The Epiphany of the Lord



DIOCESE BEGINS CENTENNIAL YEAR: On December 12, 1924, the Diocese of Raleigh was established. It covered the entire state and numbered only 6000 Catholics. Today, we number over 500,000 Catholics in the eastern 54 counties of the state. Charlotte was established in the western half of the state as a diocese in 1972 and has a comparable

number of Catholics. We've come a LONG way since 1924!

We will celebrate our centennial year in several ways, culminating with a Mass on Friday, November 8, at the Cathedral. This month begins with a diocesan-wide spiritual focus on the source and summit of our Christian life, the Eucharist. Bishop Luís has asked all pastors to receive a monstrance that is traveling throughout the diocese this year and to invite people to come and spend some time before the Blessed Sacrament in prayer and adoration. "Monstrance" is the name of the vessel in which a consecrated host is placed that can be viewed by people during a period of time that is called "Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament."

The diocesan monstrance will be at St. Francis on Friday, January 12. We will begin the day with Mass in the church at 9am followed by Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament at the end of the Mass until 6:30pm. At that time, we will celebrate Benediction, a liturgy in which the priest will bless all present with the Blessed Sacrament. We will have short prayer services throughout the day while people are gathered in the church in prayer before the Holy Eucharist. The children in our schools will come for a visit during the day.

Because of the reverence due the Blessed Sacrament, we need to have someone in the church at all times while the Holy Eucharist is in exposition. There will be a sign-up in the Stewardship Center this weekend where you may sign up for a 30-minute slot. I hope many of you will sign up or at least stop by for a visit.

Parishes are doing a variety of things during the time they have the Holy Eucharist in exposition that reflects their values, customs, and needs. Given our strong emphasis on justice and peace issues at St. Francis, I ask all who will come to use the time to pray for peace in our world, especially for the ongoing conflicts in Gaza, Israel, Sudan, and Ukraine. You may also use this time to pray for any number of personal concerns you may have as well as simply be present with Jesus Christ who is with us body, blood, soul, and divinity in the Eucharist and enjoy the graces he wishes to impart to you.
