Transitions: Fr. Alex will leave for Holy Family Catholic Church in Elizabeth City on Tuesday. We are grateful for his generous service to our community. I am particularly grateful to him for his care for those in need of anointing, especially on Sundays and Mondays when we cover Rex Hospital. If you haven't had an opportunity to leave a personal message for him, you may do so in the books that are on the large table in the

Fr. James Singarayar, HGN, has arrived and may be visible at several of our weekend and daily Masses. Please welcome him should you see him. We will have more information about him to share with you in the near future.

As we send Fr. Alex forth on Tuesday and welcome Fr. James as our new parochial vicar, the transition has caused some parishioners to feel a bit unsettled about the recurring priest turnover at St. Francis. I wish to assure you there is nothing wrong with our community in relation to these transitions. A major factor contributing to this dynamic is a declining number of available priests, something made more dramatic in a diocese that is growing. Bishop Luís has responsibility to staff every parish of the diocese with a priest, be it a diocesan or religious order priest. We have barely enough priests to cover all our parishes so he has to move priests, especially parochial vicars, in order to keep all parishes staffed. This is our new normal. Fr. Jairo was sent here to be prepared to become a pastor and Fr. Alex was sent here to transition back to being a pastor. Both were determined ready to become pastors when openings needed to be filled, hence their transfers.

Some people also seem unclear about Fr. Jim's presence in the parish now that the Franciscans have given the parish back to the diocese. Fr. Jim was a full-time parochial vicar when he came in 2017 but eventually was hired for a part-time assignment as diocesan director of worship in 2018, a position he applied for in light of his doctorate in sacramental theology, while remaining parochial vicar. When the Franciscans withdrew in 2020, Fr. Jim's part-time ministry was expanded to a full-time one, something needed for a diocese our size. Fr. Jim's status in the parish is priest-in-residence. He resides in the rectory and participates in parish life when his schedule permits. He also is involved with ministry with his Franciscan province that takes him away from the parish. The combination of all this leaves him a bit limited in how much he is able to serve the parish. We are always grateful when he is able to provide priestly ministry at St. Francis, but it will not be regular in light of his other commitments.

This serves as a reminder that we need to pray for more men to step forward to serve as priests, especially for our diocese and from our diocese and parish.
