Pentecost Sunday



The Church Library: Last weekend's announcement that the parish library would be closing has generated several comments, some inferring startling motives. I would like to explain how this decision was made and offer some suggestions for processing a response to a situation that one finds initially upsetting.

The library opened 16 years ago from books donated by parishioners. Today the collection is about 2000 books. Between 2018-2023, less than 50 books were checked out of the library according to our records. We do not know how many books were borrowed during that time without being checked out but it was likely few in number as well. In Summer 2022, our I.T. administrator attempted to update the library desktop which had stopped working. He discovered that the link to the online system was corrupted and the software no longer worked and could not be repaired. An investigation began to see if the online library catalogue used by TFS might be able to accommodate our parish library holdings. We learned that this was not possible and that any new software would require the entire collection to be manually re-entered into a database. We were unable to find an online library system that fit our budget, especially when measured against the low volume of books being borrowed.

An experiment was undertaken to see if generating interest in the library might increase the number of books being checked out. Between September-December 2022 and intermittently between January-May, 2023, books in a library cart were placed in the Stewardship Center and announcements were made in the bulletin and from the pulpit inviting people to visit the cart. 14 books were borrowed.

After analyzing the merits of the ongoing expense to electronically maintain the library, the upgrades required to purchase and maintain the system, and the complete re-entering of our holdings into a new system in comparison to the number of books actually borrowed, and taking into account how commonplace it is now for people to read material online, including books, I made the decision to close the library and invited parishioners to take books from the library over several weeks so that books they may find valuable could be claimed.

I am a voracious reader and a lover of books and still a professor of theology at The Catholic University of America who directs doctoral dissertations that require extensive use of written resources. With few exceptions, their bibliographies are sourced to URLs or DOIs or are downloaded electronically from a library database that provides digitalized books. I cherish a library but know the reading world has changed dramatically in the past 10 years.

There will be occasions when I make a decision for change that parishioners will disagree with. I respectfully ask that should you find yourself in this situation that you presume a decision was made after serious consideration of the facts and the attachments parishioners have to something that might change, and that a charitable inquiry and response to me or staff is more in keeping with our values than accusations of darker motivations. I am not a perfect pastor as I noted in my inaugural homily in September 2020, but believe I have proven myself to be someone who works from the best of intentions and interests of our community. I won't always bat a thousand, but do take careful consideration of as much data and pastoral impact as I can assess when making a decision that will impact our community.
