PRAYING FOR PEACE IN UKRAINE: Although war never seems to end in our world, the outbreak of war in Ukraine is particularly disturbing on many levels. Members of our own community have family and friends there who are suffering and living in great fear. While governments, international agencies, even sporting associations are applying pressure for Russia to withdraw from Ukraine, we also have spiritual resources at our disposal to assist in the effort.

We invite you to join as part of our faith family to pray for peace and a peaceful end to this war. There are two opportunities to do so publicly.

Please join us this Sunday, March 6, anytime between 3-5pm at the church to pray before the Blessed Sacrament and to lift up our prayers in the presence of Jesus Christ to bring this conflict to a peaceful end. There will not be a service per se. Rather, it will be a time to sit, stand, or kneel before the Lord himself in silence asking for divine assistance in this crisis. Come for a few minutes, come for the entire time. Whatever works for you, please come and pray.

We also ask you to consider joining others who gather at our parish Peace Pole, located near Clare Hall near the parking lot, each Sunday morning after the 9am Mass to pray for peace in Ukraine and elsewhere in our world. If you do not go to the 9am Mass, simply gather at the pole around 10am each Sunday.

Our prayers are an important tool in combatting evil. Please pray for the people of Ukraine, either at one of these public events or in your private prayer.

How We're Moving Forward





As we entered Lent this week, as always almsgiving, both financial and personal, is one of the focuses of the Lenten season. We highlight another of our alumni this week who lives out our credo of Faith, Academics and Service with her personal life of personal almsgiving through her service.

For Lexie Burns, a Franciscan School 2012 graduate, serving others has become an integral part of who she is. Service is one of the three pillars in TFS's motto, and for Burns, the experiences and mentors she had at the school has helped implant a heart for helping others. "Since my time at TFS, I have taken what I have learned about teamwork and leadership and incorporated it into my time while at college," says Burns. She even on occasion will come home from college to help teachers like Mrs. Moser and Mrs. Harrington in their middle school science classes.

Burns' passion for helping and leading others also stems from her own challenges she has faced. Burns has been managing diabetes since she was a young child.

Going to TFS as a kindergartner was \$cary for Burns and her parents, but she said "Being at TFS felt like home. The faculty and staff helped my parents know that I would be safe." While as a student at the University of North Carolina Greensboro (UNCG), Burns' challenges have motivated her to advocate for and educate others on diabetes. She established a diabetics support group on campus, Spartan Diabetics, which has now become a chapter of the College Diabetes Network. In addition to supporting each other, this group talks to classes in the Nursing Department, helps the local JDRF office, and holds an experiential advocacy event each semester.

In addition to all her service and leadership with Spartan Diabetics, Burns has spent much of her time helping others whenever she can. She served with the Make A Difference House, went on a service spring break trip to Washington, DC to help the homeless, and she even served as the UNCG Women's Basketball team manager for two years. She helps fellow classmates in the Career Center by peer reviewing resumes and preparing for interviews. Recently, Burns joined Phi Sigma Pi, a National Honorary Leadership Fraternity. Burns is majoring in Environmental and Sustainability Studies with hopes to work for a company

and help them become more sustainable and environmentally friendly. Through her challenges and successes, Burns says "I wouldn't have thought I could do all of this if it wasn't for the amazing upbringing and education I received at TFS."

Burns wants to encourage students at TFS that they can do anything they put their minds to. "No matter the challenges you face after graduating from TFS and beyond, face it with confidence. In the end, if you are happy and enjoy what you are doing, then it will never feel like you are working."

The Franciscan School wants to partner with you to achieve the goals you have for your child and their educational experience. The season of Lent is upon us. This is the time in which we look to deepen our relationship with God in multiple ways, but most especially through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

As Catholic educators, our teachers and staff weave the meaning of Lent into many activities, special prayers, and songs. Because young students learn best through play, the teachers use various intentional play opportunities to demonstrate the meaning of Lent. It is always a goal to incorporate hands-on, realistic, and meaningful activities.

Almsgiving is a big word for our little people, but the concept is not new to them. Because of the practice they have throughout the year developing their social-emotional skills, they have an understanding of what it means to help or give to someone. Although our preschoolers are too young to work at a homeless shelter or buy groceries for a food pantry, there are a number of things in which they can partake. For example, they can make cards for an elderly neighbor, offer an extra hug to a sibling, or clean up their toys without being asked (or only being asked 1 time instead of 5 times J). Last month, our students were encouraged to pick out one of their favorite books from home to donate to the WAKE Up and

Read program. This organization works to ensure that all children have an opportunity to share in the joy of a good book.

More recently, some of our children had a wonderfully unexpected opportunity to practice almsgiving on our church campus. One afternoon, while waiting to go to the after school care that we offer for our preschoolers, I had the chance to wait with some of the children while others were using the restroom. It turns out that this was an afternoon when the roofers were working on a section near preschool. I took the small group of 3 and 4-year olds over to peek out the door and see the area where old shingles and tar paper had been thrown. Unless their own homes are getting a new roof, most children will never touch a shingle. I pulled a few samples of the shingles from the debris pile and let the children feel it. We made a full educational sensory experience out of those discarded shingles! We discussed how they felt, what they looked like and how they smelled. We also practiced some of our positional words such as 'under', 'on top of', and 'next to'. It so happened that one of the workers had left the wheelbarrow nearby which was partially filled with the shingles. We talked about what a mess was left on the ground and that because it was so huge, it would take a long time to clean up. All

of the children know very well that they are asked to clean up their messes at home and at school. It's also a common practice at school to lend a hand to our classmates when it's time to put things away. With that in mind, each of the children picked up a piece of tar paper or shingle and put it in the wheelbarrow. Although a simple act, it not only allowed them to practice keeping our church clean, but also to assist someone else in cleaning up a large mess. The roofers did not ask them to help or even know that they did it. Isn't that how God reminds us to act in the Gospel reading from "Ash Day" (as one of our preschoolers called it when trying to remember the name)? We are to pray, fast, and give alms during Lent, but not to look for recognition or praise for the deeds we have done. We are to offer help to others but not seek a gold star to acknowledge our work.

I always enjoy naturally occurring moments when our preschoolers can live out Jesus' teachings! It is my prayer that we remain mindful of these times so that we never miss a chance to help our youngest develop their faith and love of God.

JUSTICE AND PEACE MINISTRIES Serving Others in Lent

The entire season of Lent is a time for turning, or re-turning, to God, in whom we find our source of strength, security, hope, and peace. The season calls us to take time out for God in an intentional way, to examine our lives, and to open our hearts to God's mercy. Like Jesus, we spend time in the desert facing the temptations of our souls.

In this spirit, we are invited to practice Lenten prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. We are also called to accompany one another in community, pray for one another, and help the least fortunate among us.




