Thirty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time



Synod Update: Round One Concludes: On October 28, the first of two month-long meetings of the Synod on Synodality concluded in Rome. The next and final gathering will be in October 2024. It is worth noting the purpose of this synod as it has had a tendency to get buried among the various hopes, dreams, and fears of various groups, especially in the west

where we are so accustomed to linear thinking, goals, objectives, and expected outcomes. The topic is to examine and practice what it means for the Church to be synodal. It's more about a process than an outcome, much less a meeting to fix the problems of the Church. This is not to say that there will not be some recommendations made to the Pope at the end of October 2024. But these will be the result of having practiced being synodal which is the priority.

In Pope Francis' mind, being synodal means practicing a form of collegiality that involves the entire Body of Christ and not just the bishops. Indeed, the very makeup of the 364 voting delegates from around the world is meant to incarnate this collegiality by involving bishops, priests, a permanent deacon, women religious, lay women and lay men. This has never been done before but reflects the teaching of Vatican II wherein, by a vote of 2151 to 5 by the world's Catholic bishops, the Church made an epochal shift from seeing itself as an institution governed exclusively by papal primacy to one governed by collegiality, initially among the bishops in union with the Pope to collegiality by bishops **AND** the people of God in union with the Pope. While I don't have a crystal ball to see the future, it would not surprise me if this expansion in the collegial process becomes the new norm. In and of itself, this will be a significant advancement in the life of the Church even if this becomes the only tangible outcome of this synod. It will be very, very difficult to put this genie back in the bottle.

The document produced and agreed upon by at least 2/3 of the voting delegates, a requirement for everything that appeared in the final version of it, is understandably generic at this point. But there are some topics that will definitely be explored in greater depth over the next 11 months and brought back for deeper discussion in 2024. Some of them include: 1) that pastoral leadership by women in the Church in all areas be greatly expanded, including the possible ordination to the permanent diaconate; 2) that better structures be developed to address and remediate the ongoing global crisis of clergy sexual abuse; 3) that addressing climate change become normative within the Church; and 4) that the ongoing problem of racism, especially within the Church, be addressed. Many other topics were noted in the document but were less specific in what the delegates might recommend to the Pope for further action. This is not to say that these issues will fall off the radar. It simply indicates that the process of synodality by a global body, with far ranging concerns and understandings of issues, will require more time for an agreeable synthesis to emerge.

There will be much internal work done over the next 11 months by theologians and the delegates themselves to further refine the impulse of the Holy Spirit that was present in the October gathering. We will continue to pray the Synod Prayer each weekend as our way of participating in the process and will be looking into the creation of some small groups to reflect on the Phase One document and practice synodality ourselves. More on the latter point as things become organized. -Fr. Michael
