TOO MANY COOKS DO NOT SPOIL THE STEW:

We celebrated a fantastic Holy Week (Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter Vigil/Easter Sunday) last week. We had great numbers worshiping with us. I'm told that even the parking lot was fairly sane! We had many online visitors who viewed our liturgies via livestream, and several told us how wonderful and

meaningful our celebrations were. One first-time viewer sent us a check for \$1000 in appreciation for what he experienced.

There is an old saying: Too many cooks spoil the stew. This idiom means that when too many people are involved in trying to do the same thing, the final result will not be good. While there may be truth to this idiom, nothing could be further from the truth when it came to the 200+ parishioners and employees who were intensely involved in the preparations for and the celebration of our recent Holy Week. It was precisely because we had 200+ parishioners and employees engaged in a labor of love for the Lord and our community that our metaphorical stew was magnificent. I've never experienced a parish with so many dedicated and competent parishioners and employees working together to create a seamless celebration of Holy Week.

Allow me to provide you with some factoids: Jim Wahl tells me that approximately 26 vocalists and 12 instrumentalists, some of the latter members of the NC Symphony, were involved. Our lectors likewise did yeoman's work in preparing, practicing, and proclaiming the Word of God for us, beginning with Palm Sunday. Video technicians were at their consoles televising and recording our major liturgies. Hospitality ministry, one of the ministries we are best known for, was impressive. Our Mass Coordinators, the people who prepare everything we use during Mass and organize the ministers who will serve, were phenomenal. Their attention to detail was incredible. Our environment team did an outstanding job as always. Theresa and Mark Baumgartner organized the many laborers involved in setting up and taking down, each day of Holy Week, the wide-ranging decorations needed to help us visualize the tone of each day's celebration. Kathy Sales, our new Director of Liturgy, had the overall responsibility of keeping all the balls in the air and did a masterful job for her first Holy Week in her position.

These are the people who had a visible role in the church but there were many others who likewise helped to make for a memorable Holy Week. I tip my hat to the parking lot attendants who were invaluable on Easter Sunday, ensuring the ebb and flow of traffic went as smooth as possible. Logistics doesn't get much attention because it occurs behind the scenes but, in many ways,

Interesting Financial Factoid: : It was brought to our attention that the above chart is a bit confusing to some people. Year-To-Date (YTD) we are currently \$54,257.74 ahead of last year's week 40 YTD total, a Year-to Year (YTY) increase of 1.7%. Our 2024 budget was built upon an Offertory growth assumption of 4.0%. The Projected Shortfall was calculated assuming that we would finish the year no better than the current YTD increase percentage. In order to close the projected shortfall gap, the next 12 weekend collections must consistently exceed their last year counterparts.






