Mass Things, Part II: Over the past few months, there have been some comments made to staff and occasionally to me about aspects of Sunday Masses that have been difficult for some to adjust to. They revolve primarily around revised Mass times and the "extras" that occur during Mass. Last week I reviewed again why Mass times were adjusted. This week I will

address the reason for the "extras" at weekend Masses.

Prior to Vatican II (1962-1965), when a baby was baptized or someone came into the Church, it was done privately. Since then, the Church has asked that these rites be celebrated publicly with a congregation as a sign of welcome and support. In the previous fiscal year that ended on June 30, 167 infants and small children were baptized at St. Francis. 16 adults were also baptized and 10 adults baptized in other Christian traditions were received into Full Communion with the Catholic Church. That's almost 200 people who became members of our Church!

To accommodate the large number of infants and small children being baptized, we celebrate baptisms twice each month except during Lent, once on a Sunday afternoon and once at a weekend Mass. We rotate the weekend Mass schedule around the Saturday Vigil Mass at 5:30pm and the Sunday morning Masses at 9:00am and 11:45am. This means that at four Masses each year, children will be baptized at one of these Mass times. Parents have the right to decide whether they prefer their children to be baptized at Mass or at a monthly communal service on Sunday afternoon.

The RCIA also involves public rituals and is more complex as it involves the unbaptized, baptized non-Catholics, and baptized Catholics who are completing their sacraments of initiation. They may be adults or older children. Several rituals mark their progress towards the initiation sacraments and are public rites of the Church. As such, they are normally celebrated during Mass. These rites serve as milestones for them and are important threshold rites. Celebrating them in the midst of our community is very important for them as it marks their progress and shows the support of our community for what they are doing. They are important for us as a sign that we are attracting new members to our faith and because they sometimes motivate someone at that Mass to consider taking a step forward to pursue the RCIA for themselves.

We dismiss our youngest children at the 9am Sunday Mass when faith formation is not scheduled during the school year so they may have a meaningful experience with the Word of God appropriate to their age. We also dismiss those in the RCIA who are not yet eligible to receive the Holy Eucharist with us at the same Mass most Sundays of the year so they too may continue their formation around the scriptures and homily they just heard with us.

Mass is important to all of us and I realize there are many other factors in our collective lives that make adding these "extras" challenging. I ask you to consider how what we are doing is for the good of our children, youth, and adults and the importance of their witness to us and our witness to them. There are many places in the U.S. where parishes are dying because no newcomers are joining. I can't help but think how blessed we are that nearly 200 newcomers became Catholics at St. Francis in the previous fiscal year.
