for me to listen to the Holy Spirit.

After taking the Charism Inventory, Encouragement came out the highest. I wasn't sure how that fit in until I started to contemplate what it might mean. I began to realize I seemed to have used this Charism for many years. For one thing, I have always considered myself as a glass half full type of person. I also believed if I was not part of a solution. I was part of a problem and it was time to move on. I definitely believed in "fake it til you make it" and "this, too, shall pass" when going through tough times.

At this point in my life, I find myself being drawn to the much older folks who are going through health and mental problems. I listen to their stories told over and over. I offer snarky retorts to make them laugh, and then they make me laugh. Just because they can't remember my name does not mean they can't remember funny comebacks!








# New Service Opportunity **Dinner at Helen Wright Center!**



#### **Parish will be Mortgage Free by March!**




