

How Do Catholics Understand the Word "Ministry?"

I have been asked by several parishioners about the academic paper I presented in June at the first session of a five-year series of ecumenical meetings between the Catholic Church and the Disciples of Christ Church. As you may remember, I was appointed by the Vatican's Dicastery for Promoting Christian Unity

as one of seven Catholics in the world to serve on a team to dialogue with the Disciples of Christ Church for the sixth phase of ecumenical dialogue between our two Churches. Our topic focuses on the role of the Holy Spirit in ministry. My task was to lay out the parameters of a Catholic understanding of the word "ministry" as well as a Catholic understanding of the ways the Holy Spirit is involved in ministry and those who serve as ministers in the Church. Over the next few weeks, I will use this space to lay out some of the basic understandings of the word "ministry" as we understand it. We will start with a Theology 101 snapshot of the word "ministry."

There are five essential components to this word that are in play when Catholics use the word "ministry." All five are important. First, all ministries are rooted in the life of a faith community. This is because ministry, for us, is meant primarily to serve the needs of a faith community so it may be sent forth in mission. A second feature impacting an understanding of ministry is this: the Holy Spirit equips a wide variety of people for ministry so the Body of Christ can be built up into one body out of its diversity to meet the wide-ranging needs of the Body of Christ. No one receives all the gifts of the Holy Spirit. They are spread around for the health of the minister and the health of the community.

Third, ministry is the presence of God's grace, bestowed by the Holy Spirit, to the Church and ultimately to the world. It is never our possession. Rather, it is something given to us by the Holy Spirit to be given away and our ministry is always a manifestation of the presence of the Holy Spirit who uses us as its instrument of grace. Fourth, qualities of the Church such as being missionary, living in communion, receiving graces through the sacraments, serving others as a way of life, sharing our charisms in a diversity of ways, and pursuing the life of holiness determine and shape any Catholic understanding of ministry. Fifth, while baptism is the essential opening to all ministry, ministry in the Catholic tradition will also include a precise and special charism, service, commission, vocation, or ordination as a way of living out and embodying a baptismal call in service to the Church. Hence, the public nature of ministry (to, for, and from the Church) will often be signified by a special naming of the ministry and the designation of ministers will normatively, but not exclusively, occur publicly by installation, ordination, commission, or blessing. When all five components are present, we have the makings of "ministry" in the Catholic tradition.

Next week I will describe the various kinds of ministry we recognize in the Catholic Church.






Interested in sharing your faith with young children in a fun-filled and loving environment?





Adult Bible Study Opportunities Letters From Prison, Parts One And Two

by Little Rock Scripture Study (2 books = 9 lessons)

Register Monday, July 25th through Wednesday, September 14th. Space is limited to 20 registrants per session. Two sessions are offered for this 10 session VIRTUAL Bible study. First session is a "get to know you," and orientation to the study.

Incarcerated numerous times "for the defense of the gospel" (Phil 1:16), Paul wrote several letters from the confines of prison. Letters from Prison, Part One explores the letters of Philippians and Philemon in four sessions, explaining the reason each letter was written and addressing various themes such as joy, unity in Christ, reconciliation, and the close relationship between Paul and his communities. Commentary, study and reflection questions, prayers, and access to online lectures are included.

Letters from Prison, Part Two provides an in-depth investigation of Paul's letters to the Colossians and Ephesians, two letters with a great deal in common. Besides being written from prison, both letters address Gentile communities learning to live faithful Christian lives. Exploring themes such as God's eternal plan, the unity of the church, and the fullness of life in Christ, these letters offer a sweeping and still relevant vision of faith in Christ and the church as his body. Commentary, study and reflection questions, prayers, and access to online lectures are included.





It was not only an opportunity for them to experiment with new activities and lessons, but some also worked with a different age group than they normally do during the year. This staff person shared with me that the mother gave her a 'thank you' card which expressed her gratitude for taking extra care of her son. The mom wrote that even though it was hard for her son to come at first, he would always come home and say how kind and loving this person had been to him. The mother further wrote that her son was soon back to his happy self because of how caring this person was to her son. This was a wonderful example of how much all of our staff care for and nurture those in their care. The staff person went on to eloquently sum up one of the many reasons why we do what we do. She said, "I saved this card because it lifts me up when I need it..."

Each and every day, I give thanks to our Lord for blessing our preschool with such incredible staff who love our students as if they were their own- who are vested so much in the children that they serve- who look at their position as more than a job- who understand the precious value of those entrusted to them!



Society of St. Vincent de Paul

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells the parable about the rich man who selfishly stored all his grain and goods only to die and not enjoy his abundance anyway. What we struggle all our lives to learn is that life does not consist of possessions nor our perceived security, but of being possessed by God. Our ability to share our gifts reflects our faith.

The St. Vincent de Paul Society uses your generous donations to help those in need in the community.

For example, this week a neighbor and her partner who are in their early 50s and both disabled faced disconnection of their electricity. Both work from home while caring for a 14-year-old daughter and four-year-old grandson. High medical bills and the cost of caring for the grandson with no financial assistance from his parents stretch their budget. A recent unexpected brake repair to their car caused them to get behind with bills. SVdP partnered with Our Lady of Lourdes SVdP to pay their electric bill and provide resources to stretch their monthly income.

SVdP at St. Francis of Assisi provides hope, compassion, referrals, and short-term financial help for families. Most of the cases are the working poor—families who can pay their bills until they get

an unexpected situation—a funeral, a car needing service, a sickness, or an unexpected increase in living expenses. Any of those situations could make them need help with rent or utilities.

SVdP could use more volunteers. If our mission speaks to you but dealing directly with the people in need seems too intense, consider helping to keep our resource sheets updated. These updates are crucial to SVdP doing its job and can be done from your own computer.


