AN EMERGING COMMUNICATIONS PLAN FOR ST. FRANCIS:

There has been much discussion around the parish over the past 18 months about how best

to communicate in effective ways with our seven generations of parishioners as well as those who might be searching for a faith community or simply wishing to know more about us. In all honesty, this is an enormously wide range of people with enormously diverse ways of communicating.

Dr. Tom Byrnes, a parishioner and professor at NCSU, approached us last summer with an offer to use some student interns to examine our communication methods and determine engagement levels with our current and new parishioners. Between August-December, these interns did the following:

- Research best communication practices
 of various faith communities
- Conduct 4 parishioner focus groups to receive input on a draft survey
- Conduct a survey of parishioners via email/paper in November
- Make recommendations to the staff and our Communications Committee

The ±800 responses to the November survey were reviewed by the NCSU interns and shared with a staff liaison team in December. The most significant statistics gleaned from the survey data were:

- Most respondents were ages 65+; very few were between ages 18-35
- 76% of respondents rated the electronic bulletin to be satisfactory or better
- The respondents preferred communication methods were the electronic bulletin (54%), the website (12%), and parish emails sent via Constant Contact (12%).
- The respondents preferred bulletin format was digital (74%)
- Highest requests for improvements were more diverse digital content (photos, graphics, volunteer opportunities) and stories about our parish ministries.

There were several takeaways from the collected data:

- Form a multigenerational communications committee of experts in the fields of graphic design, communications, marketing, and writing to develop a parish communication strategy in collaboration with staff
- Use the expertise of this committee to reach the 18-35 age group so the data are more inclusive of the entire community
- Examine each parish communication method/ platform and recommend strategies to reach our multigenerational community more effectively.

Some recommendations to the survey data were discerned to be immediately implementable. The following actions have taken place:

- Expand the bulletin to 4 pages to include photos, ministry highlights, volunteer opportunities, and stories.
- Establish a monthly "Get Connected" Sunday to help people learn how to use various electronic platforms (e.g., Realm, St. Francis Serves) while on campus
- Distribute a monthly "Get Connected" notice to all parishioners with upcoming volunteer opportunities in both digital and print format
- Make minor adjustments to the parish social media accounts
- Merge the blogs on St. Francis Serves and the website to improve accessibility to ministry stories
- Create short instructional videos and place them on the website on how to use Realm and St. Francis Serves
- Add an "All Ministries" list to the drop down menu on the website Ministries tab

This is just the beginning of our efforts to improve communications with our widely diverse faith community and those who look us up on the internet. The Communications Committee will continue to develop and refine our efforts to make who we are and what we do as relevant and accessible as possible.

Thank you to everyone who responded to the survey and supported this intern project. Your input is greatly appreciated.




