

SYNOD LISTENING SESSIONS: As you know, Pope Francis is asking for input from the entire world in preparation for a meeting he will host in Rome in 2023 on how we can function better as a Church. It is the first time the laity are being included in this consultation process. In addition to hearing from those who are active Catholics, he is particularly interest-

ed to hear from those marginalized in our society and Church, former Catholics, and others who, as outside observers from all walks of life, might have wisdom that would be useful for us to receive. The Diocese of Raleigh had a link on their website for submitting thoughts through February 28 and now parishes are holding in-person and virtual listening sessions to gather the thoughts of parishioners and non-parishioners invited by parishioners to continue this process. Please see page 4 in the bulletin for the dates, times, and formats of these listening sessions at St. Francis. Please speak up. The Pope wants to hear from you!

SUPPORT FOR UKRAINE: We have decided to continue our prayer efforts on behalf of Ukraine. Each Sunday afternoon through April 10, we invite you and your family/friends to join us between 3-5pm at the church to pray before the Blessed Sacrament and to lift up our prayers in the presence of Jesus Christ to bring this conflict to a peaceful end. There will not be a service per se. Rather, it will be a time to sit, stand, or kneel before the Lord himself in silence asking for divine assistance in this crisis. Come for a few minutes, come for the entire time. Whatever works for you, please come and pray. And if you can't come, please pray privately for this invasion to end.

We also ask you to consider joining others who gather at our parish Peace Pole, located next to Clare Hall near the parking lot, each Sunday morning after the 9am Mass to pray for peace in Ukraine and elsewhere in our world. If you do not go to the 9am Mass, simply gather at the pole around 10am each Sunday.

PENANCE SERVICES: Lent is a wonderful time to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation. There are multiple opportunities to do so. Two priests are in the church each Saturday afternoon between 4-5pm to celebrate this sacrament with you. St. Francis will have two communal Penance Services in March, one on Wednesday, March 16, 11:00am-12:30pm and another on Tuesday, March 29, 7:00-8:30pm. Penance Services will be held throughout our deanery as well and you may find that schedule on page 10 in the bulletin.

How We're Moving Forward





Gelebrating the Rite of Election



Last Sunday, March 6, Grace Bindon, one of our TFS sixth graders, celebrated the Rite of Election at the Cathedral of the Holy Name of Jesus as part of her journey towards the reception of the sacraments of initiation (i.e., Baptism, Confirmation, and the Holy Eucharist) which she will receive on April 16 at the Easter Vigil at St. Francis.

The Rite of Election is a ritual in which those who are not yet baptized, called catechumens, are declared ready to be baptized. Normally, the bishop of the diocese celebrates this rite at his cathedral. It was impressive to see hundreds of catechumens declared the "elect" by Bishop Zarama. The ceremony was powerful with many expressing strong feelings of gratitude and wonder about the ritual and seeing the cathedral full of young people from many cultures eager to celebrate the sacraments of initiation. It was a wonderful expression of the universality of the Church.

Although we could not say hello before the rite began to our dear Fr. Jim Sabak, who was the master of ceremonies for the rite, he surprised us during the liturgy by inviting Molly and Jim, Grace's grandparents, and now also Grace's godparents, to accompany her into the sanctuary with the rest of the catechumens who were being elected by the Bishop.

At the end of the liturgy, we had an opportunity to greet our Bishop and had a group picture with him which Molly has kindly shared with us as a sign of gratefulness for the wonderful experience we all lived.

Let us keep Grace and her family in our prayers as she continues her journey towards the Easter Vigil in which she will receive the sacraments of Baptism, First Eucharist, and Confirmation.


3:30pm Art Experience:

The Franciscan School and Unmasking Lent

This year the week of Ash Wednesday began for The Franciscan School with the relaxing of mandatory masking for our students. After 714 days of being masked we finally had the option to see each other face to face. It was a glorious beginning of that week with many of our children finally free from the necessary burden of masking brought on by severities of the Coronavirus pandemic. Our students felt less anxious and distressed and were able to express that uninhibited joy that so characterizes The Franciscan School.

It was a symbolic prelude to beginning our Lenten journey at TFS. Through the many ways we have tried to make masking an acceptable normal, it really could not replace the genuineness of seeing one another for who we are and sharing in all the emotions and expressions the full spectrum of our faces affords us. Our students knew this and yearned for this moment when we might be able, if we so chose, to remove our masks and engage with one another once again.

In many ways this is what the Lenten journey is all about. It is about removing the masks that we hide behind, or that we use for comfort and security. When the mask is removed the fullness of our humanity, our vulnerability, is revealed. In this place of vulnerability God gives us the courage to be who we are, to love who we are, and to realize that who we are is unique and exceptional in all the cosmos. This is part of the teaching of one of the greatest theologians of the Franciscan Order, Blessed John Duns Scotus, who understood that each human being is created with a uniqueness that is all his or her own. This uniqueness is meant to be developed to give glory to God by a life of selfless giving and love.

When we hide behind masks, even for good reasons, we obscure a portion of our true reality, which leaves us unable to reach and to enter deeper into each other's lives. Journeying together through the 40 days of Lent, our students come to reinforce a core identity of our school – that accepting yourself for the wonder and beauty of who you are enables you to discover and celebrate

those gifts which in turn give life to the world. Lent enables us to remember that we are remarkably gifted – remarkably created in the image and likeness of God; remarkably gifted with wisdom and knowledge for the building up of society; remarkably gifted with a capacity for love. Our students demonstrate these remarkable gifts every day – in our classrooms, in our concern for service and peace and justice, in our athletic programs, in our STEM program, and in the many ways we honor and rejoice in each other.

The Franciscan School wants to partner with you to achieve the goals you have for your child and their educational experience. Diary of a Squirrel-The Cupcake Chronicles: 3

A gift opens the way and ushers the giver into the presence of the great. Proverbs 18:16

Cupcake is at it again! Leaving a big impression on our little people! You might remember in last week's bulletin article that I spoke about a couple of opportunities which presented themselves at preschool that tied in well to a lesson related to almsgiving. Cupcake presented another chance this past week to remember some valuable Lenten lessons too!

I looked out my office window recently to see one of my 3-year old classes lined up on the sidewalk and very quietly watching something. As it turned out, it was none other than the Monkey class's resident "pet" squirrel! The observers were from the Puppy class which is located across the hall from the 3-year old Monkey class. The Puppies were guite intent on watching Cupcake munch on seeds in his food dish. I found out that what had really caught their attention was the fact that Cupcake's food looked very similar to the food that they used to feed the birds. They were concerned that somehow Cupcake had taken their birds' food. It was worrisome to them because

they feared not having anything to feed their feathered friends. How could Cupcake help himself to the bird food without even asking? This was problematic for their young minds because they understand that this was, of course, not very kind. A plan was eventually formed to go and ask the Monkey class about Cupcake and his food source. Much to the relief of the Puppies, Cupcake was not taking food that was not his. His Monkey friends had just fed him seeds from their supply bin that actually was the same as the bird food. Although there was no cause for worry, it turned out to be a very good chance to reiterate not taking something that doesn't belong to you, at least not without first asking.

A few days later, Cupcake was again spotted by the Puppy class. This time, he was accompanied by his friend, "Sprinkles". It seemed that Cupcake had brought his companion to share food from his dish. This provided not only a chance to continue the previous lesson about not taking what doesn't belong

to you, but also allowed the teachers to expand on it further. Cupcake was doing a wonderful job of sharing his food with Sprinkles. They even seemed to be "taking turns" in going to get food from the dish! Sharing and giving what we have is not only a regular teaching at preschool, but definitely can be tied into one of the practices which is encouraged, particularly during the season of Lent.

Using squirrels to capture teachable moments might seem a bit unusual, but they certainly got the attention of our preschoolers! In addition, the experience was more meaningful since each of the two classes was practicing care for God's creation in the spirit of giving. This seems very appropriate on many levels and provided a way to ensure that the lessons would be remembered!




Pack 352 finds ways to support their new Malawi Scout friends

All it took was an automobile accident involving a deer followed by a bout with COVID to put a neighbor behind in rent.

She had just moved to Raleigh in October for a new job in the medical assistance field when she hit a deer that ran in front of her car. A broken arm required surgery, but it had to be delayed because she came down with COVID. That meant more time off work, and the disability checks did not cover all her living expenses. She turned to her family and the St. Vincent DePaul Society for help.

The good news is that the landlord is not charging late fees. The bad news is he will start eviction proceedings on March 18 if the back rent is not paid in full.

The doctor just cleared the neighbor to return to work so her financial future looks good if she can get caught up on the rent.

A combination of help from St. Francis of Assisi and Our Lady of Lourdes' SVdP as well as the Friendship Fund at First Presbyterian and her family will save her from the cost and trouble of eviction.

The St. Vincent de Paul Society exists to help those who need emergency help with living expenses such as rent and utilities.

and sons leave their families in their home countries in Mexico and Central America and travel to our state with little more than a backpack to do the hard work of picking our fruits, vegetables, and tobacco for months on end. While they are here they live in rundown trailers mostly, often lacking the basic essentials, like working plumbing and comfortable and clean bedding. They do this only to provide better support and resources for their families back home.

Every summer fathers, brothers, uncles We have been supporting these men for over 25 years and this summer we are bringing back the heart of this ministry - monthly fiestas and driving the men to mass each weekend - after a two year hiatus due to COVID. We are searching for new ministry leaders to help us! Speaking Spanish is not required but it is helpful. Over the last half dozen years, our parish has helped resettle two refugee families into Wake County through our partnership with the local resettlement organization called the U.S. Committee for Refugees and Immigrants (USCRI). In light of the crisis this past summer in Afghanistan, where nearly a half a million refugees fled the country in light of the reemergence of Taliban rule, St. Francis once again offered itself to help support a refugee family

entering Wake County. We were not alone in our offer, and so just this week we finally received word that we have been matched with the Aziz Family. We will be helping a mother and her three young adult children move into a 2-bedroom apartment in Raleigh on Tuesday, March 15th. We have already recruited a group of parishioners who will be assisting in the move-in with donated furnishings. filling the food pantry, and providing some initial welcome and support

to the Aziz Family. There will likely be other ways to provide ongoing support in the form of transportation, ESL tutoring, and mentorship.




