



THE COMPLEXITIES OF SELF-FORGIVENESS, POSTSCRIPT II:

I recently completed four reflections on the complexity of forgiveness and was asked by a couple of people who read the series if I would offer some insights on the challenges with self-forgiveness. This too is a complex topic but I offer a second postscript to conclude my two-part reflection on this topic and the series.

Last week I noted the top four contexts which often trigger a struggle with self-forgiveness, how guilt, shame, and feeling unworthy of love can factor into this struggle, and the importance of believing what Jesus Christ accomplished for us and makes available to us on the cross. Below are some additional dynamics that can make self-forgiveness challenging.

Some people feel that the fact they repeatedly need to forgive themselves disincentivizes them from actually forgiving themselves. They know they'll be back in the place where forgiveness and self-forgiveness is required and think, "What's the point?" This can especially be the case if they're perfectionistic and/or dealing with an addiction or compulsion. Remember: no one is perfect except Jesus. Addictions/compulsions can be remediated with the help of others. No one is stuck permanently in them.

Some people can actually become paralyzed by their misdeeds, blunders, and bad choices. They conclude that their actions define who they really are. As a result, they get stuck in the past and cannot move forward. This leads to a real struggle to forgive themselves because they're stuck in the past and misunderstand who they really are, a son or daughter of a merciful and all-loving God, something that can never be lost. It's important to know or remember that we are all worthy of good things in the future and that the past never freezes us in the past unless we allow it to. This calls for us to let the past go and to stop beating ourselves up about it.

Sometimes I hear people confess past sins that have already been forgiven by God in the Sacrament of Reconciliation (i.e., Confession). Remember that when you confess your sins, God forgives you and never gives it a second thought. Now there is residual damage at the human level that remains after receiving absolution, what we call the temporal dimension. The penance we receive from a priest in this sacrament is meant to address that damage. Sometimes the penance is to go to someone we have offended and apologize, offer restitution, etc. Sometimes the penance is substitutionary (e.g., perform an act of charity in lieu of selfish behavior that led to a sin being confessed). Once we have completed our penance, the sin(s) associated with the penance is/ are dealt with at the temporal level. Knowing that God forgives and moves on with us and that our penance repairs the damage our actions have caused another can make self-forgiveness easier.
