February 18, 2024 First Sunday of Lent



GETTING LENT RIGHT: There are many ways to view Lent and to live it. Little children learn to give something up like candy or a favorite TV show or video game as a form of sacrifice. Teens may view it as a time to show a deeper commitment to Christ by doing a service project that helps the poor. Adults may see this time as an opportunity to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation. All

of these are great. There is also something, or more particularly, someone that is central to the entire season: a deeper appreciation and appropriation of the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ (what we call "the Paschal Mystery" in Catholic language) and what that means for us and our world.

I read a reflection on this that was a timely reminder of the centrality of Jesus' paschal mystery. The author, a Jesuit priest, really brought home how important it is to ponder the cross as part of the Lenten journey. What follows is a blending of his insights and my own.

Crucifixion was the most horrifying form of execution by the Romans in its time, so horrible that the Romans forbade it as a form of execution for their own citizens. It was only permitted for revolutionaries, bandits, murderers, and slaves. They carried out crucifixions in highly visible places, near cities or along busy highways, as a powerful form of intimidation.

Jesus certainly passed by these dying criminals (and their corpses) during his journeys. It is easy to imagine him looking at the condemned and thinking, "That will be me someday." His ministry had already attracted controversy. He was increasingly identified and proclaimed as the God-anointed liberator of Israel, a mistaken impression but one that made sense in a pre-resurrection world. Jesus would be perceived by the Roman and Jewish authorities as a revolutionary and he likely knew what the outcome of that would mean: crucifixion. And yet, Jesus continues to follow the path laid out for him by his Father because the salvation of humanity was at stake. He was a revolutionary, a liberator, because of the incredible change he would bring to the world, just not in the political sense. The change he would bring is centered in the heart, the mind, and the way we care for one another.

Despite the deadly implications of remaining faithful to the will of his Father, Jesus would not give up his mission under any circumstance because proclaiming God's love for the entire human family was the purpose of his presence in the world. He trusted God's love to such a degree that he was confident that even death could not stop his mission. This is a critical insight in understanding Lent for us and our world. It is also a mission we are called to take up as his disciples.

Taking up the cross as Jesus did and in the context of Jesus' mission requires a singlemindedness that most of us find quite intimidating. So we start with the smaller ways of taking up the cross to gradually strengthen us to take up the cross in larger ways. Lent invites us to be intentional about "taking up our cross" so we may also become agents of resurrection, not only for the good of others, but also for ourselves.


