#### THE CHALLENGING DILEMMA OF WEEKEND VISITORS IN NEED:

reputation of caring for those who live on the margins. Our Justice and Peace Office and

the hundreds of parishioners involved in their ministry do an outstanding job of keeping us invested in this world and rightfully so. We are also blessed to have a St. Vincent de Paul Society chapter on our campus. They work with those in need and are especially trained to help others get stabilized so they can move out of their crisis into a better way of life. We have Curbside Ministry, an outreach group that prepares small care packages that are available for any parishioner to take and share with those we meet on street corners. These ministries, and others, are beneficiaries of our tithe (10%) we take from our offertory.

We occasionally have visitors on our campus. especially when we are gathered for worship on the weekend, who make a direct appeal to us for money, usually when people are headed to their cars after Mass or are in the queue to exit the campus onto roads leading away from the parish. There has been an uptick in these visitors over the past few weeks.

The Franciscan friars, in conjunction with our Justice and Peace Office, established a policy several years ago that we decline requests for money, gift cards, etc. to those who come onto our campus asking for such things on the weekend. When I arrived in 2020, I was asked about this policy and it seemed one worth retaining.

We are always happy to help someone when there is a legitimate need. When I encounter such a visitor, I ask them to return to our campus or call us during the week and we will do what we can to assist them but then ask them to leave the campus. Our Justice and Peace Office staff are ready to assist those who contact us and our St. Vincent de Paul chapter is also ready to assist whenever possible.

Our community has an enviable If you are approached by those in need when you are on our campus, I ask you to be polite, let them know we stand ready to help, decline their requests for financial assistance, and invite them to return to our campus or call us on Monday so someone may actually assist

> By giving them money, you may unintentionally create a bigger issue for us. Sadly, some of our visitors are not what they seem but are professionals who earn their income by soliciting money directly from passersby or are con artists. They play on our sympathy as good people who want to help others in need. Some endanger themselves and you by standing along the driveways leading off campus and going from car to car.

> We have the presence of law enforcement on most Sunday mornings. I have asked them to approach our visitors and ask them to return or call during the week so we may actually assist them.

> I realize this may seem unkind to some and not in keeping with the Gospel. If you hold this position, I remind you that we do a robust job of helping those in need, probably the best among congregations in our area. I also want to avoid a situation where someone may be hurt, either a visitor or a parishioner, because of unknown dynamics that are always in play in these types of encounters.
