

WE ARE MORTGAGE FREE! Last week, Rob Neppel, our director of finance and planning, informed me that we made the last payment on our final mortgage and are now debt free. To help you appreciate the significance of this, it would be helpful to know a bit about our mortgage history.

Rob did some research on our loan history but our in-house records only go back to 1995 when the present church was constructed. The diocese has archived our earlier mortgages which helped pay for, among other things, the construction of our original church (now Founder's Hall) in the 1980's. Since 1995, we have taken out over \$19M in diocesan-funded loans for various building programs and land purchases. This does not include the amount of money contributed by parishioners during capital campaigns for construction. When Rob took over his position in 2014, the chief financial officer of the diocese and a parishioner, Dr. Russ Elmayan, told Rob that St. Francis represented 6.6% of the diocese's revenue and 18.6% of its debt. Indeed, it was common knowledge that St. Francis had the largest amount of debt in the diocese due to all the construction and land purchases we made.

Since 1995 we have taken out seven diocesan loans, four for construction of new buildings (i.e., the Church (1995), TFS (1999), the Community Center, Chapel, and Elizabeth Hall (2010), and Siena Hall (2011). One loan was for the purchase of Bethany Hills Baptist Church (subsequently sold to Our Lady of LaVang Catholic Church) (2013) and two loans were for land purchases (i.e., land for TFS (1998) and the acquisition of the land and two houses on Leesville Road (San Damiano and Laverna) in 2005.

We will celebrate our new debt-free status the weekend of March 26-27. Fr. Mark Reamer, OFM, who served as pastor between 2004-2014 and was involved in several of our building and land acquisition projects, will be with us to celebrate a ceremonial burning of our final mortgage. Look for more details in the coming week.

I can never thank enough our benefactors for your deep financial commitment over several decades to the beautiful campus we enjoy today. What we have is a testimony of the faith, vision, dedication, hard work, and perseverance of thousands of parishioners. I look forward to celebrating our new debt-free status in late March and hope many of you who have been part of this journey will join us in our festivities.

As I mentioned in my address to the parish in late 2021, we are entering a phase of our community's life where our buildings and infrastructure are beginning to show their age and will require us to set aside between \$750K-\$1M annually to maintain our beautiful campus over the next 20 years. So while our annual \$1.1M mortgage payment to the diocese has ended, we will still need your financial support to fund our maintenance, repair, and replacement costs. The present mortgage envelope will change soon to a maintenance envelope and those using Faith Direct will also have a place to direct your support to maintain our beautiful campus.

I am grateful for your ongoing support and trust you agree that what we have achieved over the past 40 years is worth preserving in terms of our material resources as well as our spiritual, pastoral, and educational ministry.



Consider signing-up for Greener Lent this Lenten season! Greener Lent is a Lenten program that prepares our hearts for Easter through prayer, fasting and almsgiving through the lens of *Laudato Si* (Pope Francis's encyclical on caring for our common home and the poor). In addition to the Church's prescribed days of fast and abstinence, Greener Lent participants increase the rigor of their fast by reducing their consumption of meat, especially beef and lamb, substituting food with significantly lower environmental impact. Participants are encouraged to formally commit to prayer for the conversion of hearts, donate to Catholic Relief Services, and pray for those whose livelihoods have been hurt or destroyed by the climate crisis. Each week Greener Lent participants will receive an email message indicating an estimate of the carbon equivalents saved by our parish and how much has been donated to the CRS/Greener Lent fund. At this Lenten Service Sunday, we will work together to trace, cut, and organize denim shoe kits for vulnerable children in Uganda in partnership with Sole Hope.



Lenten Service Sunday: Blankets of Love for Kids, Sunday, March 12




Lenten Service Sunday: Packing Meals for Hunger, Sunday, March 26

EDUCATION MINISTRIES

As part of our identity as Catholic educational institutions, both The Franciscan School (TFS) and St. Francis Preschool, practice forms of service throughout the year. This particularly occurs during Catholic Schools Week (CSW) when we have an opportunity to highlight putting our faith into action.

Educators at both schools will be some of the first to tell you about the importance of reading to a child. Starting this early helps to ensure their successful development in so many ways. While we recognize the necessity of books in a child's life, we also know that there are children in our own communities who do not have easy access to books. To help alleviate some of the need, the elementary grades at TFS collected books for Book Harvest while the preschool did the same for the Wake Up & Read program. This act of service for other children was made more meaningful to our students because most have an abundance of


books at their homes or can easily go and purchase one. They can tell you their favorite books and understand how happy it makes them to read them. By participating in these book collections, we are hopefully not only providing books, but also teaching our students the joy involved in sharing their favorites with others!


Also during CSW, the preschool and TFS participated in a project to benefit families involved with the Helene Foundation. This is a local organization that supports families in which the mother is undergoing cancer treatments. Middle school students at TFS collected board games and gift cards for pizza while students at preschool assembled hot cocoa gift bags. These even included Valentine notes and special tags which were decorated and bedazzled by our youngest students! Most of our children, both big and little, have enjoyed a treat of hot chocolate and many partake in family

time with some form of play and a meal. They now had the chance to give this opportunity to a family who was experiencing a challenging event for one of their caregivers.

In addition to the above service projects, the fourth grade collected dog supplies for Saving Grace, a local non-profit organization that promotes adoption and fosters lifelong connections between dogs and families. The second grade students in partnership with Catholic Parish Outreach assembled birthday bag. These bags will be distributed to families in need to provide needed supplies for birthday celebrations.

It is a blessing that these experiences during Catholic Schools Week gave our students opportunities to spread kindness in our community while also following in Jesus' footsteps by serving others. What opportunities can you find to help others?
