Fifth Sunday of Lent



THE COMPLEXITIES OF SELF-FORGIVENESS, A POST SCRIPT:

I offered four reflections on the complexity of forgiveness and was asked by a couple of people who read the series if I would offer some insights on the struggle with self-forgiveness. While this too is a complex topic, I thought I would take this week and next to offer some thoughts on this issue.

An expert on this topic finds that one of four dynamics is often at play in the struggle for self-forgiveness: 1) we have failed at some major life task (e.g., making our marriage work); 2) we have hurt someone and regret it; 3) we have hurt ourselves by the life we've led (e.g., self-destructive behavior like excessive drinking); or 4) we didn't do something we thought we should have, usually seen through the rearview mirror of life (e.g., go to college). These strike me as insightful albeit not exhaustive.

Guilt and shame can exacerbate the difficulty we have forgiving ourselves. Guilt is the feeling I have when I <u>do</u> something wrong (e.g., I took something that didn't belong to me). Shame is the feeling that results from my self-perception of who I <u>am</u> (e.g., I'm a bad person because of what I did). It is fairly common that we grow up as children in an environment where we are made to feel guilty for what we did or shameful because of who we have been told we are. I've done my share of misdeeds as a child and got rightfully punished for them. Restriction to my room usually did the job in making me feel guilty for what I did. I've also been shamed by others who thought that attacking my identity (a bad boy) would change me or at least put me in my place. If we don't mature in how we process guilt and shame as we grow or if the tapes of our childhood continue to play in our psyche, we can remain stuck in a child's worldview of guilt and shame which can make self-forgiveness difficult.

Feeling worthy of love is critical for us. We all commit blunders, make bad choices, do bad things, etc. All of us are imperfect. If we get bogged down by these experiences, the feeling that we are unworthy of love can increase and make self-forgiveness difficult. In such cases, it is important to remember that all of us possess an inherent dignity that can never be revoked by our sins and imperfections because it is given to us for eternity by God.

Some may have done something quite terrible and believe they cannot be forgiven. For the Christian, believing in what Jesus Christ accomplished for us on the cross is an important antidote. He suffered death to overcome <u>anything</u> we might have done that is sinful. There is no sin too terrible that is beyond the embrace of his death and resurrection and made available to us in baptism and the sacrament of reconciliation.
