

CLOSURE: On March 13, 2020, the mayor of Washington DC announced that the city would go into total lockdown in

response to the Coronavirus pandemic. As you well remember, life changed dramatically in 24 hours. This was to be my final semester teaching full-time at The Catholic University of America and I knew I would return to the Diocese of Raleigh at the end of the summer. At that point, I had no idea where I would be assigned by the bishop. You too were undergoing the same lockdown with the added stress of the impending departure of the Franciscans coupled with the uncertainty of what lay ahead and not knowing who would replace your beloved friars.

As the months wore on, you and I learned that St. Francis would be my new home. It also became increasingly clear that I would leave DC without the opportunity to say "farewell" to my colleagues and two church communities in the area where Lelebrated Mass each weekend, Lleft DC without saying a personal "goodbye" to the friends and acquaintances I had made during my eight years in our nation's capital and began my new assignment here without an in-person welcome with you. It was among the strangest experiences of my ministerial life. I was used to new beginnings as I've had several of them in my nearly 42 years of priesthood, but this transition was by far the most unusual.

It is now two years later. I will be away this weekend from the parish to finally celebrate a formal "farewell" and "goodbye" with the two church communities I served while in DC. It will be good to see people I have come to know and bring some official closure to my time with them. I'll have the opportunity to preach and preside at the Eucharistic liturgy and continue the celebration with a reception at each place.

In May, I will return to DC to celebrate with two students who will receive their doctorates and whom I served as the director of their major research and 200+

page paper. While there, I will also have an opportunity to say "farewell" to my university colleagues after a two-year absence. Having this closure will also be important for me.

As I bring this chapter of my life to closure, I am looking forward to establishing new relationships at St. Francis. Now that we are out of masks and many of us are now thrice vaccinated, I look forward to forming some new friendships here at my new home. It has been a long slog and I have felt a bit at sea given the necessary precautions we have needed to endure to keep as many people as possible safe and healthy. I know Fr. Jairo has felt the same way. We look forward to getting to know you as members of a spiritual family in a deeper way.

We could not have made it as well as we have without the affirmation you have extended to us via emails, phone calls, text messages, notes, letters, and personal comments quickly expressed as we've passed one another outside the church doors. These have meant a great deal to us. It'll be nice to actually have some personal conversations over a meal and learn names with unmasked faces and the stories connected to those names and faces. We also look forward to interacting with you as we gradually resume parish life as normal, ministering alongside each other, socializing, and building up the Body of Christ.







How We're Moving Forward





Lent at The Franciscan School



As we move through this year's Lenten season, halfway to the Triduum, it is hard not to appreciate our faith even more as we return to full attendance at prayer and Community Mass. Exiting the pandemic phase of COVID-19, we can even better appreciate the opportunity for praying together. The chance for acts of generosity and service, as key Lenten disciplines and tenets of our school's mission, correlate in a beautiful way that emphasize the heart of The Franciscan School's perspective on education. The shared experience, especially intense after the last two years of separation, of what it means to fast in order to acquire renewed gratitude for the food we receive daily through our hot lunch program, with the varied and incisive discussions on Lent with our students, enables us to recognize how good it is share this season. All part of the process of renewing who and what we are as The Franciscan School together.

Prayer together is a principal hallmark of The Franciscan School. We pray Morning Prayer in the school courtyard as we start each day. So important and crucial is prayer to our identity that we never gave up on it, even as the sad realities of the pandemic set in around us. We continued praying together utilizing technology and Zoom all last year. Returning this year, we gathered in the courtyard

for Morning Prayer as we have always done, even if this meant masking around one another. Now we have reached the point where we gather unmasked in our courtyard to start the day with prayer and celebration...like normal, where we must always remember what enables us to show our best to one another! This week. we move to reuniting the entire school in attendance at our weekly Community Mass together...like normal, where praising God as one body signifies our oneness in Christ! We are returning to praying as we have traditionally experienced it at The Franciscan School. Praying together brings us together and enables us to remember that, standing with and for each other united in Christ, anything is therefore possible. To achieve this during Lent again affirms a key principle of this season – we grow in faith as we grow in prayer and service with one another. On April 8th at Morning Prayer, we will pray a special Stations of the Cross, with posters representing each station created by our 4th graders. Praying together during Lent opens to us the wonders of God's never failing care for us, and experiencing this care as a whole community makes it even more special.

Acts of generosity and service are important parts of the Lenten journey. During Lent at TFS, we will continue with

our service to those in need through our dollar dress out collection, a fun event that raises hundreds of dollars for a student council-chosen group in our community. We will also encourage families to look for opportunities to participate in service within their households. Our service takes place throughout the year, especially during Catholic Schools Week, so this discipline of Lent remains central to our school and parish community throughout the year. We look forward to even more "openings" in the larger community, as a chance for even greater opportunities to serve as we are called to by our faith.

We may remember Lent from our youth as a time in our school or parish where the focus rested on "what you gave up". Our focus at TFS is, and always has been, what we can do for others. We do this through service, prayer, and generosity to those in need. While Lent lasts only 40 days before the Triduum leading to Easter, we live these Lenten values at TFS throughout the year.

Our Lenten Journey



"I wait for the Lord, my whole being waits, and in his word I put my hope." John 12:13

It is hard to believe that our Lenten journey is in the final couple of weeks. The teachers never cease to amaze me with their creativity in trying to help our students better understand these 40 days and how they are meant as a time to prepare ourselves for the glory of Easter.

Throughout our classrooms, one can easily see and hear how the students are learning about Lent. While there is much happening, I have highlighted a few ideas that you might like to share with that special little person in your life.

One of our youngest classes, learned that a beautiful word which we traditionally hear at mass disappears during Lent. To mark the season as a time to repent and strive to do better, the word 'Alleluia' is omitted. It is not used again until Eas-

ter as we rejoice in the gift of the Resurrection. To reiterate this message, and with the understanding that preschoolers learn best through play, the teacher had her students pretend to bury an 'Allelulia' in the ground out on Exploration Station, the natural play area in front of our preschool. It was a group effort as everyone dug the hole and then scooped the dirt to fill it. A few messy hands later and the class was successful with covering it!

A four-year old classroom also made use of soil for a Lenten activity. They planted seeds in small containers of dirt. They planted "Jesus grass", as one child told me, or more accurately, a Lenten garden. They each are now taking turns to water the seeds. They are learning that Lent is a time to grow closer to God. The seeds will grow into something beautiful, just as

we do when we honor and share God's love and mercy. To add to the gardens, the students have also made a mound of dirt with an opening to represent a tomb and they will soon add a painted cross to the garden with a purple piece of cloth.

While we still have several days remaining in our Lenten journey, I think that simple activities such as these can make the meaning of Lent a bit clearer for our youngest followers of Christ. May they carry the message behind these lessons with them throughout the year!

Migrant Farm Worker Supply Drive

Every summer fathers, brothers, uncles and sons leave their families in their home countries of Mexico and Central America and travel to our state with little more than a backpack to do the hard work of picking our fruits, vegetables, and tobacco for months on end. While our brothers in Christ are here they live in run-down trailers and houses, often lacking the basic essentials. They do so only to better support and provide for their families at home.

We serve these brothers in Christ on the margins of society by driving them to and from mass at Our Lady of the Rosary Parish in Louisburg each Sunday from June 5 – September 25, 2022, and by offering them a monthly fiesta of food and fun. We also help by providing much needed supplies.

This year we are collecting ONLY the following. There will be bins in the Stewardship Center the weekend of April 2/3 for your donations.

- all personal hygiene items, including sunscreen
- laundry soaps
- caps/hats
- bandanas
- · men's long sleeved shirts
- men's t-shirts
- new socks and underwear for men
- new work boots, all men's sizes
- towels and wash cloths.

We partner with this amazing organization on a regular basis and they do important work in our community. Visitors at the St. Vincent de Paul Society are willing to listen and help neighbors when needed.

They recently were able to help one couple who got behind in rent because the husband lost his job in December and was unable to start a new job until February. Household expenses add up fast when one's pay is cut in half, so they reached out for assistance.

A cooperative effort among St. Francis of Assisi and Our Lady of Lourdes SVdP societies and the Friendship Fund at First Presbyterian Church plus a cooperative landlord helped the couple catch up with late bills.

Other times SVdP may not be able to help for whatever reason, but members find that neighbors who reach out to them are humble and appreciative of their listening skills. They will travel the journey with neighbors and refer them to local agencies if they can't directly offer aid.

Many have asked about suggestions for making financial donations to help with the unfolding humanitarian crisis in Ukraine after Russia invaded the country four and half weeks ago. The Diocese of Raleigh has put together a helpful webpage of suggestions of vetted organizations who are working on the ground and attending to emergency needs of affected people. Among the organizations the Diocese spotlights is, of course, Catholic Relief Services. CRS is partnering with a number of on-theground churches and organizations to coordinate a broad range of emergency assistance in Ukraine and support to Ukrainian refugees in neighboring countries. Although things are rapidly changing, CRS created a helpful page that summarizes what is happening in Ukraine and how CRS is involved. If you are giving through Faith Direct, there is also a way to donate money to support this cause starting this weekend. We stay 5 days, living among the poorest of the poor, those whom Jesus shared so much of his daily life with, while serving meals each day and sharing in daily Mass and reflections in a little chapel the beauty of which will take your breath away. And leave you longing for more.

At the end of the 5th day we head home a bit tired to be sure, yet full of peace, joy and feeling richly blessed - gifts of service to be sure. Service is God's work and doing it deepens us somehow, we become more in sync with God perhaps, more connected to each other, more in love with life and this beautiful yet broken world. I hope you'll give it a try.

Our Migrant Ministry is Coming Back We need your help!

Every summer fathers, brothers, uncles and sons leave their families in their home countries in Mexico and Central America and travel to our state with little more than a backpack to do the hard work of picking our fruits, vegetables, and tobacco for months on end. And a hard day it is:

5:00 am – wake, drag yourself out of bed, dress in the dark, eat a small cold breakfast

5:45 am – board the van headed to the fields, put on a trash bag for protection

6:00 am - harvesting of tobacco, fruits, and vegetables begins, in full sun, 80 degrees.

9:00 am - after picking as fast as you can for 3 hours, take a 10-minute water break

12:00 pm - eat lunch in the field, no soap and water to wash off pesticides

4:00 pm - final water break, 5-minutes

7:00 pm - board the van back to your trailer to make a bite to eat, do laundry, pack lunches

9:00 pm - to bed, hoping sleep will come to handle the same exhausting day tomorrow

While our brothers in Christ are here they live in run-down trailers and houses, often lacking the basic essentials like working plumbing and comfortable and clean bedding. They are overworked and underpaid doing work few Americans choose to do, only to provide better support and resources for their families back home.

Because we are a Catholic Community committed to living the Gospel in our daily lives, we have been serving our migrant brothers and easing their burdens for over 25 years. COVID interrupted our ability to do so these past two years. We are hoping to bring back this wonderful ministry this summer but we need your help. Won't you join us?

We serve these brothers in Christ on the margins of society by providing much needed supplies, driving them to and from Mass at Our Lady of the Rosary Parish in Louisburg each Sunday from June 5 – September 25, 2022, and by offering them a monthly fiesta of food and fun.




