





The St. Vincent de Paul Society at St. Francis of Assisi

In the Gospel today, Jesus says, "You are the light of the world," as He inspires us to live our Christian vocation in words and deeds. Neighbors call St. Vincent de Paul Society in their darkest times. St. Vincent de Paul at St. Francis of Assisi provides hope, compassion, referrals, and short-term financial help for families in the area.

Most of the cases are the working poor—families who can pay their bills until they get an unexpected situation—a funeral, a car needing service, a sickness. Any of those situations could make them need help with rent or utilities.

So far this year, SVdP has been a light to:

- A pregnant mother of two who was unable to keep working because of a troubled pregnancy and got behind on bills.
- A mother of an 8-year-old daughter who faced eviction because she had been off work with long Covid and her ex-husband no longer makes child support payments because he filed bankruptcy.
- A mother disabled at work who fell behind in rent after her disability payments ran out. She is seeking a new job.
- A military veteran whose water was disconnected for nonpayment.
- A couple whose main breadwinner lost his job at Christmas and was waiting to hear the results of a drug screen and background check so he could start a new one. Meanwhile, they were behind on rent.
- A mother with two daughters who is behind on expenses because of increasing medical bills for one of the daughters who is chronically ill.
