## August 27 2023 Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time



#### SOME THOUGHTS ON THE COMMEMORATION OF ST. PHOEBE:

The role of women in the Church is indispensable and, as we see in the New Testament, has been from the beginning. It is hard to imagine what any parish or chancery would be like without women serving in significant roles of leadership and ministry, both as employees and volunteer ministers.

Since the 1970's, the official role of women in the Church has greatly expanded. Some examples would be: lectors, eucharistic ministers, communion ministers to the sick/shut-ins, lay ecclesial ministers, parish administrators, pastoral associates, diocesan chancellors, and heads of Vatican departments. The upcoming Synod in Rome will include women as full voting members for the first time in history.

Among the topics the Synod will address is the possibility of opening the diaconate to women. The syntheses of most of the Continental Assemblies and several Episcopal Conferences who submitted their findings gathered from the massive number of listening sessions across the world to Rome last summer recommended the question of women's inclusion in the diaconate as a matter to be discussed. Indeed, it is listed as an agenda item the Synod delegates will discuss and discern when they meet this October and into 2024.

It is important to know that major changes in our understanding of the diaconate occurred at Vatican II (1962-1965). The Council requested that the diaconate be restored as a distinct order of the Church as it was centuries ago, no longer limited only to men on their way to the priesthood. Pope Paul VI implemented this request. By restoring this order with its own status, it opened the door to men, most of them married, as a permanent state of life. With more information emerging about what appears to be evidence of women being ordained to the diaconate in the first millennium of the Church, the growing pastoral need for more ordained ministers in many places in the world, and the heightened sensitivity in societies where women are seen as equals to men, the question of this order being restored to women has become a timely topic for discussion.

St. Phoebe, mentioned by St. Paul in his Letter to the Romans (16:1) as a deacon (Greek: diakonon) and the only person named so in the New Testament, male or female, is considered the patron of the significant role women play in the life of the Church and a role model of diaconal ministry by women for the first 11 centuries of the Church. We commemorate her on the day set aside on the Church calendar to remember her, September 3, and ask her to intercede for the Church, especially during the Synod, as we continue to discern the vital role of women in the Church.

We will hear more next weekend about St. Phoebe and the encouragement the upcoming Synod has generated for those who seek a fuller participation in the life of the Church that a women's diaconate symbolizes. The outcome of the Synod on this issue remains unknown and ultimately rests with the Pope, but the fact this issue will be discussed is indeed a fascinating development.
