

Dear St. Francis Family:

I write to update you on some upcoming adjustments to our campus in response to the recent changes in national and state guidelines and the rapid spread of the highly contagious Delta variant of the Covid-19 virus.

As you know, we have a Pandemic Task Force comprised of medical doctors, public health officials, staff, etc. who have been guiding us since the pandemic began. The Task Force is keeping abreast of the ever-changing recommendations and guiding me so our protocols reflect this changing environment. After consulting with the Task Force, I am announcing the following effective July 31:

- If you are not vaccinated, I remind you that you are required to wear a
  mask indoors in all public areas of the SFA campus as has been our
  protocol since June 14. This will now include all unvaccinated children
  above the age of 5.
- Beginning this weekend, we strongly encourage all who attend Mass or are attending an indoors meeting on our campus to wear a mask regardless of vaccination status since the vaccinated may spread the virus to others while not experiencing any direct effects of it personally due to their immunity.
- 3. Upcoming events celebrating our regathering as a community have been temporarily postponed. The August 1 and August 15 events after the mid-morning Sunday Mass will occur when it is safe for us to regather and enjoy coffee, donuts, and fellowship together.
- 4. We will shift the 9:30am Mass to 9:00am beginning Sunday, August 15, as previously announced. It will continue to be livestreamed.
- 5. We will temporarily pause restoring the additional 11:45am Mass to our weekend liturgy schedule.
- 6. The 5:30pm Mass on Sunday will remain a mask-mandatory Mass for everyone attending regardless of vaccination status.

My highest priority as your pastor is keeping everyone safe. As we have been reminded by our national, state, and local officials and health organizations, the only way to stop the new surge of cases and ensure the safety of our entire community is to be vaccinated. I urge all unvaccinated parishioners who can be safely vaccinated to consider this and receive the vaccine.

For those who may be hesitant to receive the vaccination because of concern over the use of aborted fetal cell lines, I remind you that the Vatican's Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith and the Doctrine Committee of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops have publicly declared that receiving the Pfizer or Moderna vaccine is morally permissible since aborted fetal cell lines were not used in the development of these vaccines and are not contained in them. These two bodies have also declared that it is in the interest of the common good to be vaccinated.

I extend a special thank you to our Task Force for their dedication and commitment to keep us all safe. I also thank you for your patience and understanding as we continue the journey to the day when we may freely gather at St. Francis unencumbered by masks or the coronavirus.

In last week's Gospel, we heard the story about Jesus feeding thousands with only a small amount of bread and fish. Jesus miraculously provided enough food for the crowd to eat their fill while also having baskets of leftover food. In Monsignor Michael's homily, he spoke of abundance and our willingness to believe that God is one of "addition"; He looks to fill our lives when we trust in Him.

As I thought more about the words 'abundance' and 'addition'. I reflected on the special year ahead for our preschool. This coming school year will be extra excitingl as we look to celebrate the many years in which our preschool has been in existence- 30 years!

Over the last three decades, we have grown from only a couple of classes to eleven for the 2021-2022 school year! Our staff has expanded to almost 30 exceptionally enthusiastic and loving individuals! We have been able to add programs in Spanish, community service, science and music/movement. Within the last 10 years we have opened a before/ after- care program as well as a class for 5-year olds. Our natural playground area in front of our building was created shortly after the Leesville Road expansion was

completed. As I have previously written, through the generosity of our playground families and community partners, we were able to open our fantastic new playground this past Spring. These are just a few examples of how our wonderful preschool has grown in size and shape since it first began under the leadership of Fr. David McBriar and Nancy Bourke back in 1991. There is no doubt that God has provided in abundance for our preschool to foster the developmental and spiritual growth of some of the youngest members of our community!

While several things have changed and grown since those early days, one thing remains constant: the teachers and staff have continued to nurture the curiosity. faith, and compassion of our children. They encourage students to explore the world around them through intentional play-based endeavors that are both teacher-directed and student-inspired. They partner with parents to introduce a life of faith through prayer, service to others, and participation in a spiritual life. By targeting social-emotional skills, our staff help shape our children into becoming compassionate, kind, and generous individuals. Among the ways that they do this so successfully is through activities

to acknowledge others' feelings/ideas, supporting cooperation/sharing, and partaking in simple projects of service both in and outside of our parish. We strive to encourage our children to become good people. Aren't we fortunate that we can emphasize this through the words of the teachers as well as those of our heavenly Father?

Our 30th anniversary committee is hard at work planning for a lot of fun and festive activities throughout the year. We remain hopeful that COVID safety protocols will allow us to implement them. I encourage you to stay tuned to our parish & preschool websites and Facebook pages, as well as to the parish bulletin, for what's coming. God has provided our preschool with much over the years including blessing us with amazingly invested staff, precious children, engaged families, and a supportive church community. We ask for your ongoing prayers of gratitude for all that we have been given in our outstanding preschool as well as prayers of hope for all that we wish to accomplish in the future. We hope that you will be able to join us this year to celebrate our abundant blessings!

This summer has been a welcome respite from the 2020-21 school year, a year of academic, social and emotional challenges for students, parents and educators. As a public high school

counselor, I saw firsthand what accompanied the COVID-19 shutdown and gradual reopening.

Students and their families reported a prevalence of anxiety and depression. At the high school level, we could see wide variations in academic performance and increases in the number of classes failed. Now, the approaching 2021-22 school year offers a good opportunity to keep these principles of Catholic social teaching in mind -- as they apply to any school environment.

- When all of us who can be safely vaccinated do so, and continue to exercise prudence in large gatherings, we exemplify the principles of life and dignity of the human person, the care for God's creation, and the rights and responsibilities of us all.
- Our solidarity with what society refers to as "essential workers" calls us to recognize the dignity and safeguard the health and economic security of each bus driver, custodian, cafeteria worker and clerical office employee as well as teachers and other educators.
- And our involvement in public schools


   as taxpayers, regardless of whether we have children enrolled in the system requires us to think about our call to family and community and to recognize the economic and social challenges placed on our society's poorest and most vulnerable members.

Public schools draw from all segments of our community and do not promote a faith tradition. Still, a key responsibility of a strong public education is the formation of young people who can articulate and exemplify the values that drive them. Those values are likely to be tested this fall as many students enter a school for the first time in a year and a half. 



# A Church of and for the Poor

The book of James is one of the hardest hitting in the New Testament. He is a tell-it-like-it-is apostle, warning the early Church not to show partiality to the rich and powerful. This is always a danger, especially in a Church that relies on donations. While gratitude to donors is understandable and proper, it's easy for gratitude to become preference, partiality, and a different moral standard. James warns the Church against this.

Jesus warns us, too. He talks about inviting the poor to a party rather than those who can repay us. He tells us that

when we give, that the left hand should not know what the right is doing. He warns the rich that the path to heaven is narrow.

Jesus' call to salvation was for all, but his pastoral focus was certainly with the poor. So, he dedicated much of his time reaching out to those who could give nothing in return: the blind, deaf, lame, and lepers. And his attention didn't stop at the materially poor but extended to sinners and those thought to be impure.

This love for the weak was a sign of the Messiah as proclaimed by many prophets, including Isaiah. The Anointed of God would come to vindicate the poor, orphaned, widowed, sick, and oppressed.

Jesus did exactly that, and it was this solicitude and miraculous power that began convincing Galileans, and eventually those in Jerusalem, that he was the long-awaited One. Pope Francis said he longed for a Church of the poor, for the poor. It seems Jesus did, too. +

While gratitude to donors is understandable, it's easy for it to become partiality and a different moral standard.

### A Word from Pope Francis

Remember that story about the poor widow lady...Her husband had committed suicide; he jumped from the bridge into the river. And she wept. She said, "I am a sinner, a poor woman. But my poor husband! He is in hell."...And the Curé of Ars said, "But wait a moment, ma'am, because between the bridge and the river, there is the mercy of God."

# Prearrange My Heart

My mother asked me to go with her to help prearrange her funeral. A little time has passed since she first asked. We haven't gone yet, so I've had some time to think about it. Slogans like, "Save now, rest in peace later," and, "We put them in the ground, no money down," and, "You only get one chance to make a lasting impression" have been running through my mind. You must have a sense of humor about this. I always smile when I see the sign for Burns Funeral Home & Crematory.

I understand that families can be especially vulnerable when they lose a loved one and that the argument in favor of prearrangements is heavily on the side of making important decisions about death and burial well in advance of that emotionally charged experience. It makes sense. The stress of planning will be over; attention can be given to other important details.

It also makes sense that prearrangement can help lock in the price of the burial and all that accompanies it. The idea of a payment plan, not having to pay out a large sum all at once, makes even more sense—and it's easy on the wallet. If death isn't imminent, plans can even be altered, sometimes without incurring any further expense. All good, financially sound ideas.

From a practical perspective, all that I've read makes me think we should do



this. After all, my mom wants to. Why not? But truth be told, I feel a lot of personal resistance. Not because I don't trust the funeral home. Or because I don't feel we'll get a good deal. It's not because I worry about the expense. And it's not because we haven't found the right funeral home.

I realize I'm resisting because I don't want to face the raw, heart-wrenching truth that someday my mom will die, and my brother and sisters and I will have to figure out what life will be like without her. The grace of that moment cannot be paid for in advance, neatly organized or prearranged.

Just thinking about mom's funeral has caused me to rearrange my thinking about death, my emotions, and my relationship with her. I'm thinking about life in a way I had not before. I find myself suddenly tangled up in the stages of loss and grief: denial, anger, bargaining, and all the rest. I wonder how long it takes to get to the singularly, unique experience of acceptance. And when she dies, what then? When death does come, the saving mercy of Jesus, for her and for us, is all that is truly prearranged. +

Considering preparing for a funeral in advance stirs the emotions.


