New Director of Faith Formation:


I am happy to tell you that we have hired a new Director of Faith Formation. His name is Jonathan Vanegas and he will begin his ministry with us on Monday, September 13.

Jonathan brings several years of proven leadership experience along with a strong commitment to discipleship at all levels of faith development. His depth of knowledge of Catholicism and the catechumenate (RCIA), the basis for all catechesis in our Church, along with his pastoral aptitude will be an asset to our team and our community. Jonathan's love of the Catholic faith and enthusiasm in sharing that joy with others will be an inspiration for many.

Education and Formation Move Forward Despite the Challenges:

In the midst of an uptick in C-19 cases, St. Francis is moving forward with education and faith formation for our children and youth. Following the wise counsel of our parish Task Force, comprised of experts in the medical field and staff, and following the direction of various governmental agencies, local, state, and federal, we begin TFS school year with 656 students and our Pre-School with 184 students. While our Faith Formation programs do not begin until later in the fall, so far 381 children/youth are currently enrolled. Registrations will close for Faith Formation on September 1. Always be assured that the health and safety of our children, youth, and teachers/staff are first and foremost among our considerations as we endeavor to live life as normally as we can in the midst of an ongoing pandemic.




Families MUST be registered parishioners at St. Francis of Assisi to participate in Faith Formation.

TFS Alumni Spotlight: "Others Above Self" Jared Leins '13





This is part of a continuing profile series on alumni of The Franciscan School.

Jared Leins, TFS Alumni Class of 2013, uses this verse in Colossians 3:23 to serve as his guiding light "Work willingly in everything you do as if you were working for the Lord, rather than man."

Leins graduated TFS in 2013 after attending preschool through 8th grade. Leins says TFS was instrumental in laying a solid foundation in faith, academics, and serving others: "I am grateful for the emphasis of putting Christ and others above self." Leins has carried this foundation through his years following TFS.

After graduating high school, Leins attended The United States Naval Academy where he majored in Mechanical Engineering. He is currently working in the USNA Physical Education Department to train incoming freshmen who are participating in a boot camp called Plebe Summer. This month, in August, Leins will report to flight school where he will train to become a Navy pilot.

Leins admits that his first inspiration to the Naval Academy was to play baseball and get a quality education, but, since then, it has become so much more. He says, "As I progressed through the Academy, my reason to continue changed to become a selfless leader, friend, and future father."

Leins' inspiration is fitting for his career path. One of the US Navy's unofficial mottos is "Non sibi sed patriae," which means "Not Self, but Country." During his time at TFS, Leins says the school taught him empathy and striving for a profession that puts people first. "I would not be where I am today without the hundreds of people who have sacrificed for me in some capacity, and I know that service will always be on the forefront of my mind for the rest of my life."


Not only was TFS foundational to his path towards service, but so was the encouragement and support of his family and the character of people he interacted with in the military. Both his family and Naval students and officers showed traits of sacrifice and love that Leins knew he

wanted to emulate. Mrs. Laureen Wacenske, School Counselor at TFS, was one of those people who set a strong example for Leins: "She remains one of the most caring and compassionate people and teachers that I have interacted with to this day."

One of Leins' most treasured memories of his time at TFS was the Wednesday morning Mass. He enjoyed attending church with his classmates, all coming together to worship and pray. Leins encourages students at TFS today to have an attitude of gratitude, and to remember those around you: "When things are going well, always remember those who helped you get to where you are, and when things aren't going well, always remember that you have people who will help you."

Refugee Resettlement Ministry Welcoming People "Home" in Wake County

Over the last half dozen years, our parish has helped resettle two refugee families into Wake County through our partnership with the local resettlement organization called the U.S. Committee for Refugees and Immigrants (USCRI).

We now have the opportunity to help once again as USCRI begins to ramp up their resettlement efforts.

Will you join our effort?

We are looking for a core group of parishioners willing to lead this effort in the coming months that involve preparing an apartment with donated furniture for the family, welcoming them into the country, and providing ongoing support in the form of transportation, ESL tutoring, and mentorship. There will be orientation, training, and support of this journey from USCRI and St. Francis parish staff.

Related to this, many of us have been glued to the news coming out of Afghanistan this past week. After 20 years of war, unimaginable violence, and so many lives lost, it's heartbreaking to see a worsening humanitarian crisis unfold before our eyes.

Our focus now must be on the safety of the people who remain in Afghanistan — American citizens, our allies, and those in danger of violent retribution from the Taliban. The U.S. has a moral obligation to help the Afghan people.

We received word this week from USCRI that North Carolina is preparing to welcome Afghans who assisted American troops and are now fleeing for their safety. A couple had been experiencing homelessness for two years. Since the man and woman used any income from various jobs to rent a hotel room, they had no money to put down on an apartment and came to St. Vincent de Paul for help.

After a referral to a caseworker, the couple was able to obtain a housing voucher and secured an apartment to move into on September 1.

Because they have no money in reserve, SVdP stepped in to help them get started. The couple is looking forward to moving into their home.

Volunteers at SVdP care about each neighbor in their caseload. Sometimes they are rewarded by observations such as this one by a neighbor they couldn't help but was nonetheless grateful for the contact because she said, "Other people won't even return our phone calls, but you came and listened to our story."

SVdP needs assistance to handle the workload. In particular, we need someone who can speak Spanish to assist with calls and visits to our neighbors in need. Joshua challenges the Israelites, making a definitive statement as their leader and head of his family: "We will serve the LORD." Notice that it isn't a question of if you will serve someone, but who you will serve.

The easiest way to find out who you are serving is to look where your heart, thoughts, and worries are. Jesus said, "Where your treasure is, there also will your heart be" (Matthew 6:21).

Simon Peter answered..."You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God." Peter also had this hard choice placed to him, and he spoke up as the first pope, the head of a family of believers. When Jesus revealed the doctrine of the Eucharist, that it was truly his body and blood, many left him over this difficult saying.

Jesus asks the apostles if they want to leave, too. He could have said this was just a symbol—that those who left had misunderstood. But he doesn't change his teaching. He merely asks the apostles if they accept and believe him.

Peter's answer, like Joshua's, is a fundamental option. He finds in Jesus' words eternal life. There is nowhere else to go when you have tasted the goodness and truth of Jesus. As hard as some of those truths may be, for Peter there is no turning away. Following Jesus faithfully will lead him to lay down his life for Jesus, crucified upside down, and buried on Vatican Hill where you can visit his tomb today. How's that for a legacy? +

What if We Used God's Gifts?

The summer after I graduated high school, I toured Europe with a music ensemble. One afternoon in the Italian countryside, we passed a tenement in the ditch beside the highway. It flashed by so quickly, I didn't have time to form a clear picture; I only have an impression of shelters constructed from cardboard boxes with sheets draped over them.

That image has haunted me ever since. Seeing such things in pictures doesn't quite pack the same emotional punch as being there in real life. I couldn't believe anybody actually lived like that, especially in the First World.

Many things in the world defy comprehension, particularly for those of us comfortably ensconced in temperature-controlled homes with two- (or three-) car garages and multiple televisions. Terror attacks, genocide, poverty, and war brutal enough to cause millions to flee their homelands are unfathomable. So is the crucifixion, actually.

That image of a body stretched upon intersecting beams is unfathomable for the opposite reason. Its familiarity lessens its impact. To me, the icon of Our Mother of Perpetual Help offers a different way to approach this pivotal event in salvation history. It depicts the Christ Child shrinking away from the cross, the nails, the lance, and the gall and vinegar. Meanwhile, his Mother is



staring right at us while gesturing to her Son. I can just see in her eyes what she's thinking: "Look what he's done for you!"

Meditating on this image, I realize I may never be able to fully comprehend just what Jesus went through in order to win our salvation, any more than I can comprehend the desperation that leads parents to put their children in a raft in the middle of winter and cross the sea.

Yet comprehending isn't what matters most. The world is full of suffering, full of problems whose magnitude we will never understand, let alone figure out how to fix. And yet each of us is uniquely gifted, with a purpose in God's plan. Each of us

can toss a pebble and make a tiny ripple in that vast surface. One little throw might not make a difference, but if every Christian did the same, who knows what God might accomplish through us?

In the end, when I look at the icon of Our Mother of Perpetual Help, that is what comes to mind. "Look what he's done for you," she seems to be saying. "Now, what are you going to do?" +


