Keeping the Tiller Steady in Rough Weather

We are facing into some rough weather with the increase of the coronavirus Delta variant that is beginning to seriously impact us just as we were becoming more accustomed to some semblance of normalcy this summer. Adding to the renewed anxiety is the fact that this is happening just as our children are returning to schools. All of this, coupled with other dynamics going on around us, finds us worn out, impatient, and increasingly demoralized. How might we as people of faith handle this?

As an avid believer in the Word of God and the Word Made Flesh, Jesus Christ, it strikes me that this is a time of real testing for us as it was for the people of Israel and the early Christians. As people of faith, it is important that we lean on our faith to help us during this time. For those whose faith is strong, I call upon you to be a source of strength and encouragement to those who are struggling. For those whose faith is weak, it will become important to fortify your faith with prayer, scripture reading, staying connected to people of faith, coming to Mass (either in-person or virtual), and receiving the Eucharist when possible. Don't be afraid to reach out for help. Our Stephen Ministers are available to provide a safe and caring heart and ear to assist you. Those who are looking to go deeper into their spiritual lives may benefit from working with one of our spiritual directors. They may all be reached through our parish website or by calling the office. As your pastoral staff, we all stand ready to walk with you, in person or virtually, to help you weather this rough weather.

I view this time as an opportunity to deepen my own spiritual life and to see how I am being invited by the Lord to use this time to purge things from my life that I really don't need, material, mental, emotional, and even interpersonal, so I can make more room for the Lord whose guidance through the storms of life is always surefooted and true. The Lord has the tiller of our boats, individually and collectively, and will lead us through the rough weather looming on the horizon to a safe harbor. Place your trust in Him and allow Him to hold the tiller.

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Transitions can be challenging. When a staff member who has made great contributions to the life of our community steps away from ministry here, it also causes the winds of anxiety to rise a bit. Last week, Sarah Bowser, who has been the coordinator of our children's faith formation programs (K-5) for the past five years, announced that she was stepping down from her position to take care of her children, the youngest arriving just a couple of months ago. Sarah has provided outstanding ministry to our children and their families. We thank her for her service to us and pray her time raising her children will be a blessing.

Our excellent faith formation team has taken up the challenge to keep faith formation going for our K-5 children and their families until we find a replacement for Sarah. I am most grateful for their generosity. We have now opened this position on various employment portals and hope someone excellent will come forth in the near future. Thanks for keeping this in your prayers.

Beyond Teaching the "Basics"





"Therefore I tell you, whatever you ask for in prayer believe that you have received it, and it will be yours." Mark 11:24

As preschool educators, there are many important jobs that we have in the lives of the children entrusted to us which go beyond teaching the "basics" of learning colors, shapes, and numbers. I have shared many times in the past about the importance of play. I have also written much about the heavy emphasis that we place on developing a child's social-emotional skills to lay the groundwork for academic success in the future. As Catholic educators, we have the privelege and great responsibility to help our children develop a relationship with God as well.

One of the ways that we introduce our preschoolers to a life of faith is through daily prayer. We teach our preschoolers to talk with God through prayer as it is a powerful way to build a lifelong relationship with our Lord. It is crucial that we teach our children that God will always provide for us. The Lord always answers our prayers and never abandons us. Sometimes, however, we don't immediately see His answer or it might appear that He did not give us that for which we asked. It is important for us to remember and share with our children that God, in His infinite wisdom, always understands our needs although, at times, they may not be the same as our wants.

As I prepare for the new preschool year, I try to keep in mind want vs. need. As we ended last school year, I remained hopeful that for the next year, we would be able to loosen COVID restrictions and adjust our protocols to allow for many of the activities and events to return that were cancelled last year. I wanted it to be a year with less restrictions related to mask wearing and social distancing. I wanted our upcoming year to have all of the celebrations and gatherings than we enjoyed before COVID. I wanted there to be no limitations on visitors to our preschool or on the ability to enjoy our annual festivals. At this point, it looks like we might have to temporarily postpone some of those things in order to maintain the highest level of safety for our students as the pandemic continues to linger.

When I think about having to put some things on hold for at least a little longer, I begin to think about how we managed last year without much of what we were used to having. By looking at things through that lens, I actually can put my wants into a bit more perspective. While we weren't able to have a few of our "normal" events/activities, we were still able to provide a loving, safe, and fun environment for our children. We were forced to simplify, re-imagine, and re-schedule, but ultimately, there didn't seem to be any

fewer smiles or enthusiasm amongst our children! Our teachers rallied strong and carried on without a hitch. Our students didn't miss a beat! Although we didn't get to do everything we had wanted during the year, no one felt as though they were lacking. We even found several silver linings along the way. With this perspective, how can I doubt that God was watching over us throughout the year? Even if what we wanted didn't come to fruition we were never without. I daresay we had an abundance of what was most important...joyful, healthy, and laughing children who were supported by wonderful families and their dedicated teachers. Clearly, God's presence was felt every day in our children and those who surrounded them!

Maybe we don't always feel as though the Lord hears our prayers. Maybe we are disappointed when our wants are not filled, but may we use the example of our children to know that God gives us all that we need if we trust in and follow Him!

God's Hands and Feet on Earth



When The Franciscan School opened its doors in 2000, it did so with the foundation of the Franciscan tradition. This tradition is centered around St. Francis of Assisi, who dedicated his life to God and to the service of others, especially those who are marginalized, oppressed, and in need. Father Jim Sabak, O.F.M., shares that from the Franciscan perspective, service is "truly about entering into the life of another person...opening ourselves to one another in vulnerability and trust, then committing ourselves to journeying with each other in the lives we share together."

At TFS today, Catholic Social Teaching is integrated throughout the school year in a variety of outreach projects and intentional service ministries. Joanne Finch, 7th/8th grade Religion teacher, believes, "It is important for students to experience, not just be taught about, what Catholic Social Teaching is all about: human dignity, solidarity, and service." Finch has taught at TFS for the last 16 years in preschool, 2nd grade,

3rd grade, and all middle school grades. But despite her change in classrooms, her passion has consistently remained on giving students an opportunity to put their faith into action. Through all her years, she says, "Given the opportunities to fulfill the call to serve, students learn to give of themselves and then feel the love of God being given back to them."


Finch has particularly been focused on food-insecure ministries. Her students have helped with the Passage Home Food Drives, cut jeans to make shoes with Sole Hope, adopted families during the holidays, and assisted underserved communities in Raleigh. Personally, Finch has been involved with Catholic Parish Outreach (CPO) for the past 9 years and receives great joy when she runs into current or former students at the CPO warehouse.

For the younger grades, service is still at the core of TFS. Opportunities are always hands-on and woven into the classroom and school experience. Julie

Sperrazza is a first grade teacher who has taught at TFS for the last 10 years. She believes that "service connects children to the world around them... it helps them realize that their world is much bigger than the small space of our classroom, but they are not too little to make a difference." With a passion for early literacy, Sperrazza's students have focused on supporting Book Harvest by donating their own books into the hands of children who may not have the means to read books in their homes. Her students have also created kits for homeless families, made no-sew fleece blankets for Project Linus, and supported the NC Pajama Program and Zach's Toy Chest.

Father Jim reiterates that Franciscan service is dedicated to imitating the life of Christ by loving others, breaking down barriers, bringing people together. And at TFS, he says, "This makes service not an exception to all the many things we do in our lives, but reveals it as a constitutive and vital core of all we do."




Michael Watson, Principal





Our neighbor was on active duty with the Army and then a reservist, serving as a surgical technician. She was about to be discharged when she was hurt in an accident. She was already being evicted from a house that didn't have a working HVAC system, but she was given an extra month by the judge to stay due to her injuries. She had been out of work since her accident and did not have the rent for a new, affordable, safe roommate situation she had secured. St. Vincent dePaul was able to help with that rent as she continues to heal and is able to return to work.

In The Martyr, Marc Chagall, a painter in the late last century and one of the favorites of Pope Francis, shows Jesus' crucifixion as a global mystery. It is not just an event in the past. He came down to Moses in the burning bush and in giving the Ten Commandments. And he came down to console and feed Elijah, who was despairing of his life. He gave Elijah food for his journey, strengthening him to travel in the desert.

In the Eucharist, Jesus comes down to you today to carry your burdens and give you his life. He urges us to get up, eat. He is the Living Bread come down from heaven that, if we unite with him in holy Communion, he will give us his divine force and we will live eternally with him. +

The Opposite Reaction

Go and learn the meaning of the words, "I desire mercy, not sacrifice."

Matthew 9:13

Mercy. It's such a familiar word. It bookends every Mass, rolling glibly off our tongues until it's more a catch phrase than a word with real meaning. Really, how much is there to say about God's forgiveness?

When I dug into it, though, I realized my definition was too limited. Mercy isn't just something God gives to us. It's something we're called to give to others. Nor is it just about forgiveness. It's about the attitudes that shape our actions.

Think of that one person who knows all the right buttons to push and does so with glee. You can spend your whole life tied up in knots about how—or whether—to respond. You can waste countless hours and endless emotional energy locked inside your head, having arguments with this person, putting words in her mouth that she never spoke and assuming the worst about her intentions. You might even write off the relationship altogether.

Mercy calls us to do the opposite. Mercy invites us to open our minds and hearts to the people we find most difficult. What influences have shaped them? What wounds are hidden beneath their antagonism? Mercy asks us to consider the things we cannot know and approach conflict with a spirit of



compassion rather than judgment. In short, give people the benefit of the doubt.

This is not easy. In fact, it's superhuman. That's why we need God's help. That's why we need to receive the sacraments regularly—because they offer us the spiritual nourishment we need in order to do the real work of Christian living. And what is that real work?

"For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me, ill and you cared for me, in prison and you visited me" (Matthew 25:35–36).

This passage, the source of the corporal works of mercy, leaves no doubt that the work of mercy is the heart of Christian discipleship and the standard by which we will be judged at the end of time. There is no distinction between those who deserve help and those who do not. We are called to show mercy to everyone. +
