### THE COMPLEXITIES OF FORGIVENESS, PART II:

I have been asked many times to accompany people who have difficulty forgiving or have encountered people who have erroneous understandings of Christian forgiveness.

I thought it would be good to present a series on forgiveness in this column during the Lenten season. I looked at what forgiveness is and is not in last week's column.

This week I will explore why forgiveness can be difficult. There are many reasons why forgiveness can be difficult but I will focus on those that have emerged repeatedly in my conversations.

Scientists tell us that evolution has conditioned us to avoid being exploited by others for our own protection. This has caused us to develop a defense mechanism that can result in several outcomes. Here are just three: 1) retaliating as a way to warn others not to offend again or 2) retaliating as a way of expressing our pain, both of which make forgiveness harder, or, if you are the offender, 3) being fearful of asking for forgiveness because you may offend again.

Forgiveness can be difficult because it means letting go of something that can feel like a loss; loss of control, the upper hand, power, self-righteousness, an apology, even of a relationship, etc.

Forgiveness is challenging because we have a hard time staying in the present because we're still dealing with the hurt from the past. Forgiveness is about the present and the future while recognizing that it cannot forget the past. But if we get stuck in the past, forgiveness becomes very difficult.

Anger is a common reaction to hurt or an offense. Sometimes this emotion can be so strong that forgiveness never has a chance to help us recalibrate our anger so it doesn't have such primacy in our lives. We can use it to continually justify our unwillingness to forgive, especially when the hurt or offense is particularly egregious.

In relationships where hurtful and harmful behaviors or actions emerge repeatedly, there is legitimate fear that forgiveness will not remediate the situation, so we withhold it.

Sometimes we can withhold forgiveness as a way to punish the wrongdoer. This need or desire to punish can make forgiveness difficult.

Forgiveness can be perceived by the person who has done wrong as a sign of weakness. In this situation, the person becomes reluctant to seek forgiveness for fear of appearing weak out of the erroneous perception that only the weak forgive when in actuality it is the strong who forgive.

Next week we will look at why forgiveness is so important for us.

In addition to the Church's prescribed days of fast and abstinence, Greener Lent participants increase the rigor of their fast by reducing their consumption of meat, especially beef and lamb, substituting food with significantly lower environmental impact. Participants are encouraged to formally commit to prayer for the conversion of hearts, donate to Catholic Relief Services, and pray for those whose livelihoods have been hurt or destroyed by the climate crisis. Each week Greener Lent participants will receive an email message indicating an estimate of the carbon equivalents saved by our parish and how much has been donated to the CRS/Greener Lent fund. ### Sharing the Good News of the Lord and Our Community: An Updated Approach

This is the third part of a four part series about a recent effort to improve our communication processes (bulletin, website, social media) while not losing sight of meeting the needs of our community. If you missed the <u>first</u> or <u>second</u> part, please click the corresponding links in this sentence.

In February, we focused efforts on the following platforms:

- Establishing a credible social media presence by following best practices for our Facebook and Instagram accounts.
- Launching St. Francis Serves, an online portal for signing up for all volunteer opportunities
- Adding events and continuing to update the new website

With a focus on evangelization, combined with our parish mission and vision statement, a parish communication strategy emerged.

The parish website, <u>stfrancisraleigh.org</u>, will continue to be our main evangelization tool for communication. Bimonthly stories will reveal how our SFA community is spreading the good news of the Gospel, and how the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus makes a difference in our lives.

Our social media platforms, <u>Facebook</u> and <u>Instagram</u>, will support this message by using engaging stories, photos, and videos, highlighting the events of the parish and enticing visitors to the other platforms for more information.

St. Francis Serves features all parish opportunities so anyone can easily find a way to serve in our parish and beyond. So far, we have 358 users on the site, with an average of 5 new users a day. There were 181 hours served in the month of February with 91 service opportunities with 950 shifts available. We continue to follow the lead of Fr. David McBriar, OFM in answering the question of how our parish can serve the city of Raleigh and beyond.

Realm continues to be the parish ministry database serving as a source for ministry communication and event registration.

St. Francis TV and the SFA YouTube channel will continue to feature videos about upcoming events and stories of our parish, as well as a location to always find the livestream of Sunday 9am Mass.

Last but not least, the <u>revamped bulletin</u>, will become an instrument to point community members to these different platforms. Events will be featured in an easy to skim two-sided one sheet bulletin, allowing for a print version for those who do not have any type of device that allows them to read the bulletin. It also will be a tool in our evangelization tool belt as visitors will be able to receive a copy after Mass.

Next week, in the final part of this series, I will highlight sections of the revamped bulletin, and discuss how we will be able to serve those who do not have an electronic device to view the bulletin.

## The Called to Lives of Meaning and Purpose Initiative





Ready to put words into action? Sign up today and join fellow parishioners in supporting farmers of color and caring for the Earth. Get ready to bite into some local, tasty, healthy spring produce and support social justice in our food system by joining the CSA (Community Supported Agriculture) at St. Francis. The CSA at St. Francis is in partnership with RAFI. RAFI-USA "challenges the root causes of unjust food systems, supporting and advocating for economically, racially, and ecologically just farm communities". Currently, St. Francis of Assisi is being served by Brown Family Farms, in Henderson, NC.

By joining the Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) you will support local farmers of color and sustainable and/or organic farming methods. By subscribing to a CSA, you share in both the risks and rewards of a farmer and their farm produce. The subscription fee is paid up front to the farmer. Subscribers share the risks of the farming and the rewards of receiving a weekly box of sustainably and organically grown produce for 8 weeks during the Spring season.

Please consider joining me in subscribing to this effort, to provide fresh, healthy produce to our families while supporting farmers of color, caring for Earth, our common home, and taking a step to add more justice to our food system.

We are a founding congregation of a non-partisan, multi-racial, multi-issue community organizing effort in Wake County called ONE Wake. This organization has brought together 46 faith congregations and non-profits in Wake County to work together on addressing some of the most pressing needs of vulnerable people in our communities. In 2020, ONE Wake publicly launched and since then has been working diligently around 3 issues: affordable housing, education, and employment/wages.

Over the last 3 years, ONE Wake members, including St. Francis parishioners, have met with elected officials, attended press conferences, stood in solidarity with Latino neighbors, advocated for new affordable housing initiatives, organized residents in rapidly gentrifying areas, canvassed for non-partisan local elections...This is good work and it's God's Work!

### The St. Vincent de Paul Society at St. Francis of Assisi

In the Gospel Jesus is transfigured and a voice from heaven said, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased: Listen to him."

The St. Vincent de Paul Society helps us listen to Jesus when he asks us to take care of our brothers and sisters who are suffering.

The neighbors helped by SVdP are usually the working poor. People who can make ends meet until an unexpected event—a funeral, a car needing service, an injury or sickness.

Here are some ways SVdP helped those in need celebrate the grace of God's love in February:

- A 52-year-old woman was able to pay her rent as well as her electric bill with help from SVdP and other churches. The case for the neighbor took patience because one church didn't get the pledge in on time, so the landlord refused to accept the checks from the others. The neighbor advocated on her own behalf and was able to resolve the situation.
- A 63-year-old woman who injured her Achilles tendon and was off work fell behind on rent. SVdP and the North Raleigh Christian Church helped her catch up. She is now on Social Security and will be able to meet her financial obligations.
- A woman with a nine-year-old daughter received a five-day notice of eviction proceedings. She is unemployed and in training for a new job. She paid part of her electric bill and SVdP and another agency were able to help her pay the rest.
- A single mother with a 15-year-old daughter was unable to work after she was injured by a falling tree.
   SVdP assisted with her electric and water bill.
- A 27-year-old mother with a 10-year-old autistic daughter works two jobs to make ends meet after her husband left. Her car broke down, and she had to get a new one. She fell behind on rent and faced certain eviction. Donations from several agencies, including SVdP, Doorway to Hope, and Crosspointe, helped prevent the loss of their home.
