

CATHOLIC SCHOOLS WEEK: We celebrate Catholic Schools Week January 29-February 4. We are blessed to have two schools on our campus, The Franciscan School (a.k.a. TFS) (K-8) and the St. Francis Pre-School (2-5 year olds). Both are outstanding schools with



great leadership and excellent faculty and staff. A Catholic School education is a big financial investment but so worth it. Our students receive an excellent intellectual formation and learn Catholic values that will last a lifetime, just to name two reasons to consider it. The commitment of our parents is incredible, among the most impressive I have experienced as a priest.

Each day this week, our TFS students will celebrate and give thanks for a variety of people. On Sunday, the focus will be on our church community. The students will be plentiful in number assisting us in a variety of ways at our Masses. On Monday, the focus will be on their families. Parents will be especially acknowledged on this day. On Tuesday, service will be the focus. Collecting books and board games to share with others will be featured. On Wednesday, the students will be praying for our nation, especially at the School Mass in the church at 9am. On Thursday, the focus will be on vocations. The children will spend the day learning about the variety of vocations to which God calls us. On Friday, the focus will be on thanking the school's faculty, staff, and volunteers who do extraordinary things to make the school such a wonderful place.

Our Pre-School will be following the same daily themes in a simpler but very appropriate and meaningful way for them.

There are almost 1.7 million U.S. Catholic school students celebrating Catholic Schools Week, a number that is on the increase nationally. Catholic schools graduate 99 percent of its high school seniors, continually outperform public schools and other religious and private schools on national assessment tests and foster social responsibility. Most importantly, Catholic schools teach values that reflect our faith and the Gospel of Jesus Christ.





# The Connection

I'm currently a participant in the Called & Gifted program and wanted to share a personal experience that I believe would not have happened without my participation in the program. The goal of the program is to actively discern our spiritual gifts in the service of others, develop awareness for opportunities to use them and to act.

After a long recent work trip to Europe, travel drama abounded on the return trip! After a 5+ hr delay, my flight was then cancelled, and I finally made it home 24 hours after my scheduled return.

I'm not even sure how it started, but the guy sitting right next to me and I had an extended conversation on the flight back (we had exchanged pleasantries throughout the previous day's delays). He felt comfortable opening up and shared some of the issues that he was facing with his father, the regrets that he had about his failed marriage, and his attempts to try to strengthen his relationships with his daughters. I listened with empathy and shared the strength that I have found by trying to put Christ in the center of my life. This led to a lengthy


dialogue and ultimately a conversation about spiritual gifts and the journey to direct those on the behalf of others which really struck a chord with him. I happened to have my Spiritual Gifts workbook in the pocket of my seat and let him borrow it. He then read my workbook with interest for a long time. He shared that he felt that the entire purpose of the flight delay was to allow him to have that interaction with me and to reset his connection to his faith and family.

He followed up later to share that he had a perfect and beautiful interaction with his daughter and was beyond grateful for that interaction. I was also very happy to hear that he also had a wonderful visit with his dad where I think he was able to find some peace.

I am grateful for the Spiritual Gifts program and for the increased awareness of the importance of discerning our gifts and developing higher awareness for opportunities to help others and the courage and boldness to act.

Whether families are considering preschool or grades K-8 for their child, as educators, we recognize the importance of finding a school which supports academic excellence and fosters development of the whole child. 

# The St. Vincent de Paul Society at St. Francis of Assisi

In the Gospel today Jesus gives us the Beatitudes, which embody a radically alternative vision of life, and we find that God, indeed, calls us to blessedness.

A blessedness is revealed in the work of the St. Vincent de Paul Society where volunteers work to respond to the voices of those in need.

Take, for instance, a recent SVdP meeting when visitors discussed a neighbor who called for help with his water bill. He woke up one morning to find that his water service had been cut off. The neighbor, a military veteran, called the city and was told that they sent him a cut-off warning in late December. He never received the notice and didn't have the money needed to restore service.


Not only did SVdP members approve payment on his behalf, but they were also determined to expedite it so his water would be reconnected as soon as possible. "We'll get the paperwork done tonight and send it out to the appropriate department."

Neighbors are not only grateful for the financial help, but they also appreciate the attention they receive from the volunteers. "You called me back!" is the grateful response some volunteers receive from neighbors who have left a message on the helpline.

SVdP seeks to help people who face temporary financial setback because of an illness, a death in the family or other challenging life events.

# **Prison Pen Pal Ministry Seeking New Pen Pals**

"Remember those in prison, as though in prison with them, and those who are mistreated since you also are in the Body."

Hebrews 13:3.

The St. Francis Prison Pen Pal Ministry is in need of more pen pals who want to write to the men on Death Row, many of whom have no family or any connection to the outside world, yet often express hidden talents in art, crafts, poetry, prose and music. Many parishioners have been deeply touched by their pen pal relationships. We are looking for 4-6 new parishioners to step up. Training and ongoing mentorship are offered for pen pals. The ministry also gathers quarterly to discuss current events and issues within the prison, as well as encourage, support and share their experiences with other pen pals. This is a writing ministry that can be done on your own time and schedule, but it can also be so enriching in that it evolves into so much more.

One person in Central Prison who has a pen pal relationship with a parishioner named Chris wrote this New Year's prayer - "Gracious God, I know you have a unique plan for me, and I want you to fulfill it through me by your power the Holy Spirit. I yield my life to you and willingly submit to your plan and purpose for my life. Holy Spirit, please empower me for your service today. Thank you Lord, in the name of Jesus, Amen."

# Parish will be Mortgage Free by March!

We are delighted to share with the Parish Community that we are on track to be Mortgage Free by March. Our last payment will be February. As a result, we will be transitioning the Mortgage Sunday giving option, via envelopes and Faith Direct, to becoming the Maintenance Reserve Sunday. As we have shared with you, the cost of maintaining our beautiful campus is increasing as our facilities age. A recent asset and reserve study projected over the next 20 years it will cost \$18 million dollars to maintain the campus.

For those of you who have been making Mortgage Sunday contributions, those envelopes will be replaced by Maintenance Reserve Sunday envelopes in March. We hope that you consider continuing your donations as we shift our focus to Maintenance. If you currently donate toward the Mortgage using Faith Direct, those donations will be transitioned to Maintenance Reserve donation for you. Thank you for your continued support as we reach this significant milestone.



#### **January Cross Step (Pre-K Faith Formation) At A Glance:**

Throughout the month of January, the Cross Step children have learned so much! They were educated about the Epiphany, which is when the Magi from the East travelled to Bethlehem to honor Jesus. We also discussed how John the Baptist, like the three Wise Men, anticipated the coming of a Messiah. The children read Jill Kemp's "John the Baptist" picture book about the baptism of the Lord. Upon becoming baptized, a dove appeared overhead, which was a sign that Jesus was chosen by his Father, along with the Holy Spirit, to share God's message of love and salvation. Both the visit of the Magi and Jesus' baptism reveal Jesus as the Son of God.

The children witnessed firsthand what being baptized looks like with our own baptism kits, which consisted of a baby doll and the elements of baptism, including "chrism oil," "holy water," a scalloped bowl that represented a seashell, and a baptismal "font." The children were taught that by participating in this first Sacrament, we not only make a promise to live in a way that is Christ-like, in addition to being forgiven for our sins, but we also become official members of the Catholic Church.

Afterwards, the children made paper baptism doves, complete with wings that could flap. This lesson was super informative and super fun!

Along with learning about Epiphany, the CS children also discovered later on in January that Jesus' first Apostles were fishermen. We read Jill Kemp's "Follow Me" picture book and discussed the importance of responding to God's call. When we are called to follow Jesus, this means that we stop thinking about ourselves; we trust that God will take care of us; and we follow Him.

Andrew, Simon Peter, James, and John believed in God, and they trusted that Jesus was the Son of God. Simon Peter believed in Jesus so much that he eventually became the first Pope, or leader of the Catholic Church. The CS children were taught that this tradition of having a Pope in the Catholic Church continues to this day, and we showed them a picture of Pope Francis so that they can begin associating a face with his name. Afterwards, the children got to pretend to be fishermen themselves— they went fishing for fish using magnetic fishing poles, and they even created their own "Fishers of Men" mobiles with "swimming fish" to proudly display in their windows at home.


