October 1, 2023 Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time



Reintroduction of Communion from the Cup: This weekend we will reintroduce the reception of the Blood of Christ at all Masses. We will start slowly at first as we don't know how many people will return to this practice and we don't want to have a large quantity of the Precious Blood remaining once Communion concludes. We will adjust this quantity slowly over the

coming weeks as we determine how much wine we need to consecrate at each Mass.

You will see the cups in a different location than previously. The wine will still be consecrated during the Eucharistic Prayer even though the cups are not directly on the altar. I witnessed this at St. Peter's Basilica once where some 50,000+ people were receiving Holy Communion at an outdoor Mass. Most of the ciboria containing the hosts to be consumed were on a side table several feet away from the altar during the Eucharistic Prayer.

Intinction: We have received a few inquiries about the possibility of communicants receiving the host and then dipping it themselves into the cup with the consecrated wine rather than drinking from the cup. This action is called intinction. It is permitted, although not encouraged, in the Catholic Church provided that the <u>eucharistic minister</u> is dipping the host into the cup and then placing it on the tongue of the communicant. There are a couple of reasons why this practice is not encouraged.

First, we take seriously Jesus' words at the Last Supper wherein he offered bread as his Body and the cup containing his Blood as distinct actions. Here are the words from the Gospel the priests says at the institution narrative: "He took bread, and giving thanks, broke it, and <u>gave</u> it to his disciples, saying:" and then "In a similar way, when supper was ended, he took the chalice, and once more giving thanks, he <u>gave</u> it to his disciples, saying," These are two distinct actions. Our focus remains to this day on the fullness of the ritual symbol, which is not just fulfilled in the parish offering communion under both kinds, but also through the actions of eating and drinking as two distinct ritual actions.

There are also practical considerations to intinction. In the Catholic and Orthodox traditions, intinction is always done by the ones serving Communion, not the communicants. When intinction is used, the communion minister takes the host, dips it into the chalice, and says to the communicant: "The Body and Blood of Christ," at which point the minister places the moistened host into the mouth of the communicant. To avoid the problem of accidental spillage of the Blood of Christ, the Church asks that someone hold a communion plate beneath the chin of the communicant to prevent an accident from occurring. Doing all of this is impractical for a church our size.

Dipping hosts into the cup prevents those who have a gluten intolerance from receiving the Blood of Christ because of wheat contamination from the host.

Receiving from the cup has never been shown to cause the spread of a virus when it is properly handled by the ministers. Receiving from the cup also remains optional. Thanks for your understanding and patience as we resume Communion under Both Kinds.
