

A Franciscan School for All



Since 2000. The Franciscan School has provided a nurturing and challenging academic environment for students of St. Francis of Assisi Parish that encompasses Catholic values in the Franciscan tradition for students in grades K-8. As the school looks ahead to its 23rd year of serving the students and families of St. Francis of Assisi Parish as part of the parish education ministry, we continue to provide a solid foundation in our Faith with a strong academic tradition and a dedication to Franciscan values. We are first and truly a Catholic school. We are NOT an elite school, and we want to be able to provide a socially, racially and economically diverse choice for our families seeking an education steeped in the Catholic Faith. We are committed to being able to serve those in our parish, and in the larger community, who are seeking an education in a Catholic Environment.

To meet this commitment, we offer significant tuition assistance through the Parish tithe to the education ministry, from dedicated endowments, and through Diocesan scholarship funds, but in 2019 we decided we wanted to do more. We decided we could make progress towards

meeting our goal of making the benefits of a Catholic and Christ-centered education at The Franciscan School available to as many St. Francis students and families as possible by creating our Timberwolf Fund. We know how generous our families are, and we know that they are always looking for ways to help. Now our families who support Catholic education and may have some additional resources can donate to help their children's classmates be able to attend. "We never want the cost of tuition to be a deterrent to families seeking an excellent education," Principal Mike Watson says. "Charging tuition makes it possible for us to offer our teachers a fair wage and give them access to quality materials and resources, but we understand that not every family can afford it."

The quality of education is critical. The Franciscan School offers unique programs to develop life-long learners and leaders. Its reading program features a differentiated reading assessment that assesses students' varying reading levels in grades K-8, allowing teachers to meet students where they are and build upon their reading skills, as well as a choice reading program for middle school students.

EDUCATION MINISTRIES



"Then you will call on me and come and pray to me, and I will listen to you." Jeremiah 29:12

As Catholic educators, we teach our children many things to help them grow in their faith. The importance of prayer, as you might expect, is certainly one of these. During Lent, we particularly emphasize it as one of the three pillars of this season. Talking to God through prayer helps us prepare for the glory of the Resurrection by allowing us to deepen our relationship with Him; this is something which He invites us into through all of the highs and lows of our daily lives. We teach our preschoolers that God always wants us to talk with Him and prayer is one way we express to Him our love.

All of the students at The Franciscan School start each morning by gathering together for prayer in their courtyard. It is one of many beautiful traditions at TFS. While we are not able to come together in a similar way with our young preschoolers, each class does begin and end the day in prayer. There are also multiple ways to pray before snack and lunch. Some classes do it with a song or a chant while other classes use a more traditional method such as a formal prayer. No matter the style, the children

recognize that this is a time to give thanks to God for the food and friends before them. Being the prayer leader for the week is definitely one of the top classroom jobs; everyone can appreciate what a special opportunity it is.

As our teachers and staff try to do with all lessons, particularly those related to knowing more about God, moments to practice and do are interwoven into other activities throughout the day. For example, when the children are walking outside to the playground, it presents a good opportunity to recognize and be grateful for the beauty God has provided around us. When our friend helps us clean up a play area in our room, it gives us a reminder to thank God for our friendships and all those who take care of us. Recently, I was outside with one of our 4-year-old classes on the playground. While out with them, emergency vehicle sirens could be heard off in the distance. The teacher asked all of the children to stop what they were doing and whisper a prayer of safety for both the rescuers and those whom they were going to help. The whole experience took only a couple of minutes, but what a powerful moment!

How many times have we heard or seen an ambulance or police car as we've been out and about? How often did we think to offer a prayer for those involved in that emergency call? Most parents naturally point out rescue vehicles to their small children as they race by because it is usually an exciting and easy way to practice naming. Flashing lights and blaring sirens generally capture a child's attention too. How hard would it be to extend the teaching to say a small prayer to keep everyone safe? This seems like a relatively simple practice for big and small alike!

As we continue with the rest of Lent, let us take every opportunity to show our young people how important a strong prayer life is. May it always be a part of our daily lives, not only so we can teach our youngest followers of Christ, but so we can strengthen our own relationship with God.

Every summer fathers, brothers, uncles and sons leave their families in their home countries in Mexico and Central America and travel to our state with little more than a backpack to do the hard work of picking our fruits, vegetables, and tobacco for months on end. And a hard day it is:

5:00 am – wake, drag yourself out of bed, dress in the dark, eat a small cold breakfast

5:45 am – board the van headed to the fields, put on a trash bag for protection

6:00 am - harvesting of tobacco, fruits, and vegetables begins, in full sun, 80 degrees.

9:00 am - after picking as fast as you can for 3 hours, take a 10-minute water break

12:00 pm - eat lunch in the field, no soap and water to wash off pesticides

4:00 pm - final water break, 5-minutes

7:00 pm - board the van back to your trailer to make a bite to eat, do laundry, pack lunches

9:00 pm - to bed, hoping sleep will come to handle the same exhausting day tomorrow

While our brothers in Christ are here they live in run-down trailers and houses, often lacking the basic essentials like working plumbing and comfortable and clean bedding. They are overworked and underpaid doing work few Americans choose to do, only to provide better support and resources for their families back home.

Because we are a Catholic Community committed to living the Gospel in our daily lives, we have been serving our migrant brothers and easing their burdens for over 25 years. COVID interrupted our ability to do so these past two years. We are hoping to bring back this wonderful ministry this summer but we need your help. Won't you join us?

We serve these brothers in Christ on the margins of society by providing much needed supplies, driving them to and from Mass at Our Lady of the Rosary Parish in Louisburg each Sunday from June 5 – September 25, 2022, and by offering them a monthly fiesta of food and fun.

For a number of years now, St. Francis has partnered with Catholic Charities to help transition homeless families to stability through a program called Family Support Circles. Support Circles are small groups of parishioners who create a network of love and support – hands and feet of Christ – for families in transition from homelessness. This ministry allows parishioners to come together as a team to develop relationships with a homeless family over a period of a year. The objectives are to support the family through difficult times by helping with needed resources and skills, empowering them to move toward greater financial security and achieve overall stability.

Volunteering for St. Francis' Family Support Circle means joining together with a small group of parishioners committed to working together on a regular basis with the identified family. A willingness to help is all that's needed, as professional support and guidance is provided by Catholic Charities. Our team will practice accompaniment—being present along the path of a family in need as they move toward independence. To the best of our abilities, we will nurture their financial, social, emotional and spiritual growth.

All life is relationship and through relationships the healing presence of Christ becomes a reality. The Family Support Circle truly reflects Pope Francis' concept of the Church as field hospital. Does this ministry sound like something you are feeling called to? Whatever your charisms may be, we are confident there is a role for you in helping out this program.

"America Talks" (Apr 21 and 23, 2022):

Depolarizing Our Country One Conversation at a Time

"...be quick to listen, but slow to speak..." (James 1:19)

In conversations at St. Francis regarding topics of social concern, one topic consistently comes up among parishioners: division in the church and in civil society. On April 21 and 23, 2022, Americans from across the country will participate in a national event called America Talks https://americatalks.us. a coming together for face-to-face video conversations with people who have different backgrounds, beliefs, and experiences than their own. We are encouraging parishioners to participate in this event. "America Talks", now in its second year, is an initiative of the https:// www.listenfirstproject.org/. Listen First Project, a consortium of 400+ large and small organizations is trying to address polarization by healing America, building relationships, and bridging divides. There's no cost for the event, and registration is easy: answer a few simple questions about yourself and your

views, choose a convenient date, and indicate whether you prefer a one-on-one conversation or a small group discussion. Come join us! To sign up or learn more, point your browser to https://americatalks.us.

The entire experience will take less than 90 minutes: after a 10-20 minute livestreamed introduction, you'll enter a breakout room with a written conversation guide and other tools intended to ensure a safe, productive, enjoyable conversation scheduled to last about an hour (you can interact for more or less time if you'd like; it's up to the participants.) The tools and guides will help you avoid the all-to-familiar "us versus them" mentality we all experience in favor of a much healthier "you and me" mindset. This isn't a debate. with two sides each trying to win an argument and change someone else's mind. It's not even an attempt to find common ground. Instead, it's about listening, seeing each other as neighbors, respecting differences, and seeking to understand and appreciate the experiences of others.

Several parishioners have already signed up for "America Talks". If there's interest, we may gather in May to reflect as a parish about our experience. If you'd like to receive occasional emails about this and other parish news and activities related to depolarization, consider joining the parish "Civil Discourse Allies" Realm group (login to Realm, then search for "civil"; or contact Trevor Thompson directly at Trevor.Thompson@ stfrancisraleigh.org.) You needn't worry about meetings or commitments; the allies group is nothing more than an email list that allows you to keep your finger on the pulse.


