Third Sunday of Lent



WHAT IS A SCRUTINY RITE? Our community is blessed to have had over 70 adults and children involved in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (R.C.I.A.) over the past 12 months. This is a formation process for those who are 1) unbaptized, 2) baptized in another Christian tradition and seeking full communion with the Catholic Church, or 3) baptized Catholics who are seeking to complete the sacraments of initiation (i.e., Confirmation and/or Eucharist). We presently have

six children in elementary and middle school who will soon be ready to be baptized, confirmed, and receive the Holy Eucharist. They are called the "elect," having been designated so by our bishop on the First Sunday of Lent at a ritual called the Rite of Election at our cathedral where hundreds joined them in reaching this status on February 18. These six and their parents have been in formation for many months under the excellent direction of Marisa Ferrara, our Coordinator of Elementary Faith Formation, and her team. Four of them will celebrate these sacraments at the Easter Vigil on March 30 and the other two on Pentecost Sunday, May 19.

Since 1972, the R.C.I.A. (a.k.a. the catechumenate) has been the normative way we form children and adults seeking to become members of our Church who are not infants. Prior to this, it was common for those on this journey to participate in instruction classes in our faith tradition and privately celebrate their initiation into the Catholic Church. Vatican II (1962-1965) called for a complete renewal of the sacramental and liturgical life of the Church. Liturgical scholars had been at work for decades prior to the Council learning how the ancient catechumenate might again be a model primarily for the initiation of unbaptized people. This retrieval has had a significant impact on global Catholicism. In some countries like ours, thousands of adults and children will be baptized at the Easter Vigil this year.

The final phase of preparation for those to be baptized occurs during the Lenten season. During this time, they celebrate the Rite of Scrutiny. This rite is celebrated three times as a kind of extended examination of conscience in the midst of a praying community. Each celebration focuses on a different dimension of sin/evil and the grace that awaits the elect in their baptism. As in the ancient Church, these rites are celebrated publicly so our elect may know of the prayerful support of our community as they approach their initiation, and we may also reflect on the reality of sin and the importance of God's grace we too seek during the Lenten season.

The First Scrutiny takes place at the 5:30pm Mass this weekend, the Second Scrutiny at the TFS weekly Mass on Wednesday, March 13 (all six are TFS students), and the Third Scrutiny at the 11:45am Mass on March 17. The Gospels proclaimed in the ancient catechumenate are proclaimed, so the readings of these Masses will be from Year "A," the place in our three-year cycle of Sunday readings where the Gospels associated with this rite are enshrined to this day.

The focus of the three scrutiny rites with their Gospel are as follows. First Scrutiny: the Samaritan woman who encounters Jesus at a well. The focus is on personal sin and the grace of forgiveness. Second Scrutiny: the healing by Jesus of a man born blind. The focus is on social sin, the type of sin we collectively participate in, and the grace of healing. Third Scrutiny: the raising of Lazarus from the dead by Jesus. The focus is on cosmic evil we experience, such as death, and the grace of liberation Jesus provides.

Please pray for our six elect and their families in these coming weeks as they prepare to be initiated into the Catholic Church.
