BIG CHANGES FOR THE FRIARS OF HOLY NAME PROVINCE:

Our beloved Franciscans who staffed St. Francis for 33 years are beginning a new and exciting chapter in their history in the U.S. I've asked Fr. Jim Sabak to fill us in. Below are his comments.

As some parishioners may know, Holy Name Province of the Franciscan Friars is one of seven provinces or regional groups of the Order of Friars Minor (O.F.M.) in the United States. In the early 2000s, our then Minister General (global leader), José Rodríguez Carballo, OFM, asked the ministers provincial (regional leaders) of these seven provinces to unite into one province of the United States. Fr. José presented this request as a way for the American friars to consider in new ways the Franciscan mission in a United States that was undergoing some important transitions politically, socially, and culturally. This was a request, not an order, because Franciscan governance is more localized than centralized. Six of the provinces agreed to accept this request and moved forward to consolidate and adapt to a single large province of the United States.

After almost 18 years of preparation and planning, the "U.S. 6," as they came to be known, the Provinces of Holy Name, Saint Barbara, Assumption, Sacred Heart, Our Lady of Guadalupe, and Saint John the Baptist, will gather in Kansas City the week of October 16-20. On October 17, these provinces will cease to be independent Franciscan provinces in the United States and will become the Province of Our Lady of Guadalupe of the Americas. The headquarters of this new province will be in Atlanta, Georgia. As is the procedure when new provinces are established around the world, the initial governance for Guadalupe Province will be appointed by Rome, and after three years of transitioning to the new provincial statutes, we will elect our own governance in 2026.

The last creation of a new province in the U.S. was in 1985, but the oldest of provinces goes back to 1870. Although the Spanish missions in California are much older, they do not count in the same way as they were established under Spanish rule in California. The new province will reimagine and reevaluate "what we have done, and what we have failed to do" as Franciscans in the United States. It is a time of creative assessment and possibility with more voices and people at the table charged with envisioning a more vibrant and energetic presence of the sons of Saint Francis in many aspects of American society and culture. As a parish that has experienced the presence of the Franciscan friars, we request your prayers and hopes that this union will foster and further our work and ministry.
