

COLUMBARIUM CONSTRUCTION BEGINS:

We are fortunate to have a columbarium on our campus. I enjoy looking at the names and dates of your beloved families and friends whose mortal remains lie in repose there, some whom I've known for many years and some who have become known to me since my arrival in 2020. I sometimes visit with them and lift them up in prayer or ask them to intercede for a need someone in the parish has or for an issue I am dealing with as your pastor.

We have reached the point where our present columbarium has reached its capacity and an addition is now ready for construction. Through the purchases of niches by our parishioners over the years, the next phase is completely paid for.

Beginning Monday, July 11, both walkways to the church from the main church parking lot will be temporarily closed and sections of that parking lot will be cordoned off. We are asking everyone to come to the church beginning Monday, July 11, via the Clare Hall doors or by walking down the sidewalk between the Preschool playground and the Preschool and enter Clare Hall from that end. Those with mobility issues may be dropped off under the Clare Hall portico on the left (where the parish mailbox is located) as you proceed down the main campus driveway from Leesville Road. We ask you to park in the school parking lot, along the parking spaces against the tree line in the church parking lot, or in the lots near the back of the church and rectory as construction will make the parking spaces nearest the columbarium inaccessible. Additional handicap spaces will be available in front of Clare Hall.

The first phase of the construction will take up underground drainage issues for the new addition itself so water doesn't accumulate above ground when it rains. This work will eventually expand to include the area leading from the breezeway outside the main doors of the church toward Leesville Road, another place where water accumulates after it rains. This is being done to protect the integrity of our buildings so that excess water doesn't compromise them.

This will require patience on the part of all of us and I encourage you to give yourselves an extra 5 minutes when leaving your homes for Mass so you have time to maneuver through the temporary chaos on the campus and arrive for Mass on time.





Who is The New Principal?



For those that have been involved at TFS for the past two years I am a familiar face. You may have noticed me standing out at carpool with my green basket. Let me take a step back and share my journey of how I came to be where I am now. I just completed my thirtieth year in education where most of that time was spent at a local independent school. I learned and grew a lot as both an administrator and teacher during that time, but as the years passed I felt less a part of the overall community. Growing up with my Catholic faith is a large part of who I am. As the years passed I felt a strong need to integrate my faith with my professional life. You often hear people speak of a "calling." While I cannot say exactly when that may have occurred I can share that I truly feel called to the community of St. Francis of Assisi. Change is always hard, but it was a path that I felt that I needed explore and the timing seemed right.

I did not attend Catholic schools, which is very surprising coming from an Irish/Italian Catholic family. I grew up as the oldest of three children in Nesconset, New York. Although my academics were not centered around a Catholic education, a

lot of my youth was spent at St. Patrick's Roman Catholic Church in Smithtown. During the 1980s, the Youth Community experienced explosive growth under the direction of a passionate individual that made church and the church community a cool place to be for students in grades 6-12. Hundreds of young people participated in the Folk Group. We went on tour, did recordings, and performed on the radio and other churches on the east coast. Every Wednesday night you could find me spending time with this group and again on Sunday morning when we all sang at 9am together. I built many friendships, spent many years and have wonderful memories of my time as part

of the Folk Group. While we were far from the Radio City Christmas Spectacular, we spent months preparing for our Christmas Spectacular show and at Easter shared our version of the Passion. I learned more about my faith and who I was as a person. In addition to being a member of the Folk Group, I also participated in both Parish soccer and softball. It was a welcoming place to explore an interest in sports. It is my mission as the next Principal at TFS to continue to foster a love of learning and faith. It would be my greatest joy to know that our students are building lasting friendships and creating memories that will help mold them into faith filled community members.

“I prayed to the Lord, and he answered me. He freed me from all my fears.” – Psalm 34:4

“Faith Over Fear” – Recently, my mom told me that she saw this on someone’s t-shirt in passing. It’s indeed a powerful message! I suspect, however, that even the most faithful among us, have experienced times when it was difficult to fully embrace.

In our lives, I am sure that we’ve all experienced some challenging, life-changing events. Perhaps it seemed as though things were hopeless and despair overpowered us. Our lessons in faith would encourage us to lean on our Heavenly Father to help sustain us through the difficulty. They would also remind us to remember the example of Jesus as He suffered on the cross and put His spirit into God’s hands. It’s easy to know this in our minds, but not always as simple to follow, especially when we can’t see an immediate answer to our prayers.

Not too long ago, I watched someone close to me undergo a major health crisis

that resulted in many changes to this person’s daily living. While this person is a deeply faithful Catholic, there were days when anxiety and fear threatened to dominate. As often occurs, this person’s experience caused me to reflect on things related to my preschoolers. I actually happened to think about a time before school dismissed for the summer when I was outside on the playground with one of the two-year old classes. One of the boys in the class was climbing on the giant yellow/blue blocks, going up and down. Apparently, he was very excited to know that I was watching him and decided to try something new by jumping off of the blocks! Of course, the playground is built to age-appropriate safety specifications and this is not necessarily a dangerous feat. I think, however, I was a bit taken aback about how there was no hesitation on his part. He didn’t give a second thought to jumping; apparently, he had no doubt about his ability and

what he was going to do! He was all smiles and just glowing when he proudly made a perfect landing!

What I witnessed with this bold 2-year old, brought to mind about how much better off we’d be if we always would approach difficult times with such fearlessness. If we remained steadfastly rooted in the belief that, no matter what, God was with us and would see us through the challenge. If we had unwavering faith that God does not abandon, I’m sure we surely could encounter more joy. May the phrase above help remind us of the amazing love which God has for all of us, without exception. Through our prayer to the Lord, may we grow stronger in our belief of “Faith Over Fear”.

In today's Gospel, when Jesus asks "which of these three, in your opinion, was neighbor to the robbers' victim?" the scholar of the law answered, "the one who treated him with mercy." Jesus then said, "Go and do likewise."

SVdP works to "treat the poor with mercy" by providing hope, compassion, referrals and short-term financial help for families. Most of the cases are the working poor—families who can pay their bills until they get an unexpected situation—a funeral, a car needing service, a sickness. Any of those situations could make them need help with rent or utilities.

One example is a single mother of children who works full-time as a waitress who lost wages when she needed to take off three weeks to take care of her sick mother who lives in Texas. Another is a single mother of five children who has a good job but faces a steep increase in rent and needs some financial assistance while she seeks a part-time work to supplement her income.

The St Vincent de Paul Society is a lay Catholic organization that aspires to live the gospel message by serving Christ in the poor with love, respect, justice, hope and joy, and by working to shape a more just and compassionate society.


