

Easter greetings to all as we continue in these strangely unfolding times. We continue to adapt to our new virtual presence. Holy Week was unlike any other we've had; the church was set up for it, the friars were ready for it, we had staff helping out with the technical parts of streaming, and yet no one was quite prepared for all of that in a mostly empty church. My mother and father, watching from home, were happy to have a shout-out from their son, and as they said to me, as they watched, all they could think of was their little Stevie as a six-year-old riding his Big Wheel around the driveway. Oh how we change....

We have now been in this new way of being for more than a month. Our doors are closed, but our parish is still running in a new virtual mode. Our staff meets regularly via Zoom calls. Pastoral care is now being done mainly by telephone. Outreach is still happening under distancing guidelines. Liturgy and prayer and reflections happen on the front page of our website.

Thank you to everyone who has continued to support us financially. About half of our offertory comes through Faith Direct – a form of automatic giving - and that has been a huge help for us. If you would like to sign up for Faith Direct, please contact them directly at 866-507-8757. Our parish code # is NC674. The other half of our offertory comes through envelopes and any cash or checks we receive. Every day in the mail we receive envelopes with donations, and we are grateful for all who continue to support us in that way. Our offertory, as you can imagine, has been affected by this pandemic, and we are grateful for any financial support we receive in this time.

We are not sure – no one is sure – when our doors will be open again. We will continue to look for guidance from civil and diocesan authorities as to when we might open up again. Events that typically happen in April and May have either already been called off, or are being evaluated as we go forward. The same is true for events in June and after. At this point, so much remains unknown. For now, our website is our front door and

entryway into a new and adapted life of our parish. And again, thank you to all for your ongoing kindness and support.

To review also, for the friars, our provincial chapter has been postponed until August at the earliest, and changes typically happen after a chapter, and so as far as we know, we will be here sometime into August, but that could change also. The decision by our province to withdraw from St. Francis still stands, we just don't know the timing of the departure.

The gospel reading for this past Monday describes Mary Magdalene's arrival at the tomb, and she is "fearful yet overjoyed." (Matthew 28:8). A reflection on that passage, written by Michael Jordan Laskey from "Give Us This Day" reads: "This passage has the seeds of a good Easter prayer: Lord, when I'm afraid or confused, help me lean into your love and joy." "Give Us This Day" by the way, is a very good source for daily scripture readings and reflections, and you can find them at www.gutd.net. Blessings on your week!

Prayerfully discerning celebrating Confirmation? Thinking about completing your Christian Initiation?

Interested youth who are currently in 7th grade through high school (including TFS students) and at least one parent MUST attend a NOW ONLINE information/registration meeting. Confirmation preparation is a two year long journey, can start as early as 8th grade and will culminate with the celebration of Confirmation in the fall of 2022.

During the online meeting, information on the sacramental preparation and the registration process will be provided. If your family is planning on participating in the 2020-22 Confirmation preparation process, you MUST register with the online registration! Please understand that due to the program starting in October, we will not be able to facilitate registrations in the fall.

If you had previously registered to attend one of the in-person April meetings, you do not need to register again to attend the online meeting.

Faith Formation Ministries

First Communion and Confirmation Preparation Information/Registration Meetings are now ONLINE! Based on the Governor's order banning large gatherings, we're bringing our Sacramental Preparation meetings to you ONLINE this year.

Would you consider becoming a Formation Volunteer for 2020-2021?

We have a large K-12 Formation program at St. Francis of Assisi and serve more than 600 children/youth in our Cross Walk, Cross Train, and Cross Road Sunday programs. Because Mass is the source and summit of our faith, our programs are scheduled following the 9:30am Mass (K-5 children) and following the 5:30pm Sunday Mass (6-12 youth) to break open treasures of the faith that have just been proclaimed. We offer a small group-based faith formation program for K-12, and Small Group Leaders are always needed! Our Sunday programs meet twice a month, September through May, during the traditional academic year. The time commitment for Small Group Leaders over the course of the year is 18 sessions, or approximately 22 hours.

Small Group Leaders:

- Lead sessions during the time that their children/youth attend the programs
- Love God and want to show our children and youth how to walk with Jesus
- Are paired up with at least one other adult volunteer
- Receive lesson plans via email the Wednesday prior to each session and all materials are provided
- Guide conversations, facilitate discussions, and invest in the lives of children/youth
- Build trusting relationships through prayer, games, hands-on activities, discussion on Catholic teachings, and service projects.
- Lead their small group in an activity with the objective of connecting the Gospel/Catholic Teaching to their life
- Help keep the children/youth focused and engaged
- Supervise safe transition to parents

How's COVID-19 Affecting our Brothers and Sisters in Guatemala?

One of the things I have been doing over this last month is checking in on my family members, colleagues, and friends more than usual. Life seems so disorienting, unpredictable, and fragile right now, and so somehow these conversations feel grounding. They also express well the sense of solidarity that we are all feeling right now, how small the world is, how interdependent we all are, how universal are our fears, anxieties, questions, hopes, and dreams.

In this spirit, one of the relationships I have been checking in on over the last month is with our Sister Parish, the village of Los Margaritas II (LM2) in Guatemala. We watch the news to get a sense of what is happening in our cities, states, and in our nation, but we likely get only a vague and piecemeal vision of how our brothers and sisters in other places are experiencing COVID-19. As many of you know, we have had a dear relationship with LM2 for over 25 years now. LM2 is a rural village of about 100 indigenous Mayan families located about a 10-hour drive northwest of Guatemala City. It might be fairly easy for us to imagine how our brothers and sisters in New York or Ohio or

even Italy are faring, but can what about our friends in Los Margaritas II, Guatemala?

Through a series of emails with Brian Tyler, the Sister Parish staff person who lives in Guatemala and is our liaison with LM2, I have been able to get a bit of a picture of what things look in Guatemala and in the village in particular. I wanted to share this with you to enrich your sense of solidarity and prayer during this time.

In response to COVID-19, Guatemala has enacted a nationwide curfew 4pm to 4am, suspended all public transport, closed borders, limited transportation in private vehicles to 3 persons, limited the amount of people that are allowed in open air markets, restricted travel within country, and made it an obligatory law to wear face masks in public. Even before COVID-19, most people in LM2 struggle economically, with farming as the main profession, which rolls on with the seasonality of life and the vagaries of weather and markets.

At this point, the national restrictions have not prevented the village from continuing their planting, harvesting, and selling of their crops, but much depends on the future renormalizing in how things will affect them long-term. In order to supplement family income, many LM2 family members travel to and even live in neighboring urban areas, other farms, or in even in Guatemala City. With restricted travel and the economy halted, there is a great economic strain put on those who remain in the village and puts more pressure on farming to sustain their

already tenuous existence. At this point, most basic necessities are able to be secured in a town about 30 minutes away from LM2. The Guatemala government has made a decision to provide stimulus aid of 1,000 Quetzales (about \$130) and some food aid to individuals, but LM2 community members are still in the dark as to whether this support will reach them. Many doubt that it will.

At this point, there are only 200 confirmed cases of COVID-19 and 5 deaths in all of Guatemala (0 cases in LM2). At least half of these cases are a result of COVID-19 positive migrants who have been deported from the US over this past month. There is very little access to COVID-19 testing in the country, and in areas like LM2, there is very poor health care and hospital infrastructure to support anyone who would be in need of extraordinary care. It is also the case that Guatemala's economy relies heavily on agricultural exports and tourism, as well as the large amount of remittances sent by Guatemalans living in the United States to relatives in Guatemala. All of this is being affected in negative ways and will undoubtedly affect the most vulnerable most severely. Although many of the Holy Week services and festivities were curtailed in Guatemala, LM2 continues to find solace in their new church they have been building over the last five years. They send us their prayers.

I invite you to please keep our brothers and sisters in LM2 in your prayers during this time when we are all feeling so distant and yet so connected.

Two Seconds

Have you got two seconds? Great! That's how often someone in America needs blood. That's right. Two seconds. And in the time it took you to read those lines, 3 more people needed blood. And you know how much that is nationwide? It's 36,000 units of blood, according to the American Red Cross. Each day. Every day. In America.

So what kind of people need blood? People who have accidents or major surgery need blood. Have you read about the severe weather that has hurt so many people across the South? And even with social distancing, people are still having car accidents and getting burned and all the other regular, every day accidents that can create a need for blood.

People who have cancer need blood. Sometimes it's the cancer that creates the need for blood. It can stop the person's body from being able to keep up with the demand for new red blood cells. Sometimes it's the treatment to kill the cancer that creates the need for blood. Sometimes the cancer causes a need for surgery and that creates the need for blood.

People with chronic illnesses need blood. People with Sickle Cell disease need blood. Sometimes an infection can become so bad that a person needs blood to help tip the scales back towards health. Some people with kidney disease need blood. And people with hemophilia need blood.

So it's safe to say, people need blood. And you know what else? The only place they can get blood is from other people. Blood can't be artificially made or manufactured. It has to be donated. And, less than 38% of all people can donate blood, based on things like age, blood pressure and exposure to certain risk factors. And of that 38%, less than 10% actually donate blood.

You may have noticed that we've had several blood drives lately. We usually only have the Spring and Fall Blood drives hosted by our Knights of Columbus. But this year is different. This year, we need blood more than ever before. So we have invited the American Red Cross back to our campus for the fourth time in a month. Thursday, April 30, from 9-3, Clare Fellowship Hall will be a donation site. Every donation slot was filled for the previous three drives. Can we do it again? Second Sunday of Easter (Sunday of Divine Mercy) (A)
April 19, 2020

Touching Jesus' Mercy

The memory of the marks of our sufferings can lead us to lose our peace. For Christ, this is not so. He shows the disciples his wounds and says, "Peace be with you." It may seem contradictory, but it isn't. To touch Christ's wounded side is to touch his mercy, to touch a love that overcomes everything. In spite of my sins wounding him, he comes to me in loving mercy. Jesus' wounds bring peace.

When the apostles see his hands and side, they rejoice. His wounds are a sign

that it is really him. No one else has those marks. His wounds are his identification! His wounds bring joy.

Thomas misses Jesus' first apparition, returning and demanding proof before he will believe. Rather than becoming angry, Jesus shows him his wounds. He invites Thomas to touch the signs of his suffering, and Thomas believes. Jesus' wounds bring faith.

We also need to insert our hands and hearts into Christ's side, to come into contact with his love and mercy. Only then can we be healed. Only then can we experience real peace, joy, and faith.

That's why Jesus breathes on his disciples and says, "Receive the holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them" (John 20:22-23). He wants to heal their wounds and see them produce joy and peace in others. God's grace is to reach all generations through the power of forgiveness he entrusts to his Church. The sacrament of penance is exactly that. We acknowledge our sins, and Jesus responds with understanding, forgiveness, and counsel. +

Why Community? Why Church? Why Catholic?

People have many reasons for being Catholic. Most are good, yet some seem weak: "Sunday morning without Mass would seem empty." "I was raised Catholic. It's all I know." "I'm not sure there's a God, but I'd rather err by believing than be surprised when I die."

These aren't *bad* reasons, but they may not stand up to the challenges of modern life. They're like the house built on sand. When the storm came, it collapsed (see Matthew 7:24-27).

The storms are many: anger at the clergy sex-abuse scandals; dissatisfaction with the limited role of women; judging the Church as too wishy-washy, politically involved, rich, or concerned about rules; and hurt from negative personal experiences (for example, "The Church wouldn't bury my father").

Once a young adult leaves home, the practice of the faith may be seen as only a cultural commitment with no roots. Sometimes people aren't welcomed when they approach the Church for marriage or other sacraments. Our Church must walk a delicate balance between staking out an identity that sometimes upholds unpopular values while welcoming all with unconditional love as Jesus did.

Lately we've been listening to folks who have left the Church and to others who have remained or returned to active

Catholicism. These are some of the more significant reasons we've heard about why people stay:

- **The communion of saints:** Many in the Church have been inspired by Catholics, some deceased but others still alive, who've been powerful witnesses of lives lived for others—true followers of Jesus.
- **Crisis:** Sometimes a life crisis drives us to ask the ultimate questions about life's meaning. God often touches us during difficult times, and we come to understand that life is about more than collecting stuff or even surrounding ourselves with loving people.
- **The sacraments:** The Catholic Church has a rich tradition of combining the Word with actions and symbols in its seven sacraments. This reflects an understanding of how ordinary things—water, bread, oil, rings, words of forgiveness or commitment, and human touch—help us experience God's love.
- **Universality:** People have told us that they were attracted to the Catholic Church because its heritage goes back to Jesus and there's a unity of belief around the world.
- **Service and social justice:** The Catholic Church has perhaps the most extensive social service network

in the world—tending to the poor, coordinating aid during crises, and challenging everyone to live simply and help their neighbors because that is what Jesus taught.

- **Community:** Living a Christian life isn't about being a "lone ranger." Being in community with other believers, we can pool our resources and support each other.

In the end, the reason that we—Jim and Susan—are Catholic is that it's where God has called us and spoken to us. There are many routes to God, but Catholicism is where we have experienced God's touch. There may be Church policies with which we disagree, but we would find human foibles and failings no matter what religion we followed.

Some of the best and worst things in human history were done in the name of church, God, and religion. We must align ourselves with the best and repudiate the worst. The challenge is to be humble enough to remember that we're not in charge and that we're all imperfect sinners, still loved by God. As a community inspired by the life of Jesus, faith calls us to devote ourselves to the good of others.

Bottom line? Love. +
