St. Francis Justice and Peace Grant Awards Ceremony





A special thanks to Bill Laxton, 20 year Grant Commitee Chair, and Ann Lassiter, who will be taking over for Bill.

Each year, SFA awards grants to organizations that serve our community that actively apply Catholic Social Teaching and care for God's Creation. These grants are funded by the Justice & Peace Tithe which is 10% of the parish's annual offertory collection and supports our mission to proclaim the reign of God by offering hope to those who hunger for human dignity.

Last Monday, the St. Francis of Assisi Office of Justice and Peace and the J&P Grant Committee hosted this year's grant recipients to share our gratitude for the ways these organizations serve our neighbors through their commitment to the dignity of life and God's creation. The Committee awarded a total of \$78,000 to twenty-seven organizations with grants ranging from \$500 to \$5,000.

Thank you to our community partners for doing God's good work in our community and for the parishioners of SFA that so generously make these grants possible.



Finding A Way Home

Passage Home is a non-profit organization in Wake County that assists youth, individuals, families, and veterans achieve self-sufficiency to break the multi-generational cycle of poverty. They offer housing and support services to include workforce development, specialized support for veterans, and specialized support for children within families experiencing homelessness through the nearly 100 units of affordable housing they own and manage throughout the county. Many people at St. Francis know and support Passage Home, including the families at Franciscan School, which holds a food drive every November to help families at Passage Home. Did you know that St. Francis of Assisi parish had a role in forming this charitable organization?

CEMETERY PROJECT

The project space is sandwiched in the property that is flanked by Crusader Drive to the North & East and then by Price Street on the West & South.



For those who may have interest in in-ground burial or for burial in a mausoleum crypt, which will also be available. FYI – we will also have a section in the cemetery for deceased bishops, priests and deacons, as well as a section for infants and for those most in need who otherwise could not afford a burial spot. Timing to begin construction is next winter (2025-2026), with about a nine-month build. We have been working with both Bryan Lee Funeral Home and Brown Wynn Funeral Home to assist with arrangements and they have both indicated that they could provide storage for a deceased should the individual die prior to completion of the project – as commonly done for a number of months when burials are to take place at Arlington National Cemetery.
