Why the Mass Is Such a Big Deal in the Catholic Church: A Series of Homilies on the Mass: Everyone has a spirituality, even people who don't believe in God or religion. Two examples: Franciscan spirituality is lived out by people who admire and want to follow the example and teachings of St. Francis of Assisi and his experiences of God and life. New Age spirituality,

described as reaching one's full potential through an eclectic mixture of concepts and practices drawn from Eastern mysticism, Hinduism, Buddhism, metaphysics, naturalism, astrology, occultism, and science fiction, is lived out by people who prefer determining their own pathway in life outside of belief in divinity and/or organized religion.

For Catholic Christians, the Mass is a significant way in which we live out spirituality, called liturgical spirituality. This spirituality offers us a way of looking at all of creation, at all the events of our lives, and at all of humanity through the lens of Jesus' passion, death, and resurrection, the central belief of our Christian faith. It is meant to impact how one prays, reflects, and acts each day. Two major challenges to this spirituality is understanding 1) how the celebration of the Mass puts us in contact with the presence of God revealed in Christ and 2) how it orients us in the ways we relate to one another and to all of creation now graced by Christ.

Our relationship with God, Jesus Christ, the Holy Spirit, all people who share this world with us, indeed, all of creation are of paramount importance. The Mass, an expression of liturgical spirituality, is considered the center of Catholic life because it helps and orients us in all these relationships. To help our faith family at St. Francis understand this better, I will be offering a four-part series on the Mass at every weekend Mass beginning the weekend of September 23-24.

Here is the schedule and where the homily will occur:

September 23-24: Introductory Rites of the Mass

-Homily: Immediately after we make the opening Sign of the Cross

September 30-October 1: Liturgy of the Word

-Homily: Immediately before the first Scripture reading

October 7-8: No presentation as I will away this weekend

October 14-15: Preparation of the Altar and Eucharistic Prayer

-Homily: Immediately after the Prayers of the Faithful

October 21-22: Communion Rite and Concluding Rites

-Homily: Immediately before the Lord's Prayer

If you are away from the parish on one of these weekends, you will be able to view the archived homily on our website. I look forward to offering these presentations.
