Second Sunday in Ordinary Time



Living the Interrelationship of the Three Priesthoods in the Catholic Tradition at St. Francis: Last Monday we officially concluded the liturgical season of Christmas with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. I'm always disappointed when the way the calendar falls results in this feast being moved off a weekend. When this occurs, it removes a wonderful opportu-

nity to explore the importance and meaning of our baptism, a sacrament that can often be left unpacked for its profound importance and meaning as we move through the life and the other sacraments. Allow me to share one thought with you this weekend.

There was a radical shift at Vatican II (1962-1965) in the way we understand how we exist and are to function as a Church that still has a long way to go. It is tied to baptism. Allow me to illustrate one primary insight around this. If we heard the word 'priest' in 1960, we would have thought immediately of an ordained priest, someone like me. Vatican II retrieved a much broader understanding of priesthood from the early centuries of the Church so that now we are taught explicitly to understand the word 'priest' in three ways and in this order of priority: Christ the high priest from whom all other priesthoods flow, the priesthood received by all at baptism, and the ordained priesthood. This teaching, not breaking new doctrinal ground but refocusing the Church on our fullest understanding of priesthood, has been, at best, haphazard in its reception over the past 60 years. Where it has been embraced and incarnated, a beautiful interrelationship of baptismal and ordained priesthoods built on Christ himself has resulted in flourishing communities of servant-disciples who embrace the call to witness the Good News of God to others through evangelization and work together in promoting the Reign of God through the ministry of justice and service to others in our world.

A committee representing the diversity of our parish has been convened to update our pastoral plan, last updated several years ago. Details will slowly begin to emerge soon, but one of the joys I am experiencing as I watch this process unfold after a lot of meetings, listening to one another, and the vast amount of information gathered from a variety of conversations that occurred leading up to the initiation of this process, is how these three understandings of priesthood are front and center of everything being discussed without being expressly articulated around these three understandings of priesthood by anyone. It has been a marvelous unfolding that gives me such pride in who we are as a community of faith and hope for our life as a community over the next five years when the plan will serve as a reference for all we are and do.


A Dragon's Tale






Team Rosa Get-Together
