DO YOU KNOW ALL THE GIFTS YOU RECEIVED IN YOUR BAPTISM?

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord by John the Baptist at the Jordan River and take some time to reflect on our own baptism and what it means. Over four decades of journeying with fellow Catholics and others, I have learned that

many of us do not fully realize everything we have received in our baptism (I didn't until I started exploring this more deeply many years ago in order to prepare parents for the baptism of their children).

We have launched a video series to explore the incredible range of gifts we have received in our baptism. This series is called To Know, To Believe, To Live 2 (or KBL2 for short). If you are curious to know the range of gifts you have received, I invite you to view the first five videos (yes, it took five videos to cover the entire range) that are now available on our parish website. The fifth video will go live on Monday, January 10.

ST. FRANCIS ACHIEVES RARE GOAL: We learned last week that St. Francis made its 2021 Bishop's Annual Appeal (B.A.A.) goal of \$509,000. We are searching our parish archives, but diocesan records dating back to 2008 indicate this is the first time we have reached our goal in 14 years. To say I am happy is an understatement. I express my deep gratitude to the 1320 households who supported the 2021 appeal.

ON RETREAT: I was supposed to travel to the Holy Land for a pilgrimage this week but Israel shut its borders to foreigners to control the spread of the Omicron variant. The trip will be rescheduled, hopefully before 2022 concludes. I will be away this week on retreat and extend it another week for some vacation, my first break since last summer. Please know I will be praying for you and ask you to keep me in your prayers.

Acts Of The Apostles, Part I & II Registration is Open via Realm



This is an "in-person" Bible Study, which will meet for a total of 10 sessions on Wednesday mornings from January 26 through April 6, 2022, from 10:00-11:30am. (There is no class on March 2 in honor of Ash Wednesday). Registrants will meet in the Padua Room (in the Community Center) beginning at 9:30 AM for light refreshments and coffee and class will begin promptly at 10:00 AM. Masks are required. (If deemed necessary, this study may convert to Zoom format.) Study, reflection questions, prayers, and access to online resources are included.

Cost is \$30.00 per person. Books will be available at the first meeting. Registration limited to first 20 registrants.



Acts tells the story of how the Gospel was spread and explains the Church's growth from its beginning at the time of Jesus' ascension at Pentecost. Acts is the second volume of literary work begun in the Gospel According to Luke.

Best Job In The World

An occasional series on our TFS Alumni



As one of the inaugural kindergarten students at The Franciscan School, Matt Wacenske experienced many firsts in his elementary and middle school grades. He was in the first graduating class of students who attended K-8, and his mom, school counselor Laureen Wacenske, has taught at the school since it opened its doors in 2000. For Matt, he believes TFS laid a solid foundation of education that was also rooted in faith. And just as important, he says,

"TFS instilled a mentality of leadership and service, which has helped every day of my life."

This mentality of leadership and service has truly become Matt's calling in life. Matt currently works as a Firefighter for the Raleigh Fire Department. In his free time, he serves as a volunteer firefighter with the Stewart Simmons Volunteer Fire Department in Deep Gap, NC. Although Matt had originally planned to go into law enforcement, a family friend recommended the fire department and he hasn't looked back. To Matt, being a firefighter "is the best job in the world."

Matt attended N.C. State University after Cardinal Gibbons, which as a lifelong Wolfpack fan, this was a dream come true. He majored in Environmental





Science and was approved to create his own minor, Fire Ecology. While in college, Matt served and trained with AmeriCorps in the Tahoe National Forest and helped save the Sage Grouse in Nevada. He is currently working with RFD Station 17 where he is also being trained for high water rescue. Just this Thanksgiving, Matt was supposed to be visiting with family when a wildfire spread outside Boone, N.C. Matt sacrificed his time off to serve with the Stewart Simmons Volunteer Fire Department. Thankfully, his crew was able to put the wildfire out and keep surrounding families safe.

Matt credits so much of his success today to the experiences he had at TFS. Many teachers were influential during his time, pouring time and energy into his education, his character, and his future. He fondly remembers winning the Shamrock tournament his 8th grade year, the Blue Jay Point field trip in 5th grade, being coached by a former Major League Baseball player, and making some of the best friends he could have.

To today's students, Matt encourages them to "enjoy every second you have, because being at a great school like TFS is a privilege. Engage yourself whenever and wherever possible- you get out what you put in." And quite possibly the most important encouragement of all, Matt says, "Don't be afraid to stand up for what's right, whether that is picking up trash, sitting with someone at lunch who might not have many friends, or standing up to a bully. Because if you don't, who will?"

"So then, as we have opportunity, let us do good to everyone, and especially to those who are of the household of faith." Galatians 6:10

As we officially wrap up the Christmas season in the church today with the celebration of the Baptism of the Lord, it seems an appropriate time to reflect on all that was recognized and celebrated these last few weeks. As you are aware, December 25th wasn't the only holy day marked in the liturgical calendar. Since Christmas, several holy days have occurred. The feast of the Holy Family, the feast of Mary, Mother of God, and the coming of the Magi to see the Christ Child were also marked as important days in our faith.

One common idea that I see threaded through all of these days is the importance of family. Today, we remember Jesus' baptism which reminds us that when we are baptized, we become a brother or sister of Christ; we become a true member of His family. Of course on December 26th and January 1st, we recognize Jesus' parents and how the Blessed Mary and St. Joseph were chosen to be Jesus' earthly parents. They showered him with love, offered support and gently gave their guidance much like family members do today for each other. Like many families today, the Three Kings celebrated the birth of a child by coming together and bearing gifts.

These beautiful feast days remind us not only of the importance of care for those

within our families but also for our neighbor, including the stranger, those who are marginalized, and those who have wronged us. This is part of what being a member of God's family is all aboutsharing compassion and kindness to all.

Did you ever consider the message of family in the popular holiday film classic, "How the Grinch Stole Christmas?" As you know, the Grinch is a very famous icon seen during the holiday season. A good number of our preschoolers come decked out in some kind of Grinch apparel throughout the month of December. There are very few of our students who have never heard of the Grinch or listened to Thurl Ravenscroft's bass voice singing "You're a Mean One, Mr. Grinch." This infamous character seems a bit out of place in a season which recognizes the importance of family with multiple holy days, especially Christmas. Upon further examination, the Grinch's feature film really does as well. Ask any of our preschoolers and they will likely tell you how the folks of Whoville, despite the Grinch stealing every last one of their Christmas decorations, foods, gifts, and treats, they still came together to celebrate Christmas as a family community. They recognized that the love and care that they had for each other as a town family really was the most important

part of Christmas. Although the Grinch's heart was initially "three sizes too small", he was still embraced by the Who's. One can easily conclude that this is one reason that he eventually changed for the better and was included in the Whoville family community.

God has blessed us with families of all shapes and sizes. Some we were born into while others were formed or organized into families. Some were even created by the simple act of one person reaching out to a stranger to extend a helping hand or warm smile. Whomever we call 'family', God continues to offer us the chance to grow in His family. He extends continual invitations for all of us to be part of His family. What an amazing gift this invitation is! Let us work to make sure that everyone who is part of His family knows how important and special he/she is!



JUSTICE AND PEACE MINISTRIES

Marching for Life, Dignity, and Justice

We are celebrating the great mystery of when God became flesh as a vulnerable child within an empire of great violence. The witness of Jesus' life pointed to the reality that no matter what the political realities are, all of God's children, made in God's image and likeness, are worthy of respect, love, dignity, and justice. Thus, as followers of Jesus Christ, we are called to continue to bear witness to the dignity of human life at all stages.

Throughout the year, we lift up many varied opportunities for parishioners to bear witness to life, justice, and peace rooted in our Catholic values. We write, call, and meet with policy makers and legislators; we demonstrate, pray, and protest; and we envision and organize together to bring about a world where every life is celebrated, valued, and protected. This work directly confronts a range of issues from racial injustice to protection of the environment, from lack of affordable housing to lack of health insurance, and from the tragedy of abortion to the tragedy of executions of prisoners. Pope

Francis continues to invite us to a vision of faith and church that is not exclusively a private affair but is engaged in the public work of loving neighbor, works of mercy, solidarity with the poor and marginalized, and political work for justice and peace.

In January, as a way to call attention to the 1973 Supreme Court decision that made abortion legal in our country, people have been gathering together to demonstrate, pray, protest, and celebrate life from the moment of conception to the moment of natural death, and every moment in between. These gatherings speak to a vision of world where these moments of life are celebrated, valued, and protected by everybody—both in the private sector and in the public sphere. Despite the current COVID-19 pandemic, these gatherings will carry on in modified ways, and we want to invite you to participate in some capacity, whether that is through prayer, celebration of liturgy. or in attending one of the marches.

Society of St. Vincent de Paul

Although the helpline was closed between Christmas and New Year's, St. Vincent de Paul Society visitors still had a job to do. They distributed Wal-Mart gift cards provided by the St. Francis of Assisi Giving Tree to neighbors who SVdP had helped through the year.

Visitors usually deliver the cards but because of COVID, they called to confirm addresses and mailed them.

One of the recipients was a 19-year-old single mom who had been abandoned by the child's father. SVdP helped her in 2021 because she had missed work because of illness and gotten behind on rent.

"When I called to tell her about the \$25 gift card, you would have thought I'd offered her a million dollars. She was so happy and grateful," the visitor said.

It had been a hard year for the neighbor. Not long after receiving help from SVdP last spring, she contracted COVID and was admitted to the ICU unit of a local hospital.

Her young daughter was also hospitalized. Thanks to earlier advice from the SVdP visitor, the neighbor had applied to House Wake for money and was able to keep up with her rent when she was unable to work. She had also applied for and received food stamps.

This neighbor wasn't the only one grateful for the Christmas gift. Others called the help line to thank SVdP and the parishioners of St. Francis of Assisi for remembering them.
