First Sunday of Advent



OF ADVENT AND NATIVITY SCENES: Advent begins this weekend, a season in which we ponder the importance of the Lord's continual coming into our lives and our world, both of which may seem difficult to perceive as we survey the many conflicts around us and within so many today. Remember that we have been in this place many, many times over the 2000

years of Christianity. This is the shortest of Advent seasons (three weeks) because of the way the liturgical calendar works. We focus in the first days of this liturgical season on the Second Coming of Christ and, as the season prepares us for the celebration of Christmas, the importance of the Lord's first coming as an infant in Bethlehem.

But there is also a third coming of the Lord, the one that occurs each day of our lives. I encourage each household of the parish to make time each day to pray with the Word of God, especially the scriptures given to us by the Church for each day of Advent in the lectionary, to spend some time in prayerful reflection, and to make a larger place available in your hearts for the Lord who is always waiting at your door to enter. There are many spiritual resources available on the web to assist you on this journey.

One of the common sights this month is the nativity scene. Most will be in our homes but some will be outdoors. This year marks the 800th anniversary of the first living Nativity, introduced by our patron saint, Francis of Assisi, in Greccio Italy. We will honor this anniversary with our own living Nativity on Friday, December 15, 6:30pm. Many have been planning for this special event and I invite you to come for this celebration and, if possible, also participate in one of our 11 nativity scenes that will be visited as we walk step by step through the story of the birth of Jesus. We could use lots of people to help us celebrate by taking on one of the characters at one of these 11 stops. If you'd like to volunteer, please see someone after Mass in the Stewardship Center to sign up. In addition, Fr. Jim will offer a presentation on this historic event and what it means for us today between 10:15-11:15am this Sunday in Fellowship Hall. You may sign up there as well. Refreshments will be served.
