





War and Peace, Foreign and Domestic: Jesus speaks of peace in today's Gospel and we could certainly use more of it in our world, in our country, in our Church, in our families, and with ourselves. In addition to Ukraine, people living in Ethiopia, South Sudan, Syria, and Yemen are in major conflict and experiencing sectarian violence that continue to destroy lives and hope.

I'm grateful for those who are lifting up our brothers and sisters in Ukraine in prayer, both privately and at St. Francis. It is our greatest resource and a way for us to remain in solidarity with them so they don't feel alone in their struggles. We gather each Sunday afternoon between 3-5pm in the church to pray before the Blessed Sacrament for an end to their war. We also gather each Sunday after the 9am Mass at the Peace Pole to pray for peace in our world, not only in Ukraine, but other places as well. Please join us in prayer. Consider a donation to Catholic Relief Services to assist the people of Ukraine. These things might seem insignificant in comparison to other things that are being provided to the Ukrainians to combat the evil they face, but don't underestimate the power of prayer and solidarity in bringing about peace.

We face a similar dilemma in our own country, particularly in the area of racial, ethnic, and religious hatred. Someone has described this hatred as "soul sickness." This seems an apt description of the darkness that surrounds the soul of someone who murders people because, among many reasons, they are threatened by their "otherness." Jesus' peace is the salve for those whose souls are in the throes of this sickness. We are called to pray for their healing and for the healing of our nation that still finds it difficult to see and treat everyone as a gift rather than as a threat.

A parishioner sent me a video link with a song composed by some of our most famous American balladeers called, I Am Ukrainian Now (https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=DSwxoJHJ4EI). It speaks of the importance of solidarity. I invite you to listen to it. In our own nation, our African-American, Asian, and Jewish sisters and brothers need our solidarity as well as they continue to face senseless slaughter because of who they are. I invite you to become knowledgeable about the roots of racial, ethnic, and religious hatred in our country and how we can take real steps in reducing it. Our parish Justice and Peace Office can provide you with resources to help you grow in this knowledge.


Mass Intentions




Looking for <u>Summer Opportunities</u>? St Francis of Assisi has many activities for all age groups this summer. Look for the opportunity that meets your needs.

Celebration of our Graduates

Each year on the week before Memorial Day weekend, we celebrate the graduating 8th graders at TFS. We put a lot of effort into recognizing and appreciating our graduates in their last few days here, and there are many reasons it is important we do. First, and obviously, to recognize their success as our graduates and the time they have spent achieving this milestone. Our students have spent, if they started in kindergarten, nine of their fourteen years at TFS. That is more time than most will spend in high school AND college combined! They will start in Kindergarten without knowing many letters or numbers, most not knowing how to read or spell, and not knowing addition or subtraction. At the end of their time, they have read Shakespeare or a variety of classic novels, are directing their own achievement in Academics, in collaboration with the dedicated faculty at TFS, and using complex mathematical formulas in algebra and geometry. They are academically successful and prepared.

However, their academic achievements and progress are only a partial achievement of their time here. They also have been deeply infused in their Faith; having made their First Communion, started preparing for their Confirmation, and learned so much about the beauty of their Catholic faith. They will have learned about and discussed the Catholic Social Teachings, and how to implement them in their lives. Learned the value of service and their Gospel call to action through a discussion of the Church's history, to include the foundations in the Old Testament and the mission described in the New Testament. Learning from the example of their families and teachers what it means to be a Catholic every day, and not just an "everyday Catholic", we send them out confident in their character.

Moreover, they have especially learned how to put their faith in action through that valuable Service mentioned above. They know they are called to service as faithful Catholics; their faith goes beyond attending Mass and focusing on their personal faith experience. Called to reach out and help their brothers and sisters in Christ, and represent the "hands and feet of God on Earth", they know the responsibility they have to better the lives of others. These three things they have learned here: Faith, Academics, and Service, and we look forward to seeing how they change the world for the better with the foundation their parents have provided them here. We honor and appreciate them for all these things!

But that's not all...we also appreciate them because of who they are as important people in our lives as faculty, administrators and staff. Many of them have been in our lives for those entire 9 years since kindergarten; we have seen them grow and change and mature. We love them like parents do; not as much as parents, nor in exactly the same way, but we love them despite their actions at times. We love them even though they frustrate us, love them when they make us laugh and shake our heads, and love them when they surprise us with their thoughtfulness and joy. We love them when they make us exasperated, or disappointed, or impressed. We love them no matter what because we know who they are and know they are good, and precious, and important. We love them because they make us proud in all they have accomplished, impressed with all we know they will achieve going forward, and justify for us in our hearts the reason we have these roles in their lives.




