As founders, we hold them in high regard for what they set into motion and for their labors of love and service that have helped us to become the faith community we are today.

As I read this history, I stand in amazement of what this community has stood for and still stands for as we mark our 40th birthday. Allow me to highlight just a few.

First would be the wholehearted embracement of the laity in exercising your baptismal offices of priest, prophet, and leader in all aspects of parish life and ministry and equipping you to take your rightful place in shepherding the community and serving, both within and beyond, our church and schools. When people ask me how we survive with just two full-time ministerial priests on the staff, I tell them that we actually have thousands of baptismal priests, all doing their part to promote the Reign of God.

Second would be your commitment to justice and peace issues. You are peerless among Catholic communities in the diocese and beyond in this commitment. It would be impossible to tally the amount

of financial, material, and human resources you have given to help those in need, a faithful response to Fr. David McBriar's challenge when he arrived in 1987 that continues to this day: "What does the city need and how can we help?" His prophetic words, which the community has embraced to this day, have borne good fruit for others and for us.

Third would be an openness to all people no matter their walk in life and faith. Inclusion is an appropriate descriptive of this parish and apropos of Hilaire Belloc's definition of "Catholic" which is: "Here comes everybody!"

I have said repeatedly to others that we are peerless on multiple levels in serving the Lord and the Gospel both within and beyond our community. No other parish has such a deep commitment to issues like these and to so many of them. We feed hungers and meet needs that other parishes do not.

Fourth would be our spirit of hospitality and welcome. Countless people have told me the reason they became a member of this community or have returned again and again is the spirit of hospitality and welcome they experience here.

Fifth, but not least, is the Franciscan spirit that pervades this place. I tell people that what others and I "feel" here is similar to what I have "felt" every time I have been to Assisi. There is a spirit of peace and spiritual presence that pervades this place. I sense St. Francis is blessing us with his presence. This is a source of great consolation and wisdom for me and I hope for you too.

As pastor, I am so proud of all we have accomplished in 40 years and pledge to do my best to keep this heritage intact as we move to our golden anniversary in 2032.







## **What Easter Means at TFS"**

"The joy of the resurrection renews the whole world! And every land, every people exults in praise of God!" So speaks the Preface to the Eucharistic Prayer all throughout the Easter Season! Fifty days to celebrate renewal brought to us once again by the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead.

Lofty words and filled with wonder and promise, but what might this mean for a Catholic and Franciscan elementary school? How do our students, faculty, and staff not only embrace the meaning of these words, but more importantly, how do they live them out?

It begins with JOY! If there is one constant comment and insight that visitors and touring families take away from their experience of The Franciscan School, it is always that our students radiate JOY – the joy of sharing each day together, the joy of learning, the joy of living out lives of faith, the joy of recognizing their gifts and potential and putting these into practice. It is the Resurrection already at work day by day, because Easter is not a day or a

season only, it is the reality and truth of what it means to live always as a believer in the world.

And this joy is united with a sense of renewal. For our students, renewal is taught not just as beginning again in the same place, but rather as beginning again in a new way. It is what makes it possible for us to learn from our mistakes and the times in which we fail. We at The Franciscan School teach our students that our mistakes and failures never define us, but surprisingly and remarkably allow and enable us to move to new and unexpected ways of understanding ourselves. This is the renewal the Resurrection brings forth – when all seemed a dismal and disheartening failure. God reverses human expectations, and brings forth new life and new beginnings in abundance. And God does this without recrimination, condemnation, or punishment for all the failures.

We help our students to remember this central and pivotal truth of our faith all year round and especially during the

Easter Season. We teach them to be courageous and fearless when faced with making choices and decisions in their lives. We teach our students that God does not want us to get everything right all the time, because that is impossible. What God desires, rather, is that we get life "less wrong." Through beginning again in a different place, having gotten something "less wrong," we appreciate that the constant renewal called forth by Christ's resurrection becomes a means for growth and transformation. It is the vehicle for discovery and wonder, it is the means for accomplishment and achievement, it is process of coming to know ourselves as created by God with unique purposes that God knows will work for good in our world.

Such is the joy of Resurrection that we, at <u>The Franciscan School</u>, live day after day. It is what inspired our patrons Saint Francis and Saint Clare to never give up when all seemed lost. This joy is born of trust in God's great promises; promises that we teach our students God will bring to fulfillment!

"And he said to them, "Go into all the world and proclaim the gospel to the whole creation." Mark 16:15

As you are aware, Pope Francis has called people from around the world to offer their voices, thoughts, and experience about our Catholic faith. He has invited everyone to participate in a global Synod. Our parish hosted various sessions over the last few months which allowed people to participate both online and in-person. Members of the Pastoral Council are currently working on creating a document to submit to the Diocese of Raleigh which will reflect the input that was gathered. This will then be part of a larger collection of responses which will eventually make its way to Rome to be shared at a gathering with Pope Francis next year.

Pope Francis encouraged participation from all, particularly those who might not always be easily heard. With this in mind, a plan was developed by members of the Preschool Advisory Council to find a way to include some of the littlest members of our parish community. Just before Easter, our preschool students were given the opportunity to share their responses, both through drawings and words. From the list of possible Synod questions,

two were adapted to be used with our preschoolers. One was presented to our 2 and 3-year olds while another was asked of our 4 and 5-year olds. The teachers recorded each child's answer on individual pieces of paper and the child was then able to illustrate their answer with their best artistic depictions. For each group, one of our parents beautifully crafted banners with the drawings.

The first banner depicts the children's answers to the question: "What would you like to thank God for?" The answers ranged from "my cars", "Cheezits", and "popcorn" to "my mommy", "my school", and "Jesus!" The second banner shared the responses to the guestion asked of our 4 and 5's: "What will God help you to do when you grow up?" I certainly smiled when I read answers which ran the gamut of everything from: "be a mermaid" and "help sick people" to "be strong" and "to learn a lot". Despite the wide array of answers, they all had a common thread of being truly genuine while expressing the belief that God would be with them

in the future to help them do many things, both big and small.

While I was admiring the banners, my heart was definitely made lighter as I pursued all of the students' responses. I daresay that my faith was also inspired in a very meaningful way. As I looked at each student's picture and words, I was humbled by their honesty, simplicity, and the reality of God through their eyes. Seeing how God was real for them offered me a way to see my own faith through a fresh perspective with a lens not tainted by any outside influence or clouded by misconceptions. I would encourage you to stop by the gathering area outside of Fellowship Hall and admire the ideas and work of our children. Perhaps it will also offer you a new way to imagine the presence of God in your own life; it might even enhance your personal journey of faith!

## A Greener Lent = A Greener Earth



For Lent this year, 60 St. Francis parishioners signed up to participate in Greener Lent. This was an invitation to align one's Lenten abstinence and fasting practices with a greater awareness of our impact on the environment. In total, through this commitment of our parish, we saved 9079 CO2e (carbon dioxide equivalent units) from entering our atmosphere. That's the same as not using 463 gallons of gasoline. As Christians, we are called to be caretakers of God's creation. This requires that we steward God's resources for the benefit of all and grow in our awareness of our lifestyle's impact on the most vulnerable. As we celebrate the 50 days of Easter and then head into ordinary time, consider setting aside a day or more in sacrifice and prayer each week to keep our hearts focused on our gratitude for our beautiful earth and the plight of the poor. Let's tell others about how they can positively impact the environment through simple lifestyle and diet changes, which over 40 days, or a lifetime, can have a real impact. #### **Society of St. Vincent de Paul**

Have you ever had to sell your car to pay for a lawyer because your husband was arrested during a traffic stop, and he is the only breadwinner for you, your six-year-old son and the baby on the way?

- Or have you been unable to pay for the utilities in your apartment because you aren't working because of a recent surgery?
- Or been a 65-year-old worker without work because the day care that employed you at closed permanently because of COVID and you need help with your electric bill?
- Or known that St. Vincent de Paul was unable to help you financially while you were living in an extended stay hotel but asked "If you could just call and say hello, I'd be so grateful." The reason you are living in the hotel is because you are a 55-year-old woman in an abusive situation and with serious health problems.
- Or wanted to move out of your neighborhood because one son was shot and killed there a year ago and your other children are in the same type of danger?

All of these, and many more, are cases that volunteers at the St. Vincent de Paul Society respond to with gentleness, compassion, and financial aid.

SVdP can assist those who are in need because of volunteers like the parishioners at St. Francis of Assisi. Besides providing money for rental and utility payment assistance, SVdP refers neighbors to agencies that can also help.

SVdP maintains an extensive referral library that volunteers use to help the neighbors with future needs.

SVdP needs a volunteer to help research. If you feel called to help the poor from the comfort of your own home, consider volunteering with St. Vincent de Paul. We need a second person to update our list of helping agencies.

We focus on providing short term help for families in the area. Most of our cases are the working poor, families who can pay their bills until they get an unexpected situation – a funeral out of town, a car needing service, a sickness. And then they need help making their rent that month.

We try to provide a bit of money in the situations above, but we also provide updated lists of resources – how to get in touch with Legal Aid, where to find other help with utilities, which food banks are in their area, etc.

We need someone willing to update these lists by checking websites and calling phone numbers. Familiarity with Google docs is helpful but not necessary. On-the-job training available!

## Join an Ecumenical Delegation to the US/Mexico Border



There is much in the news about refugees, migrants, and immigration laws, and our US Catholic Bishops have continued to speak out for the necessity of comprehensive immigration reform, pastoral and dignified care of migrants, and the enforcement of immigration laws in ways that are targeted, safe, orderly, proportional, and humane. Our southern border with Mexico draws a great deal of the attention. Given our distance from the border, it is often difficult to get a real sense of the dynamics at play. To address this, we are lifting up an opportunity to make a delegation to the US/Mexico border as part of an ecumenical effort in Raleigh.

Gail Phares, long-time St. Francis parishioner, community organizer, and co-founder of an organization dedicated to human rights in Latin America will lead a trip to the US-Mexico border August 14-24, 2022. This will be a wonderful immersive opportunity for participants to get to know the faces of migration and the dynamics of the border and stand in solidarity in prayer and ministry with immigrants.

On this trip, delegates will travel to sister cities on the US-Mexico Border, Agua Prieta, Sonora, Mexico, and Douglas, Arizona, USA, with organization Frontera de Cristo.

The delegation will...

- meet with immigrants to learn about migration from directly affected communities
- go into the desert to commemorate sites where migrants have died while crossing the desert
- participate in opportunities to advocate for immigration reform

The cost is \$1000 per person, plus airfare.


