

# **■ Daily Mass 10am**

No Daily Mass week of Sept. 14 due to our priests being on retreat. Daily Mass resumes on Monday 9/21.

Daily Mass will be held for up to 150 people on Mon, Tues, Thur, and Fri.

(Wednesdays are reserved for TFS and Preschool Mass)

Daily Mass is held in the main church. All pandemic protocols are followed. No signups are required.





We started public daily Masses last Thursday and approximately 60 people came to worship. Public weekday Masses will be celebrated each Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday at 10:00am in the church beginning Monday, September 21. Normal

protocols for Masses at St. Francis will be followed, namely, all must wear a face mask, provide information for contact tracing before entering the church, and be seated with appropriate social distancing. No sign-ups in advance are necessary. You may arrive anytime beginning 9:30am to maintain separation from the pre-schoolers who arrive up to 9:15am each morning and use the same entrance as those coming to Mass. Wednesday morning Mass/Liturgy will be reserved for the school communities but will not be open to the public. School liturgies will be livestreamed for those who would like to view the Mass. These will begin in a few weeks, once we have things organized. We will notify you when they will begin.

There is a wonderful article about Fr. Jairo Maldonado, our new parochial vicar, in this month's NC Catholics magazine. There is one particular story that stands out in the article. As part of our parish's Franciscan identity, the Season of Creation inaugurated by Pope Francis (September 1-October 4) provides us with opportunities to increase our awareness of our care for creation, particular in view of its implications for our future generations. One of our parish's efforts is the installation of solar panels on our property and an opportunity to learn how solar energy is ecologically and financially sound, both for the parish and the community-at-large. There will be a virtual meeting on Tuesday, September 15, to learn about the SFA project, how the technology works, and how you may install solar panels at your home or business. Please see the parish website for further information on accessing this meeting.

Each September, all priests serving within the diocese join for an annual five-day retreat. Normally, we gather in one location under the direction of a retreat master. This year's retreat is September 14-18. Due to COVID-19, Bishop Zarama has cancelled the large-group retreat and has asked us to make a private retreat. Fr. Jairo and I will leave the parish on Monday to make our private retreat and will return on Friday afternoon. Because we will be away, all daily Masses this week are cancelled. If you have a critical medical crisis that requires a priest, please call the parish and follow the prompts to leave a voicemail. Someone will follow up with you as soon as possible. For other types of assistance, please contact the parish office during regular business hours. Please keep us in your prayers this week and know that we will be keeping you in ours each day.



Out of concern for the health and well-being of the people in our diocese, the 2020 Wedding Anniversary Mass will not take place.



# **Word Problems**

When I was a kid, there were subjects I enjoyed – spelling, vocabulary, writing, history. Math terrified me. Word problems were just torture! What if the train really wasn't headed to Chicago? What if Susie really didn't start out with 10 pieces of cake – what if she ate one or two before the word problem started? I could never trust a word problem.

Recently my husband and I were puzzling over how to approach a project. As I heard myself talking, I realized I sounded just like a word problem. So if we start with X number of days to prepare for, and we need Y for each day, then we need Z for a month. Who knew life was a word problem? Did you? It got me thinking.

Lots of times, life just happens. You're minding your business, you're prepared for adversities and WHAM! Something totally unanticipated happens. You're left trying to figure out why it happened, what you could have done to prevent it, figuring out how you're going to move for-

ward, and how can you protect yourself and your family in the future. You're putting together a word problem to explain the experiences you've had.

But sometimes the situation you're in seems to defy any rational explanation. Sometimes you're so blindsided it takes some time before you can begin to make sense of the situation. And sometimes the effects are so devastating, it's easier to try to ignore the whole situation and effects and focus on other aspects of life. But that's usually only a short term solution.

What if there was a safe place to unburden yourself? What if there was a place where you could get the time to tell your whole story – to describe all the ins and outs, the ups and downs, without interruption, without judgement? And what if you got understanding, not judgement; encouragement, not critique; care, not correction. Would that help you come to terms with your situation?

Could you start thinking about how to move forward instead of looking back? Would you be able to start planning for what's ahead instead of replaying all the events of the past?

Stephen Ministry is that safe place – to explore how you got to where you are, to consider where you want to be, and to determine what you want to do to move past your circumstances. The active listening, gentle questions and consistent encouragement and presence will help you unburden, get your footing, and plan a new path forward.

This is an amazing opportunity to move forward in making a difference in our impact on our environment and getting any of our questions answered. All are welcome, no matter what congregation or faith tradition you belong to.

This summer the Parish installed a Solar Panel Array on the roof of Clare Fellowship Hall. You will be happy to know this project did not require any "out of pocket" funding from the Parish. The installation has been performed by Eagle Solar and Light who offered a lease option. All the upfront costs will be covered by the rebate we receive from the State and Duke Power. The monthly lease cost will be covered by the savings we expect to receive from our Clare Hall utility bills. The lease covers 15 years during which Eagle Solar and Light will be responsible for maintaining the system.

# **Happy Grandparent's Day!**





"Children's children are a crown to the aged, and parents are the pride of their children." Proverbs 17:6

To all of those in our community who are grandparents or like-grandparents: Happy Grandparent's Day! Did you know that this holiday actually is attributed to a mother, Marian McQuade, from WV who was planning a community event in 1956 for elderly neighbors? She became aware that some residents in a local nursing home seemed to have been forgotten by their families and neighbors. She wanted to bring national attention to these older people and to all grandparents. In 1973, West Virginia became the first state to have an official day of recognition for grandparents. In 1978, Grandparents Day was given national status by Jimmy Carter. It is reported that Ms. McQuade worked tirelessly to not only have a special day of recognition for grandparents, but also to encourage youth to continually form meaningful connections with the elderly.

I can't help but wonder what a young Jesus might have done for His grandparents, St. Anne and St. Joachim. I like to think that He, like most children, had a special relationship with them. I am sure they helped shaped Jesus' childhood as many senior adults do today with children whom they hold close, even if they are not necessarily biologically related. I also am sure that Jesus' grandparents showered Him with love by telling Him stories, sharing their advice, and going for walks together. Maybe St. Anne even taught Jesus family recipes and told stories of when Mary, His mother, was a child. Perhaps St. Joachim went fishing with Jesus or cheered Him on when He was learning to do something like climb a tree.

I believe that God has given our children grandparents for a reason. I think that He, in His infinite wisdom, means for them to be examples of faith, love, and kindness for young children. He knows that they have much to pass on to our young, both in little and big ways. He also knows that children, of course, need their parents, but also blossom under the gentle care and abundant support of others, particularly those who have a lifetime of experience behind them as most grandparents do.

Let us pray today for all of those who are grandparents or act as grandparents in our lives. May God continue to bless them with health and the love of those around them. May they always know God's light in their lives, especially as seen through their grandchildren!


# Feed the Need and Caring Casseroles have moved to the Community Center Bring all meals to the center door 9am-4pm, Monday-Friday

# Right Judgment

of then when we think of a judge, we think of severity or cold justice. Courtroom and criminal-justice dramas—even some news coverage of major crimes and scandals—love depicting the offender as receiving his or her just rewards, with the judge or prosecutor smugly reflecting or sighing in relief.

But in the scriptural sense, a judge is much more. A good judge is an educator, teacher, and parent. Good judges promote wise living and respect for authority and the law. Their tools are sometimes mercy, sometimes penance, but always prompted by love.

Whether we live or die, we are the Lord's.

Jesus answered, "I say to you, not seven times but seventy-seven times." A better image to understand the judge's role is a parent educating his or her child. Sometimes education means letting something slide; sometimes it means holding the child accountable. Both can be expressions of love.

Today's readings caution us against selfish passions that prompt us to judge. One who has been forgiven much but is then harsh with others will be severely punished—or as Sirach puts it, God "remembers their sins in detail."

Mercy toward others is key to the Gospel message. Some think they are good Christians because they don't steal and haven't killed anyone. They may even be active in their parish but are highly critical of others.

Remember, as Jesus said: "The measure with which you measure will be measured out to you" (Matthew 7:2). And, "So will my heavenly Father do to you, unless each of you forgives his brother from his heart" (Matthew 18:35). +

# Meaningless Ritual? Never!

My liturgy professor once shocked me out of my post-lunch comatose state one afternoon by saying, "If the Eucharist does not cause you to want to make a difference in the world, then you are doing nothing more than making meaningless, ritual turns around an altar." What could he possibly mean? Surely the Eucharist is more than just ritual turns, even if it doesn't cause me to want to change the world.

Since that day, I have been affirmed in my thinking that the celebration of the Eucharist is never a meaningless ritual. The liturgy is always transformative, regardless of anyone's state of mind or ensuing actions. Although we may not notice this in the short term, we can be assured of the efficacy of the liturgy in the long term. Just as water carves out even the hardest rock, liturgy molds us all into the image of Christ—even those with the hardest of hearts.

Though the connection between celebrating the Eucharist and working for the betterment of the world is apparent each time we celebrate the Eucharist, it's made especially clear during the Mass of our Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday. On that day, we celebrate the Eucharist (Luke 22:15–20) and we wash feet (John 13:4–17) just as Jesus asked of us during the Last Supper. It's important to remember to embody these acts we perform so solemnly on Holy Thursday during every day of our life. Christ



mandates us to pray for the needs of the world and, at the same time, work toward a better world. These two Christian characteristics of prayer and action are not mutually exclusive—prayer without action is hollow, while action without prayer is arrogance.

This all became clear to me one particular Holy Thursday many years ago. As our priest finished the washing of feet, I noticed a man entering the building and walking briskly toward the front of the church. He walked right into the sanctuary and sat down. Without hesitation, our priest walked over to the man and the two engaged in a brief conversation. He then motioned to the

servers, who brought a pitcher and bowl. The man took off his shoes, revealing his unwashed feet. Our priest knelt down and slowly washed the man's feet. When finished, they both got up and hugged. The man walked out, never to be seen again. As we processed the Blessed Sacrament to the altar of repose later that evening, I couldn't help but think that it was Jesus who walked in and sat down to have his feet washed right in our midst.

By the way, my former professor denies making the statement at the top of this column. He agrees that the celebration of the Eucharist is never a series of empty turns around an altar but always efficacious and constantly invites us to be Christ to the world. While some people know that and act upon it rather easily, others need a professor's shocking wake-up call and the extraordinary opportunity to see Jesus' feet being washed. +
